Independence and Health Skills to Develop Before Starting School

- ✓ Uses the toilet, washes hands, and blows nose independently.
- ✓ Packs backpack and puts on coat and shoes independently
- ✓ Opens snack and food containers and eats independently
- ✓ Start a consistent bedtime and morning routine before school starts



All children grow at their own pace. They all have unique strengths and skills to work on!

Use this as a guide to identify opportunities to learn and grow. Students will continue to work on these skills in kindergarten!

How can I help my child prepare for kindergarten?

Get to Know Your School

- Check your school website and sign up for e-news! Take your child to welcome events or to play on the playground.
- Walk to the bus stop before the first day so your child gets familiar with the routine. Attend the Bus Ride-along event in August!
- In August, attend **Meet the Teacher** and **Family Connection Meeting**. We can't wait to meet everyone!

Be Ready for the School Day

- Help your child build independence and master these skills before school.
 - Using the bathroom independently
 - Washing hands —make sure to scrub for about 20 seconds!
 - Opening food containers and eating lunch within 20 minutes, without prompting
 - Putting on footwear if they are unable to tie laces, slip-ons or Velcro are great!
 - Putting on a coat practice buttoning or zippering up
- Kids need energy to learn, play, and manage emotions. Ensure they are getting enough sleep (9-12 hours) and start their day with a nutritious breakfast.
- Consistent bedtime and morning routine get this started before school starts

Set Expectations

- Be a role model by showing your child a positive attitude about school and learning.
- Talk with your child about going to kindergarten and answer any questions they might have.
- Talk about how you expect them to behave at school and the importance of respecting teachers, students, and other staff.

Practice Skills at Home

- ullet Read to your child and tell stories daily in English and/or your home language!
- Find the math in daily experiences (count, sort, name shapes, compare object, etc.)! Count or sort toys, laundry, food items...anything and everywhere!
- Teach your child their full name and practice writing their first name.
- Use everyday situations to practice taking turns, sharing, and following routines.
- Get plenty of exercise and spend time outdoors every day!
- Talk about feelings and help with calm-down strategies (such as taking deep breaths or counting).
 Help them use words to name feelings and solve problems.
- Encourage them to solve problems independently (try different ways). If needed, help them come up with solutions. Celebrate their efforts when they keep trying when things feel hard!

September

Family Connection Meeting (Required) August 30 – First Day of School for grades 1-12 September 2 – First Day of School for Kindergarteners*

*August 30, 31 and Sept 1 – Kindergarten families are invited to a family connection meeting with your child's Kindergarten teacher during the first three school calendar days. This meeting is required.

Issaquah School District Kindergarten FAQ's 2022-2023 School Year

Q: Which schools will offer free Full Day Kindergarten?

A: All schools offer free full day kindergarten to all eligible incoming students.

Q: Where do I register?

A: Registration is online. Once you have filled out the online portion, you will be required to complete the registration process at your neighborhood school. The kindergarten registration window begins in early February and concludes March 4th. Each neighborhood school has designated specific dates as to when kindergarten registration activities take place.

Q: May I register my child after March 4th?

A: Yes, however, we set the registration window in order to get an enrollment count to help the Issaquah School District (ISD) determine staffing and classroom needs for the next year. Again, registration occurs at your neighborhood school.

Q: How old does my child need to be to register?

A: Incoming kindergarten students must be at least 5 years old by August 31 in order to register for kindergarten.

Q: Can I register him/her if they do not turn 5 by August 31?

A: No. However, students who will turn 5 by November 30, are eligible to apply for Early Entrance. The students must complete independent testing by a qualified outside assessor, meet district Early Entrance requirements by July 15, 2022 and eligibility be confirmed by the Office of the Executive Directors of Elementary Education.

Q: What do I need to register?

A: Immunization records, proof of birth date such as a copy of the birth certificate or passport, and proof of home address such as a purchase or lease agreement and an energy utility bill and photo I.D. of the parent/guardian are necessary for registration.

Q: What are the bell times for Full Day Kindergarten?

A: Students in full day kindergarten follow the same schedule as grades 1 through 5 in their neighborhood school (or school of attendance).

