Dear Boundary Advisory Committee,

This letter is written in response to the Beaverton School District #48 (BSD) High School Boundary Adjustment Process that identifies proposed changes to the current BSD high school boundaries. In recent iterations of the boundary map, Aloha High School will be overcrowded. Most of the growth in the Beaverton area will be in the Southwestern portion. Therefore, it is likely that this high school will continue to become overcrowded, while other high schools, linked to communities in more incorporated areas in Beaverton, will remain below this threshold. This pattern is concerning and warrants public comment. We have been residents of the Burntwood West neighborhood and tax payers to Beaverton School District for over 10 years, and we see a need for revitalization. Thus, we are requesting that our neighborhood, Burntwood West, be re-districted to another high school (i.e. Cooper Mountain, Beaverton, or Southridge).


We believe that there are a number of reasons to redistrict our area. As shown on the map, there are 17 proposed students in our area. Moving our area to a different high school (Beaverton, Southridge, or Cooper Mountain) would reduce overcrowding at Aloha high school while not putting unnecessary burden on the other high schools. Further, it would keep children who went to school together for elementary school at Cooper Mountain with classmates for high school. It would also have a beneficial effect on the neighborhood itself.

We have witnessed a number of changes in our neighborhood over the last 10 years. While the neighborhood aged, it did not receive an influx of new young families. We believe this is in part due to the school district boundaries. If our neighborhood was districted to a different high school, it is more likely that new families would move in and revitalize the area to enable a more stable neighborhood over the next 20 years; more families to volunteer and assist Beaverton in servicing its primary and secondary students. Without any investment in this community, the neighborhood is less likely to contribute to Beaverton's long term goals; and when families move out, the homes run the risk of being left rented, vacant or foreclosed-as is evident today. Housing prices in this neighborhood have remained stable, but they have not reached their full potential. Burntwood West, if redistricted, like neighborhoods just south and east of our area, will be attractive to new families given the quality of the homes. This will ensure a strong base for Beaverton School District and the City of Beaverton, to help meet and exceed future plans.

We recently looked at the school boundary map and was shocked to see it change so dramatically from the first version that was shared. We were under the impression that we would be in the new high school boundaries based on the first publication of the boundaries. Our neighborhood, Northridge, is located west of Rigert and 185th. After reviewing the new boundaries our neighborhood is now set to go to Aloha. We wanted to understand why so we went onto the website and read the minutes from the meeting when this change happened. It stated that Aloha wanted to keep Hazeldale as a feeder school because of it's longtime relationship with the school. Why the need to take the entire school boundary when you are able to split other feeder schools, for example Erroll Hassel, Cooper Mountain, etc.? We are very disappointed that just because we go to a specific elementary school, when we really are closer and could walk to Erroll Hassel, that we will not be in the new school boundaries.

You have gone out of your way to draw in a neighborhood near Farmington and Murray just so that Aloha can keep all of Hazeldale as a feeder school into Aloha. The students near Farmington and Murray are less than a mile from Beaverton High school, but would now need to be bused approximately 6 miles to the new High School. This is a waste of resources and time. It would be more logical to have the students in that area to attend the school closest to them.

We realize that the boundaries need to help balance the attendance at each school, but this reason of keeping the relationship between Hazeldale and Aloha is not logical and is not what the families in the neighborhood are wanting. If this decision was based on income levels, property tax valuations, free and reduced lunch, or race then we are unfairly dividing and segregating the students. Those should have not bearing on the school boundaries. All of our tax burden should be shared equally amongst the school district since we all had a vote on the bond and are all sharing the higher taxes for this school equally.

