
Proposition

Texas Statistics:

- 1 50% of teens have misused a drug at least once.
- In the 21st century, opioid-relateddeaths among this age group increased by as much as 30.7% annually.
- 3 177,000 of 12-17-year-olds in Texas report using drugs in the last month.

Why do young adults resort to illicit substances?

- Environmental factors
- Peer pressure
- Self medication
- Experimentation
- Accidental addiction



Opiod Antagonist Medication FFAC (LOCAL)

- Allows unassigned opiod antagonist medication to be stored and administered at school and school events to people who may be experiencing an opiod-related drug overdose
- Requires a standing order or procedures approved by a licensed physician
- Medication may be administered by a registered nurse or other person trained & authorized
- Requires development of administrative procedures to address:
 - acquisition, maintenance, expiration & disposal of medication
 - employee training
 - emergency notification requirements

BUSINESS & SUPPORT SERVICES



Student Activity Funds, Cybersecurity CFD, CQB

CFD: Student Activity Funds

- Clarifies that student activity funds are raised by student clubs & organizations, to align with the Financial Accountability Resource Guide
- Approval to use those funds rests solely with the organization, as approved by the principal
- CQB: Cybersecurity
 - Removes annual requirement for cybersecurity training, per HB 1118 and SB 1267
 - Gives the superintendent authority to impose consequences for failing to complete required training

PERSONNEL



Counselor Duties, Employee Resignations DFE, DP

DFE: Employee Resignations

- Clarifies that the superintendent or other person designated by the board may accept resignations of contract employees
- The administration proposes a resolution to designate certain HR administrators to accept resignations.

DP: Counselor Duties

- Adds a requirement that counselors spend 80% of their time on the comprehensive school counseling program, per SB 179
- Allows a Board to approve a different allocation of counselor time based on district staffing needs
- The administration proposes a resolution reflecting the current duties of elementary counselors with Section 504 and state testing.

INSTRUCTION



Human Sexuality Instruction EHAA

- New local policy on adopting curriculum materials on human sexuality instruction, per HB 1525
 - Requires Board adoption of a resolution to convene the SHAC to hold meetings and make recommendations to the Board at a public meeting
 - Requires a Board vote, confirming that the recommendations meet the legal requirements

Accelerated Instruction, Promotion EHBC, EIE, FL

EIE: Retention and Promotion

- Removes provisions on grade advancement testing, per HB 4545
- Removes a statement on retaining students; only needed if a district operates an optional extended year program under TEC 29.082

EHBC: Accelerated Instruction

- Adds local policy provisions on accelerated instruction, per HB 4545
 - Directs parents to Board Policy FNG for complaints about accelerated instruction
 - Explains that parent requests for a particular teacher will be processed in accordance with administrative procedures

FL: Student Records

• Replaces "grade placement committee" with "accelerated learning committee"

STUDENTS



Child Abuse & Neglect FDE, FFG

- FDE: School Safety Transfers
 - Amends definition of continuous sexual abuse of a young child to include abuse of a "disabled individual," per HB 375
- FFG: Child Abuse & Neglect
 - Updates the standard for reporting child abuse to "reasonable cause to believe" a child is abused, per HB 3379
 - Clarifies that persons responsible for care & custody of a child include school personnel, volunteers & daycare workers
 - Adds a new training requirement in anticipation of new policy on professional development

Compulsory Attendance FEA

 Adds excused absences for students obtaining a learner's permit and driver's license, per SB 289
