Please take some time this morning to review all the information in this week's newsletter.

We distributed the state-provided Antigen tests to over 1,000 students this past week. This week, we will be completing our distribution. Please read the email carefully from yesterday if you are still interested in obtaining a test kit.

This week is our Winter Formal, "There's No Place Like Trabuco." We are excited to host this all-outdoor event at Knott's Berry Farm on Thursday, January 27th. Ticket sales will conclude that day at 1 pm, there are no sales at the door. The event is from 8 pm - midnight. An additional email was sent prior with other details and is included in this newsletter. As a reminder, we will not be allowing students to leave the event prior to 10 pm unless a parent is picking them up. It is also a spirit week this week, and the pep rally originally scheduled for last week will now be held on Wednesday, 1/26. It will be entirely outdoors, and we will be utilizing the entire stadium to allow students to space out.

Pacific Coast Corvettes Scholarship

Deadline to Apply March 31, 2022



Pacific Coast Corvettes

Scholarship – 2021-2022

The Pacific Coast Corvettes (PCC) club scholarship in the amount of \$3000 will be offered to an eligible candidate who is a graduating senior at a high school within either the Saddleback Valley Unified School District or the Capistrano Unified School District. Because PCC wishes to encourage automobile enthusiast activities and the continued advanced development of automotive technology, this scholarship is supportive of, but not necessarily limited to, that end. Applications forms are available on PCC's website at www.pccvettes.org, or by email request to Scholarship@pcc.org. Completed applications may be mailed USPS to Pacific Coast Corvettes, 23785 El Toro Road, #251, Lake Forest, CA 96230-4762, or emailed to Scholarship@pccvettes.org.

To be eligible to receive this scholarship grant, applicants must have been accepted by an accredited college or university, post-secondary school, or technical trade school and planning to enroll or be enrolled in at least 12 class hours per semester. Preference will be given to applicants pursuing a S.T.E.A.M. major or be enrolled in an accredited technical trade school. Other qualifications being equal, preference may be given to those applicants who are able to demonstrate a genuine interest in automobiles and automotive related activities.

While academic performance and extracurricular activities will be considered, apparent financial need and work and/or volunteer experience will also be considered in the application review process. To be considered for the scholarship award, the applicant must meet the requirements described on this page and submit a completed application package (i.e., [1] the completed Scholarship Application form, [2] Application Questionnaire, and [3] an essay as described below.)

PCC will consider only those applications received or postmarked by March 31, 2022. Selection of the intended scholarship recipient will be made by April 30th provided the applicant is able to provide a letter of acceptance from the college or university or post-secondary school. Scholarship recipients who fail to provide proof of enrollment in an approved college, university, or trade school program, by May 15th may have their scholarship award selection rescinded and the scholarship award may be given to another qualified applicant. The scholarship disbursement will be made in September subject to verification of enrolment. Scholarship funds may, at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee, be remitted to the selected applicant or directly to the school.

The PCC Scholarship Committee will consider all information provided by each of the scholarship applicants and determine, in its sole discretion, that applicant who best suited to meet the intent and purpose of PCC in offering this scholarship. The PCC Scholarship Committee may, at its discretion, interview potential scholarship awardees prior to making its decision. The decision of the PCC Scholarship Committee is final.

The chosen scholarship recipient will be notified via email by **April 22, 2022**. Scholarship funds will be made available once the Foundation receives proof of your college registration.

Students may leave the dance starting at 10pm. The whole event is outside and we have access to Fiesta Land and The Boardwalk. We have numerous staff chaperones and Knott's has its own security guards on site. There will be a dessert bar included in the ticket and a DJ set up outside. There will be additional paid options for some food items open at the park.

Please note: THHS administration reserves the right to turn anyone away due to inappropriate dress. i.e. shorts, midriffs, too revealing, etc.

