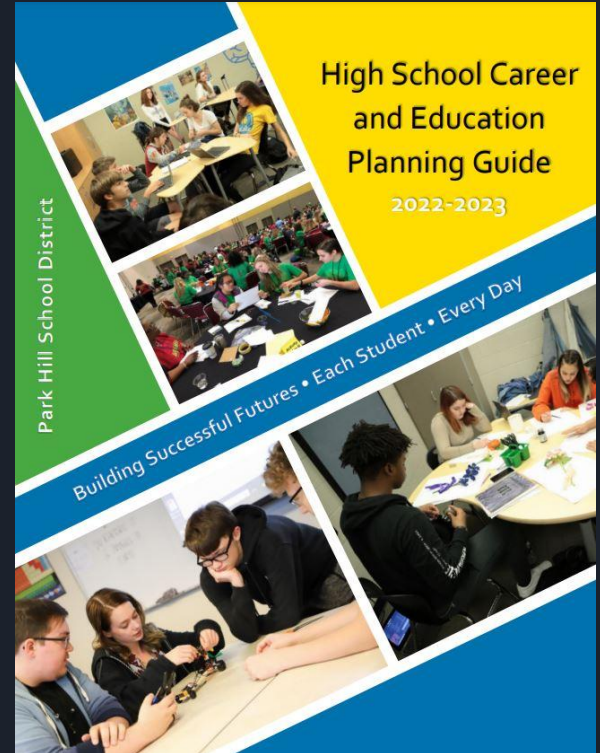


# OVERALL ENROLLMENT EXPECTATIONS

# A+ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (CEPG pg. 10)

## Eligibility requirements

- Be a US citizen or a permanent resident.
- Attend an A+ designated school for at least two years prior to graduation (A+ schools are state of Missouri only).
- Complete the Enrollment form to join Park Hill A+.
- Attain an attendance rate of at least 95% by graduation.
- Earn at least a 2.5 cumulative, unweighted grade point average by graduation (4-year colleges/universities may have a higher minimum GPA requirement)
- Complete at least fifty (50) hours of unpaid tutoring and/or mentoring. Students may earn up to 12.5 hours of the 50 in a pre-approved job shadow.
- Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoidance of unlawful use of drugs and alcohol. Students may not accumulate 10 days OSS for any reason.
- Score proficient or advanced on the Algebra I end-of-course exam (or ACT math sub score equivalent).
- Apply for federal financial assistance (Free Application for Federal Student Aid- FAFSA).
- Register for Selective Service (All males who turn 18 prior to high school graduation).

# DUAL CREDIT (CEPG pg. 6)

- College credit through Metropolitan Community College - Maple Woods
- Dual Credit Requirements:
  - Meet prerequisite for any course
  - Students in the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades must have an overall minimum GPA (unweighted) of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
  - Must meet ACT or Accuplacer score requirements.
- Earn HS credit, even if you choose to not pay for the college dual credit

- Rigorous college-level curriculum
- Earn potential college credits or advanced placement at vast majority of universities and colleges in the world depending on AP Exam Score

- Much emphasis on reading, writing, and presentation.

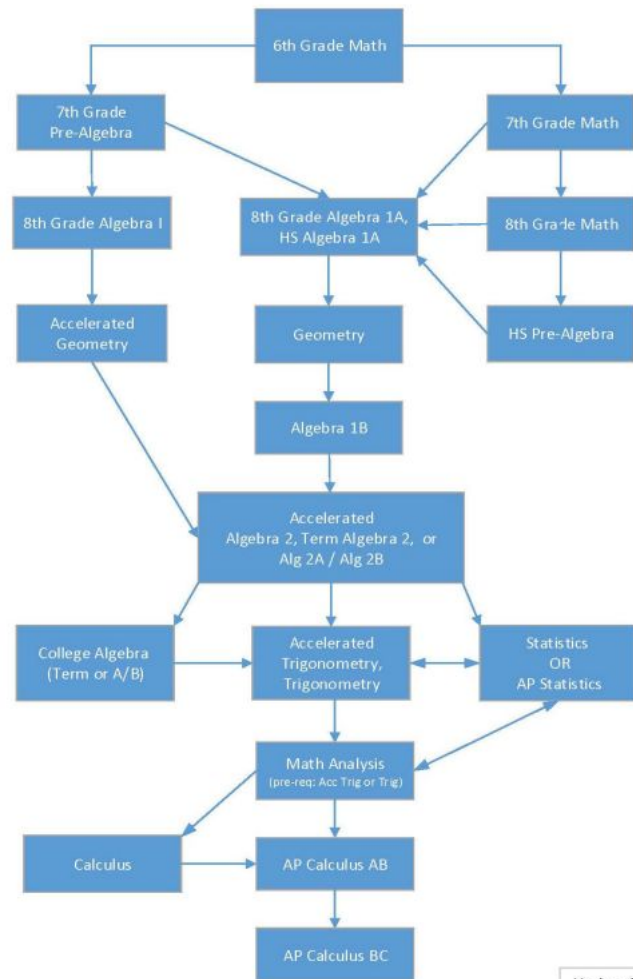
## AP Research (SENIORS)
