Mrs. Wiley administered the Oath of Office (14 Del. Code, §1053) to Mrs. Judith Purcell and Mr. Ronald Evans.

President Wiley appointed Dr. Dickerson as Chairperson of the board.

Adjournment of 2016-2017 Board

Dr. Kevin Dickerson, Temporary Chairperson, called the 2017-2018 Milford Board of Education to Order.

Election of President

Mr. Emory nominated Mrs. Wiley for the Office of President.

MOTION MADE BY MR. EMORY/SECONDED BY MRS. DENNEHY that nominations for the office of President be closed.

Mrs. Wiley was declared President of the Milford Board of Education for the 2017-2018 year by unanimous vote.

Mrs. Wiley assumed the Office of President.

Election of Vice President

Mr. Emory nominated Mrs. Dennehy for the office of Vice President.

MOTION MADE BY MR. EMORY/SECONDED BY MRS. PURCELL that nominations for the office of Vice President be closed.

Mrs. Dennehy was declared Vice President for the Milford Board of Education for the 2017-2018 year by unanimous vote.

President Wiley, on Behalf of the Board, Designates Dr. Kevin Dickerson, Superintendent, as Executive Secretary of the Milford Board of Education for 2017-2018 School Year.

REGULAR BOARD WORKSHOP

President Wiley called the Board Workshop to order at 8:25 AM. All members were present. Mrs. Dennehy had to leave at 8:47 AM.

Mrs. Sara Croce and Dr. Kevin Dickerson presented the State Budget Impact Summary. The final state budget reflected a 2% reduction to the Division II Energy unit, a value of \$13,149.90 to Milford School District. There was also an operating fund reduction of \$26 million to the state allocation for school districts which resulted in an approximate loss of \$758,640.97 for the Milford School District. The total reduction for Milford School District is approximately \$771,790.87. The final reductions in the state budget did not include a match tax capability to recoup any loss of state funds. The proposal for a transportation cost shift was not approved. This was good news relative to tuition related costs. The transportation funding split will remain 90% state funded and 10% local funded for the upcoming year. The state allocations for professional development and education sustainment remain unchanged. Mrs. Croce also explained that there was a reduction to the Senior Property Tax Credit from 50% or \$500 down to 50% or \$400 included in the state budget bill. There is additional legislation proposing changes to the Senior Property Tax Credit pending. The district expressed concern about the impact of state budget cuts on tuition funded programs and the potential for an increase to expenditure projections. There was discussion with the board regarding potential changes to the previously projected revenue needed from tuition tax.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS – Dr. Kevin Dickerson State Budget Summary

Dr. Dickerson and Mrs. Croce presented the State Budget Summary with the impacts to Milford School District. The final impact changed slightly from the amount reported at the July 6, 2017 meeting. The total loss of state funds for Milford School District is \$740,848.15.

School Budget Impacts

Mrs. Croce explained the state budget impacts on the district budget and tax rate components.

BUSINESS - Mrs. Sara Croce

Sussex and Kent County Tax Rate Proposal

Mrs. Croce explained the school tax components and proposed rates for Fiscal Year 2018. The presentation can be found on the district's website. The proposed Sussex County tax rate for Fiscal Year 2018 is \$4.9841 per every \$100 of assessed value. The proposed Kent County tax rate for Fiscal Year 2018 is \$1.7636 per every \$100 of assessed value. These rates represent a 7.6% decrease in the total school tax rate from Fiscal Year 2017.

Milford School District website has links to each county's website for homeowners to look up their individual assessed value and calculate their Fiscal Year 2018 school tax amount.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Peter Carpenter commented his property taxes increased 50% last year and was concerned about an increase this year. He did not understand the difference in the rates charged for Kent and Sussex County.

Mr. David Markowitz asked how many staff, teachers and administrators were cut from the district to help balance the budget.

Mrs. Jennifer Cinelli-Miller thanked the Board of Education for their efforts and noted she did not see many people at Legislative Hall on June 30th on behalf of the school district when the budget cuts were being discussed.