Comment:

As a parent and community member I have concerns with the springboard map. It creates changes at Beaverton High School that would drastically alter the climate of the school and the community around it, for the worse. Changing the makeup of the school by moving seventy five percent of the student body would not be an easy transition for students. Sports teams, clubs and other activities would be decimated. In the proposal you are also cutting off a huge portion of area where your primary parent volunteers reside. BHS would lose a great deal of the family support that makes that school a great institution. The developing community around the school would also lose the families that support the businesses, businesses which in turn support programs at the school.You would also be students from AP to IB systems which could drastically effect their education, and transcripts. In addition the springboard map would create issues as students who have had access to enhanced technology at some schools would lose that when transitioning to new high schools where the programs are not to the same level of technological learning. It would take years for the school and community to recover. The newer, learning map, seems to have a much more equitable distribution of students and neighborhoods, it seems like it allows for more of the school communities to remain in tact. It seems to be a more sensible proposal than the original springboard, but still needs some work.

I can speak for our particular school community, which would be in better standing based on this newer learning map. As a Raleigh Hills K-8 family that lives close to BHS, we are happy to see more of Raliegh Hills attending BHS than originally proposed. We know that being a part of that community has meant a lot to our children and the children in the area closest to BHS. Much of the housing directly surrounding BHS is transitional in nature, as long term residents we have appreciated the connection to other more permanent neighborhoods close to Raleigh Hills. We have seen that the parents that are able to volunteer and provide economic support as well, are primarily coming from the area around RHS, as many that live closer to us, are unable to do so. We know that the same parents that are able to give so much to Raleigh Hills are also the parents that are very involved at Beaverton High School. If the original springboard proposal stands it also puts the students livin g closest to the high school in a situation where they would lose a very large portion of the friends that they have grown up with. I can say with certainty that our kids would lose ninety eight percent of the friends they have created at Raleigh Hills, and they are not alone in that problem. That would be an extremely hard transition at a very sensitive time in their education, especially for those students that are the most vulnerable. Retaining more of Raleigh Hills as the learning map suggests would help Beaverton retain those parents and students that provide support and stability to the community and Beaverton High School. It would behoove the committee to consider retaining all of the current Raleigh Hills boundary as well. The students that have had a top notch technological education which could be continued at Beaverton High School, would not have the same tools available at Southridge, and there would be no split for students. The committee should move the learning map to allow Beaverton High School to retain all of Raleigh Hills. /body>

I am Ridgewood parent living in Vista Hills and we want to go to Sunset!

I attended the meeting tonight and was pleased to see that the map had changed to reflect more equal distribution of FRL percentages (parent resources). I think that this is critically important when we are talking about the overall health of the school district. So, thank you for that change.

I also wanted to point out that traffic/congestion and related safety issues are a problem for ANYONE commuting to BHS due to the nature of its location- it is located in the center of downtown Beaverton. Let's face it, that traffic stinks for all of us whether you are coming from Aloha, Vista Hills, or West TV. The traffic and congestion is not unique to one commute or another-it is difficult for anyone. With that said, I hope the committee appreciates that traffic/congestion /safety issues are not unique to one neighborhood, they are a problem for anyone making that drive.

In regards to community, Ridgewood Elementary School has a LONG history with Sunset HS. Vista Hills and Cedar Hills are some of the older neighborhoods around and have a long history of being a SHS neighborhood. Many of my friends and neighbors, including myself, went to Sunset and bought houses in Vista Hills because we loved the location and our kids would go to Sunset. I want to give a sincere thank you to the boundary committee members for their hard work during this process. After attending meetings and carefully following the process, it is evident they do not have any easy task and must juggle many factors. With that said, I expect that ALL factors will be considered when making these decisions, particularly those that were clearly stated as being priorities.

I am a parent whose children attended West TV. I now have a sophomore and a 6th grader. I have written in before, but I am growing increasingly concerned and perplexed by the direction the maps are taking particularly as it affects the West TV community. Many letters have been written by the concerned families in this community who are presenting very valid concerns, as well as possible solutions. I have read letters from others outside of this community as well who clearly do not understand the implications that moving West TV has on our tight-knit community. It is evident that some people have clearly written their comments from a place of emotion and say terribly ugly things. However, the organized group of West TV parents has been very careful to not take a stand on emotion, but on legitimate concerns that are based on fact.

