Getting Your NYS Driving Permit:

The HHS Library no longer administers the permit test in school because it is available online to all and **may be taken at home**. [The Library Website gives all the information you need and provides links to the correct area of the DMV website](#) to register for the test. We have found that giving the test at school conflicts with DMV's new online approach and causes problems for students when they go to the DMV with their test results. Students may take the test anytime after their 15th birthday but they cannot get their permit until their 16th birthday.

- Applications are now being accepted from high school seniors from the class of 2022 to represent New York State at the 2022 National Youth Science Camp (NYSCamp).
- Two students from each state, Washington, D.C, and 8 countries will attend the VIRTUAL camp which will be held June 27th through July 20, 2022.
- The [National Youth Science Camp](#) is a science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) opportunity.