TICKETS:

- Tickets for all major dances are sold in the Student Store as well as on the Trabuco High School Web Store online.
- Ticket prices vary depending on whether or not a student has purchased an ASB card and when the ticket is purchased.
- Students must have a valid student ID card when they purchase their tickets and at the dance.
- If students are bringing a guest from outside of Trabuco Hills High School, they will need to submit a separate behavioral contract/permission slip when the tickets are being purchased. This permission slip will be made available for dances that allow guests, and must be completed by their high school with an official signature and business card.
- THHS Students who have been placed on the Loss of Privileges list cannot purchase a ticket to the dance until they have been removed from the list by the discipline office. List will be posted in the student store and the discipline office.
- Any non-THHS student attending the dance must attach a copy of their ID, either a driver's license or school picture ID to the permission slip. Please note: Age limit 20 years or younger, (No middle school students). NO EXCEPTIONS! Non-THHS students must have a photo ID at the dance to be admitted.
- NO refunds after purchase of a ticket.
- Trading or selling tickets is not allowed.

ADMITTANCE:

- Admittance/attendance is subject to Trabuco Hills High School Administration approval.
- Attendance at Trabuco Hills dances is a privilege, and not a right, which may be revoked for lack of responsibility at school including, but not limited to: unpaid fines, students with current suspended/expulsion contracts and/or any behavioral contracts, or have lost privileges due to 6 or more demerits and/or attendance.
- Guests will only be admitted if they are with the THHS student who sponsored them.
- Students or guests who leave during the dance will not be readmitted.
- **ALL ATTENDEES MUST PRESENT A VALID PICTURE ID AT THE REGISTRATION TABLE TO BE ADMITTED. NO STUDENT ID CARD OR VALID ID FOR GUESTS MEANS NO ENTRANCE!!!**

DANCE RULES:

- All school rules and regulations are enforced during any school event including dances.
- All THHS students must show ID card at time of purchase and must show ID at the dance. THHS Student ID replacements cards \$10.00 available in the student store during snack or lunch only (M-F)
- All attendees may be subject to random alcohol/drug screening test given by the Trabuco Hills High School Administration. In addition, any student or guest showing observable signs of using alcohol or any controlled or illegal substance will be subject to an alcohol/drug screening test and removed from the dance by the Administration. The OC Sheriff's Dept., or local police agency, as well as the parents will be notified. (*Education Code 48900(c) & 48900(s) prohibits the use/possession of alcohol, intoxicants and controlled substances at school, on the way to/from school or at any school related activity*)
- All students and their guests may be checked by security for weapons, illegal or controlled substances prior to entry of the dance area. Any student or guest who refuses to be checked will be denied entry. Vehicles are subject to be searched.
- Students who purchase tickets are required to inform their guests of all contract rules. Guests are required to abide by all school rules and the terms of this contract. Any student or guest exhibiting disruptive behavior will be removed from the dance and the student/guest will be released to the Trabuco students' parent or police if parent(s) cannot be reached. The Trabuco Hills High School student will be held accountable for the behavior of their guest. **STUDENTS AND GUESTS REMOVED/DENIED ENTRY WILL NOT BE GIVEN ANY REFUNDS.**
- No student or guest will be allowed to leave the dance until an hour before the dance ends, unless prior arrangements have been approved by administration.

- **DO NOT BRING ANY OF THE FOLLOWING TO A DANCE:** Gels, liquids, aerosols, lanyards, perfume, gum, food, mints, lipstick and chapstick. Leave these items in the car or limo (these items will be confiscated at the dance).
- **STUDENTS AND GUESTS MUST BE PICKED UP WITHIN 30 MINUTES AFTER THE DANCE CONCLUDES.**

CONDUCT:

- No dancing such as freaking, moshing, or slamming will be permitted.
- No back to front dancing, bending over, no leg or hip riding, both feet must be on the floor, no crowd surfing, no carrying students on shoulders, and any other inappropriate dancing deemed by the Administration.
- **NOTE:** Violation of the dancing policy will consist of immediate removal from the dance and students who violate any school rule or the terms of this contract will be disciplined according to the district and school policy.
- No reimbursement or refund will be given when asked to leave the dance for not following this agreement.