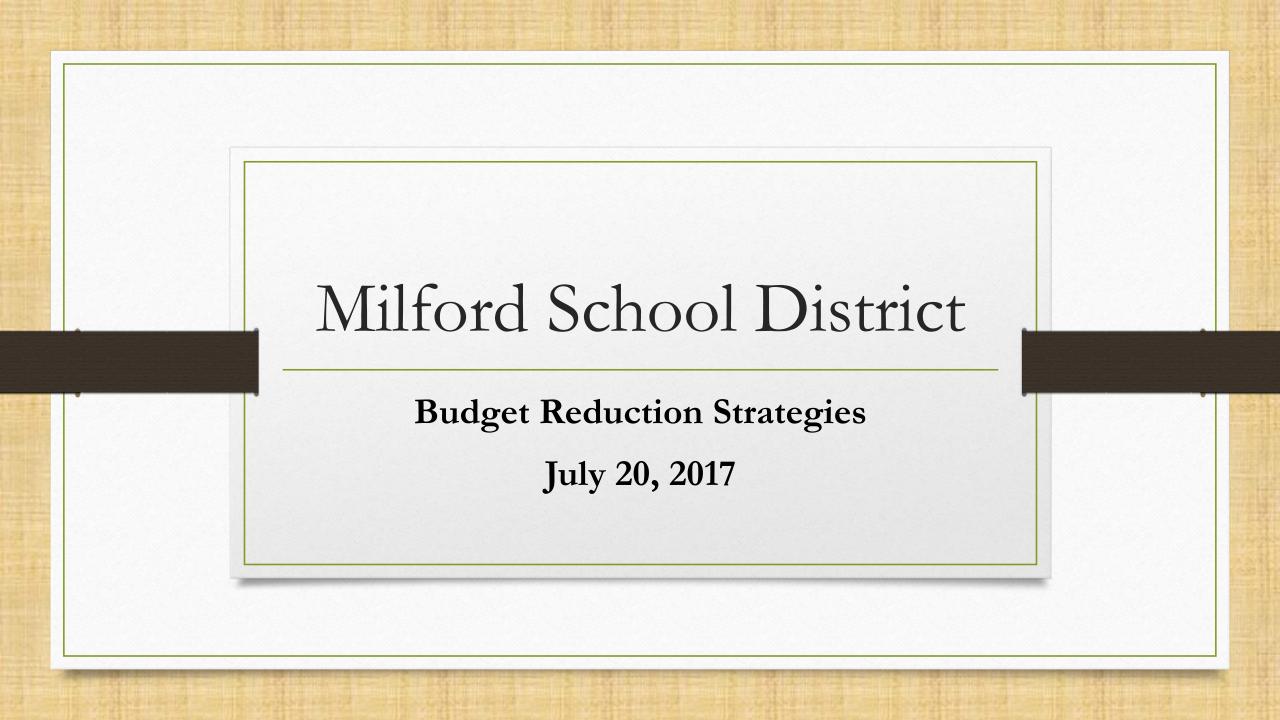

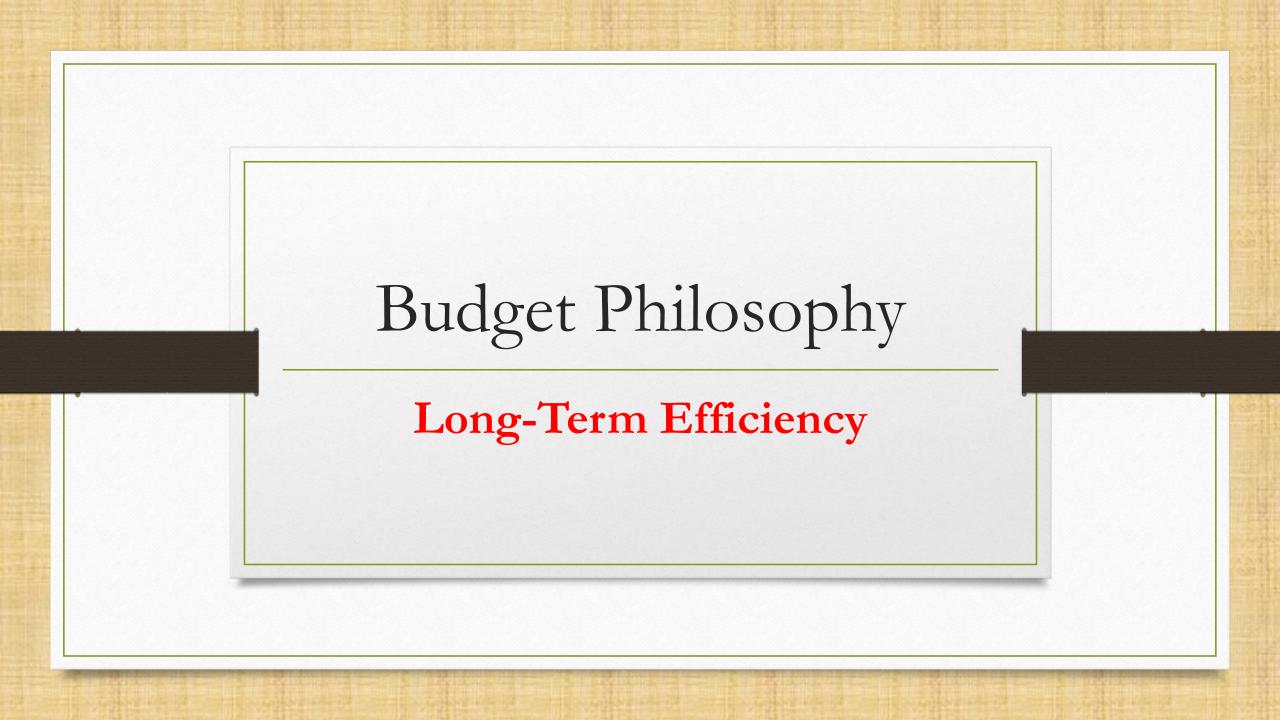