It honestly does not have to do with one school being "better" than the other; they offer different approaches to academics. When kids begin their schooling under one curriculum and have a plan for their high school years (that is encouraged to be developed as a Freshman), it is difficult for them to have to change mid-stream of high school to a completely different curriculum. Particularly one that does not offer the same options that they previously were counting on. This is a problem that cannot be resolved quickly or easily. What accommodations will be made for students who are currently in an IB school, such as Cedar Park or Sunset HS, that are being moved to a non-IB high school?

Equally concerning to me, however, is the persistence of the discussion to move West TV families to Beaverton High School and how that divides our community. This is a unique area of the district with very involved families – not because we have time (for most of us, both parents must work, but we still make time to volunteer and get involved), but because we find it vital to supporting our little community. As our kids have grown, their circle of friends and community has expanded to develop close friendships with kids from throughout the Cedar Mill area that attended Findley, Bonney Slope, Terra Linda, Cedar Mill, and other elementary schools through involvement in sports and other activities. We identify with Cedar Mill – not Beaverton. Downtown Beaverton feels distant and most of us make an effort to not have to travel into downtown and do our business as locally as we can. By moving West TV kids to Beaverton HS, our children will be going to middle school with one group of kids and then be pulled from this group and placed with an entire new group when they enter high school in Beaverton. When we are talking about a community of kids from the smallest school in the district, this can be extremely difficult and alarming to kids. The transition from middle school to high school is difficult enough without being separated from your extended friend group. How can the District help a community located so far from a high school feel like it is part of the community? How will you prevent this area of kids from feeling isolated and as outsiders to the Beaverton HS community?

Finally, in the 10 years I had kids at West TV, I can say that it felt like our school was often treated like a step-child by the District. Because we are a small school, we had various issues come up and it felt like we were patted on the head and told "you'll get over it" and the District did what it wanted. Whether this was teachers being eliminated, transportation issues, or facilities. It feels like this is happening once again and we are penalized for going to a small school because it "only affects a small amount of kids." This is not good for the families or for the District as it is creating animosity and bitter feelings among this group of taxpayers by sending the message that our voices not only won't be heard, but even worse, that it doesn't matter. How are you going to correct the perceived disregard of our concerns and our community, particularly if the option of moving West TV to Beaverton moves forward?

I encourage you to consider these issues as you revise the boundaries. Maps and demographics tell one story. But there is a human side - the community - that should also be considered in this process.

January 10, 2016 To Whom it May Concern:

I am writing to you to express my concerns regarding the Boundary Adjustment map. I appreciate you taking the time to hear our input.

We currently have a son, Reece Arenz, who attends Cedar Park Middle School. He is in 8th grade which means he will be entering his sophomore year of high school, when Cooper Mountain opens. Rather than settling into high school, after adjusting as a freshman, you are asking that our child to uproot from friends, community, and a school that has been ingrained in him since he was in kindergarten. I am concerned with the impact the boundry change will have on the students that will be sophomores and juniors when the new school opens. Asking students to change schools midway through high school is a very inequitable request.

I am asking the committee, in addition to working on the new boundaries, to please consider policies that minimize the disruption to students who already attend the high school when the transition begins. They should have the option to continue and graduate from their high school, in this case - Sunset. If you start the transition process for incoming Freshman, it would be less disruptive. I don't believe that only seniors should have the option to stay at their high school. I believe the committee should to find a way to let the kids that have started at a high school, stay there.

We have another son who currently attends Sunset High School, Brooks Arenz, he will be a senior at Sunset when Cooper Mountain opens. I would hope that the committee would consider that if a sibling is attending Sunset, then they should both attend the same school. This would be disruptive to both the students and their family. Navigating between two schools.

Staffing Patterns - Currently there is no IB offered at Beaverton High School, only AP, whereas Sunset offers the IB program. After being immersed in this program since kindergarten, asking students to switch high schools, as they are already participating in the high school IB program is wrong. I ask the committee to allow these students to get the full benefit of the IB program.

