The Davie County Board of Education Will Deliver Thanksgiving Meals to Local Families

Members of the Davie County Board of Education will meet at the Central Office on Tuesday, November 23 to deliver Thanksgiving dinner to local families. In partnership with Davie High Hunger Fighters, an on-campus ministry that supports students and their families, there will be a total of 114 Thanksgiving boxes delivered to homes identified through the organization. Families include students at all grade levels in the district. The Board of Education will deliver 20 of those on Tuesday evening. The additional boxes will be delivered by local volunteers, including many Davie County Schools' employees.

The Thanksgiving boxes will include a \$20 Food Lion gift card (to purchase a turkey, if desired), as well as side dishes, snacks, paper products and other supplies. Planning for the contents of the Thanksgiving boxes began months ago, and include more than just items for Thanksgiving Day. The hope is to support students and their families while out of school on Thanksgiving break.

Each year, the Board of Education and Superintendent Jeff Wallace personally deliver boxes to homes around the county, in an effort to spread some cheer for the start of the holiday season. "It is an honor to be able to serve families in this capacity," said Superintendent Jeff Wallace. "We must do our part to help our neighbors all year long, but during this time of year it is especially important for families to feel the love of their community."