Q: Do Full-Day Kindergarteners ride the bus?

A: Yes, full day kindergarten students will ride the same bus as the other students attending their neighborhood school (or school of attendance).

Q: Is Half-Day Kindergarten (morning only) an option for my child?

A: Yes, half-day kindergarten students would attend for three hours in the morning.

Q: What are the bell times for the Half Day Kindergarten (morning only) option?

A: Half-day (morning only) kindergarten students will begin the day on the same bell schedule as all students attending their neighborhood school (or school of attendance). Students in the half day session will attend for three hours in the morning.

Q: Do half day kindergarteners ride the bus?

A: Yes, half day kindergarten students will ride the same bus in the morning as the other students in their neighborhood (or school of attendance). **Mid-day transportation will not be provided by the district**. Parents/guardians will be responsible for picking their child up at the end of the three hour half day morning session.

Welcome to the Issaguah School District

Washington State law requires all students to be fully immunized **before** attending school. Recent changes to WA State law are:

- 1. A personal, medical or religious exemption to immunizing your child requires the signature of a parent/guardian **and** a licensed health care provider.
- 2. Personal/philosophical exemptions are **not** allowed for the measles, mumps & rubella (MMR) vaccine.
- 3. Immunization records for school and childcare entry must be medically verified. Medically verified record includes one or more of the following:
 - A Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) printed from the Immunization Information System (IIS)
 - A physical copy of the CIS form with a healthcare provider signature
 - A physical copy of the CIS with accompanying medical immunization records from a healthcare provider verified and signed by school staff

If your child has received immunizations in Washington State, please access their Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) electronically through the Washington State Immunization Information System at: https://wa.myir.net/

If you have not accessed this site before, you will need to register on the site to print the CIS.

If you cannot access a CIS form, you may fill out one manually and then show it with provider proof of immunizations to the school nurse.

If you cannot locate your child's immunization records, please contact your licensed healthcare provider, or your student's previous school. Once the completed Certificate of Immunization form has been received at the school and verified by the school nurse, your student may attend school.

Immunizations can be provided by your healthcare provider or local pharmacy. If you do not have a healthcare provider or medical insurance, contact the resources listed below.

Schedule a meeting with your school nurse if you are requesting an exemption form. Your student MAY register for class but MAY NOT attend school until all immunization requirements are met, or, there is a Certificate of Exemption on file signed by the parent and the licensed healthcare provider.

To: Parents of Children with Special Health Care Needs

Re: Requirements for a medication or treatment order and a health care plan to be in place prior to attending school.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of WA State Law RCW 28A.210.320 titled, "Children with life-threatening health conditions – Medication or treatment orders –Rules."

The law defines a life-threatening condition as, "A health condition that will put the child in danger of death during the school day if a medication or treatment order and a nursing plan are not in place." Some common life-threatening conditions are:

- Severe allergies that have an Epipen[™] prescribed
- Severe asthma
- Diabetes
- Epilepsy (a seizure disorder)
- Cardiac conditions
- Adrenal insufficiency

Students with these conditions must have a medication or treatment order and nursing care plan in place before they start school. The medication or treatment order must be from the child's licensed health care provider.

If a current medication or treatment order is not provided, the chief administrator of the school is required to exclude the child until such order has been provided. This requirement applies to students with a life-threatening condition who are new to the district, and to students who are already enrolled in the district. Our exclusion procedures are in accordance with the rules (WAC's) of the State Board of Education.

RCW 28A.210.330 requires that all children with diabetes have an individualized health care plan and supplies in place before entering school.

It is vital to your child's safety during the school day that if your child has one of the life-threatening health conditions listed above, immediately notify your School Nurse.

If your child has any health condition that could be considered life-threatening such as asthma, food allergies with an Epipen™ prescription, seizures, diabetes, etc. please fill out the following form. According to the law, your child must have an emergency health plan, which includes medication orders from your child's health care provider in place before he/she can attend school. The emergency health plan with necessary orders and medications must be to your child's school on **August 16**, **2022**, for this important information to be processed. Please return this form to your school nurse as soon as possible.

You may also fill out this form if your child has any health condition that you would like the school to be aware of, even if it isn't life-threatening.
