As a school community, it is important for us all to have a good understanding of what constitutes bullying behaviour, and how we can encourage the children to recognise that it is different from disagreements they may have with friends or, importantly, one off incidents with other children. Please take a look at our Anti-Bullying Policy which can be found on our academy website and the information that we have added to the final page of today's newsletter, which we would encourage you to share with your children at home. Before the end of Term 3, we will be sending home an Anti-Bullying Survey and we would greatly appreciate your support in the completion of this. 


DIAR
