# School Operations During the Covid-19 Pandemic January 4, 2022

Executive Order 21-24, currently in effect through September 30, 2021, provides local school boards are responsible for implementing local measures and restrictions to address the impact and spread of Covid-19. The Executive Order also, states that these restrictions and measures may not be less restrictive than directives of the Indiana Department of Health.

The IDOH, has issued control measures for K-12 schools with regard to quarantine and isolation:

- Everyone masked in a classroom setting close contacts are not required to quarantine and may continue to attend school as long as they are asymptomatic
- Some masked in a classroom setting close contacts within 6 feet of the positive case must quarantine

Our schools continue to work collaboratively to implement data-based measures that will afford a safe learning environment. School-based data regarding the spread of Covid-19, while recognizing the level of community spread can provide meaningful information that can aid in decisions regarding school operations.

All Dubois County Schools will utilize the matrix below to determine operations protocols:

Exposures in *outdoor settings* during the day do not require contact tracing; i.e. recess, physical education, outdoor learning labs, etc.

Exposures during *indoor activities where masks cannot be worn,* such as lunch, choir and band will require contact tracing within 6 feet for 15 minutes and quarantine.

Situational decisions due to Covid-19 may be made based upon classroom and extra-curricular activities.

## Example 1

A positive Covid outbreak occurs in a self-contained elementary classroom. That classroom could potentially go virtual or be required to wear masks for the next two weeks instead of masking the entire building.

## Example 2

A positive Covid outbreak occurs on a sports team. The entire team could be quarantined for 5 days instead of masking the entire building.

Isolation/Quarantine Guidance

COVID-19 in Past 90 Days	test.
Unvaccinated Individual	Quarantine for 5 days
	<ul> <li>Return on day 6 if asymptomatic</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>If develop symptoms, stay home and</li> </ul>
	test.

Students may continue to learn virtually during this time.
