



Graduation Requirements from the Program of Studies.

Subject	Required Credits	Required Courses
English	4	English 9, English 10, English11 or AP Language and Composition, English 12 or AP Literature and Composition
Social Studies	3	-Government or AP United States Government and Politics -United States History or AP United States History -World History or AP World History
Science	3	*Conceptual Physics and Chemistry I are Prerequisites
	3	-Two credits of Algebra -One credit of Geometry
Mathematics	All students shall enroll in a mathematics course each year of high school.	The fourth course must be 1 credit in duration and may be selected from the Program of Studies Mathematics course offerings.

Credits to advance to the next grade:

- 6 Credits Sophomore

- 18 Credits Senior + 55 hours of Service Learning

Eligibility for extracurricular activities

- NO "F's" for quarter grades
- Need a 2.0 weighted GPA for that quarter