All school rules and regulations are enforced during all school events. Smoking/vaping at school events is prohibited. The policy of Saddleback Valley Unified School District about alcohol, drugs, and narcotics is:

Any student of the Saddleback Valley Unified School District for whom there is reasonable cause to suspect the possession or use of, or being under the influence of, alcohol, drugs, or narcotics on school premises, or during school-related activities, or any student for whom there is reasonable cause to suspect the selling or furnishing of alcohol, drugs, or narcotics or substances represented to be alcohol, drugs, or narcotics to other students on school premises, or during school-related activities, or at any time or place to students which eventually relates to school or its activities, shall be immediately suspended from school and all school activities pending the outcome of the subsequent investigation and shall be mandatorily recommended to the Board of Education for expulsion from the Saddleback Valley USD" (Board Policy 5131.6)

DRESS CODE:

- Semi-formal attire is required for the Homecoming and Winter Formal Dances. Suggested attire includes semi-formal dresses and collared shirts and slacks. Students must wear shoes at all times.
- Masks may be required depending on CDC guidelines
- Violations may result in non-admittance. If dress code violations occur after admittance, student/attendee may be removed from the dance. If any attendee has a question about the appropriateness of their dress, please consult with an Administrator prior to the event.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- Tickets are non-transferable. Only the student and/or guest on this permission slip will be allowed entry into the dance.
- Doors will be closed promptly 1 ½ hours after dance start time. No late admissions after doors have been closed unless prior arrangements have been made with the Activities Director.
- Students will not be allowed to leave the dance until 1 hour prior to end time without parent permission.
- Administration has the right to cancel or shorten dance at any time for the safety of our students.



Mission Viejo Community of Character Unity

Unity is a quality which includes many positive features, such as teamwork, agreement, harmony, support, sharing, selflessness, oneness, collaboration, brotherhood, and friendship. Families, sports teams, bands, choirs, orchestras, businesses, service organizations, schools, churches, and neighborhoods are all areas where **unity** is imperative.

Unity is the mainstay of many organizations and professions. This is evident by uniforms worn by members, common goals, and teamwork required in order to achieve a mission. Some examples include the Armed Services, police and fire departments, sports teams, surgical teams, music groups, and service organizations. Experts in the business world have listed **unity** among the most important traits a leader must provide in order to be successful. One executive stated, "Success can only be achieved when there is a **unity** of effort to obtain it."

The human body provides a good example of **unity**. There are many diverse parts, each with a different purpose, but all work together for the common good of the entire body.

Stephen Covey states in *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*, that **unity** is not uniformity or sameness. Rather, it is "oneness" or "complementariness." Webster defines "complement" as that which completes or brings to perfection. Achieving **unity** with others creates the synergy which makes the whole greater than the sum of its parts. **Unity**, or complementing each other in a group or project, provides the advantage of synergy.

Sean Covey also describes great teamwork as a piece of music. All of the voices and instruments may be singing and playing at once, but they are not competing. Individually, the instruments and voices make different sounds, play different notes, pause at

different times; yet they blend together to create a whole new sound! He states that synergy is achieved when two or more people work together to create a better solution than either could alone.

America is a diverse country, made up of individuals of different ethnicities and cultures. We are 50 individual States, yet we are the **United States of America**. The inscription on our money, "E Pluribus Unum" (from the many come one), our flag, and the Pledge of Allegiance are great reminders of the **unity** of our Nation: **I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands: one Nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.**

Through **unity** we can recognize our limitations and appreciate the resources available through others. We are all stronger when we work together!

The Father and His Sons *An Aesop's Fable on Unity*

A father had a family of sons who were perpetually quarreling among themselves. When he failed to heal their disputes by his exhortations, he determined to give them a practical illustration of the evils of disunion; and for this purpose he one day told them to bring him a bundle of sticks. When they had done so, he placed the bundle into the hands of each of them in succession, and ordered them to break it in pieces. They tried with all their strength, and were not able to do it. He then opened the bundle, took the sticks separately, one by one, and again put them into his sons' hands, upon which they broke them easily. He then addressed them in these words: **"My sons, if you are of one mind, and unite to assist each other, you will be as this bundle, uninjured by all the attempts of your enemies; but if you are divided among yourselves, you will be broken as easily as these individual sticks."**

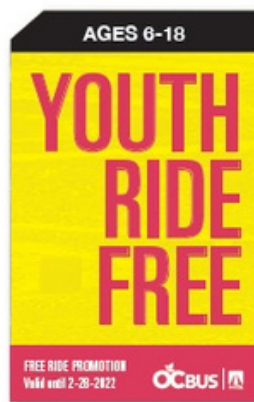
YOUTH RIDE FREE PROMOTIONAL PASS
