Survey Questions and Results

The budget process began by soliciting ideas from staff and students about their experiences in Albemarle County Public Schools. Those ideas were grouped based on the strategic plan objectives they most closely aligned to and were presented to the community for their input.

Each question on the survey was related to one of the strategic objectives, with examples of budget ideas in support of the objective. Respondents were asked to rate how well the budget ideas support the objective and help realize the strategic plan, Learning for All.

To interpret the ratings, a weighted score is provided. Lower weighted scores are areas with less community support and higher weighted scores have more community support. A weighted score of 3.5 is the average and show neither positive or negative community support. Respondents were also asked to submit qualitative feedback including additional ideas. Those comments have been summarized with each question.

Goal 1, Objective 1

Proposed recommendations to support this objective:

- Investigate a math program that can be used across the Division for extra help with math.
- Expand access to materials to support all students, both those who excel and those who struggle.

• Continue to fund access to virtual learning.

- More equity, between schools, in elective offerings
- In-person math intervention, virtual intervention is not as effective; math specialists
- Continue/Expand ACPS@Home
- Smaller class sizes, or more staff to facilitate opportunities for small group instruction
- Training for secondary teachers on remediation materials/strategies
- Expanded mental health support
- Support for students who are taking advanced coursework (AP/DE) for the first time
- More course options based on student interest

Goal 1, Objective 2

Proposed recommendations to support this objective:

- Continue to monitor the homework and grading policies to make sure they allow students time outside of school for their personal interests.
- Investigate the possibility of shifting the student schedule to include more time for independent and collaborative work, as well as teacher-led intervention.

- Consider an "Away for the Day" policy for all secondary schools
- Expand family support/social workers to be available to more families and continue their work within the school setting
- More frequent opportunities for students to connect with teachers, counselors, advisors, mentors about their current state and future goals
- Expand access to Pre-Kindergarten
- Partner with community groups/organizations to provide afterschool opportunities
- Create more low-commitment opportunities for students to participate in electives, sports, and pursue personal interest

Goal 1, Objective 3

Proposed recommendations to support this objective:

- Make sure students have more relevant learning experiences that focus on student choice, hands-on learning, and variety in learning strategies.
- Look into ways to expand and support extracurricular activities to make them accessible to all students.

- Implement restorative justice in the schools
- Make Culturally Responsive Teaching training available for parents/community members so they can raise their own cultural awareness
- Recommit to anti-bullying training
- Provide funding to build out culturally representative classroom libraries
- Open schools, some evenings, as "community hubs" to foster more community interaction
- An equal focus on staff mental health
- Include all kinds of diversity in the curriculum so all students feel represented

Proposed recommendations to support this objective:

- Develop and implement staff wellness and recognition programs.
- Investigate ways to better connect ACPS students with community-based resources.
- Increase dedicated time for teachers to plan for student learning.

Goal 2, Objective 2

- Provide regular protected planning time for teachers
- Create a support structure for intervention positions (i.e. Tas)
- Recess for middle school, and more breaks for students when needed
- Recognition for all types of staff
- Student wellness and recognition programs
- Redistribute responsibilities currently held by teachers and administrators (i.e. dropoff/pick-up, hallway monitoring, lunch duty, parking lots)

While there are no specific initiatives aligned to **Goal 2**, **Objective 3**, we received a few comments with recommendations.

- More in-person outreach to inform difficult to reach communities about opportunities in schools and the school division
- Make all division materials available in more languages

Goal 3, Objective 1

Proposed recommendations to support this objective:

- Hire more substitute teachers, including permanent substitutes for each school.
- Hire more teaching assistants to decrease the student-to-adult ratios in elementary schools.
- Provide additional, in-person support to new teachers

Goal 3, Objective 1

- Increase staff compensation, for all positions

- More mentorship for new staff
- Restructure positions to make more full-time positions (eliminating part-time, fractional and split positions)

Goal 3, Objective 2

Proposed recommendations to support this objective:

- Audit school facilities to evaluate where inequities in resources (i.e. playgrounds, field quality, parking) are and how to bring facilities to greater consistency.
- Create more outdoor learning spaces, including outdoor classrooms.
- Look into ways to update classrooms to create more opportunities for small group or independent learning, including more space with charging capabilities.

Goal 3, Objective 2

- Electric school buses, and charging on school buses
- More charging stations that are accessible and leave devices usable while charging
- Intentional outdoor spaces, not just tents
- Constructing a fourth high school
- Start environmentally friendly programs at schools: gardens, solar panels, recycling, composting, etc.
- Conduct traffic studies and encourage new trails/pathways be established to minimize issues associated with drop-off/pick-up
- Evaluate opportunities for environmentally friendly landscaping and design of schools: pollinator gardens, grey water landscaping, windows for ventilation
- Ensure outdoor spaces are age-appropriate, have wi-fi and are accessible to all students

Goal 3, Objective 3

Proposed recommendations to support this objective:

- Consider job responsibilities to inform staffing standards across schools (i.e. School Testing Coordinators, intervention and prevention services).
- Implement additional extra- and co-curricular activities for students, at no cost to student or family, and with transportation provided.
- Audit shared school materials and create a replacement cycle to keep all materials upto-date.