The honors diploma at Sunset is a very different program than the one outlined in the 2015-16 Beaverton High School Academic Planning Guide. Students transferring from Sunset to Beaverton in their sophomore and junior years will have already completed one or two years of honors credits through extra projects (each semester) in their core subjects, and/or will have taken advanced classes during those years. Beaverton High's honor diploma is based solely on GPA (3.5) and their scholar's program requires compliance with several criteria including GPA, extra-curricular participation, advanced coursework, and others. Dear members of the Boundary Advisory Committee:

My 13-year-old twin girls and my fiance and I just moved this past summer to a great neighborhood near SW 102nd Ave and Washington Street in the West Tualatin View Elementary School area. The neighborhood is within the Sunset High School boundary area — as was the home where we lived prior to this one, at 10859 NW Laurinda Court.

So my girls were planning to be freshmen at Sunset High School in the fall of 2016 and continue their high school careers at Sunset.

I am exceptionally concerned about the prospect that the high school boundaries would be changed to force my girls to go to Beaverton High School, more than four miles away from our house.

I am concerned about the proposed boundary changes for several reasons, including the fact that my girls have been part of a Beaverton school district IB program since first grade at Bonny Slope Elementary. They've continued in an IB program in middle school at the International School of Beaverton and had hoped to continue in an IB program at Sunset High School. If the current boundary proposal is approved, the girls would be going to Beaverton High School, where there is no IB program.

I also have concerns about the disruption to the girls' lives during their high school years. They've formed deep bonds of friendship with children and families who've gone to schools north of Highway 26 and near Sunset High School. Most of those bonds will be severed as they will become part of a small neighborhood north of Highway 26 that will be split from the rest of the neighborhood as high schoolers there are forced to attend a high school far from their natural neighborhood.

But my biggest concerns are probably transportation and safety. If the current proposal is approved, my daughters will be forced to go to a high school more than four miles away from our house. The transportation hurdle of Highway 26 and its interchanges make it even further away, in terms of dealing with natural traffic flow. I can imagine it could be 20 minutes or more to drive them to school every morning. Sunset is our natural neighborhood high school. Beaverton High is a distant place several highways away.

I understand the extremely difficult job that the boundary advisory committee — and the Beaverton school district — has in needing to make boundary changes because of the new high school. But I think an important goal throughout the process should be keeping intact the natural neighborhood around each high school, so the high school is a part of its community and the community is a part of its high school. I believe splitting off an eastern chunk of Cedar Mill north of 26 — for years a part of the Sunset community and very far from Beaverton High School — will severely hurt the community and be a huge mistake for the Beaverton school district.

Thank you for taking the time to work on the challenge of creating new school boundaries. I know this cannot be an easy process; however, I am disappointed that the majority of the stated criteria for drawing up the new boundaries have been ignored. I am also concerned that the process used to create this map has been cumbersome and flawed—as acknowledged by many of the committee members at each monthly meeting.

My oldest daughter graduated from Sunset High School in May. My son is currently a junior at Sunset. My youngest daughter is a student at Cedar Park Middle School and is looking forward to her time at Sunset High School as well. We chose our home based on the schools and never would have bought this property had it not been in the Sunset High School boundaries. Our family has established relationships with teachers, principals and coaches. We have volunteered and invested in the Sunset High School community. The neighborhood we live in has a proud history of attending SHS—from the earliest days of Sunset's existence. This is a legacy that is difficult to abandon and should mean something to the school board. It is very personally meaningful for all of our families.

My primary concern with my children attending Beaverton High School is transportation and safety. We are 2.75 miles away from Sunset High School. My son has been able to ride his bike safely to school. My kids can walk without any trouble; it is not an around the corner walk, but still a reasonable choice when there is a need. Beaverton High School is 4- 4.5 miles away, depending on the route, and through one of the most densely trafficked parts of Beaverton. A bus ride for my child will be a minimum of 45 minutes and potentially even longer. This is too long to spend on a bus. It is also more than twice as long as it currently takes to get to our high school. Additionally, there is no safe way for anyone to walk or bike to school. This is important, not just to the community where we have the highest rate of school walkers in the district, but also to our family personally. I am not in a position to always drive the great distance to Beaverton High School. Should my child attend BHS and miss the bus, they would be home for the day because there would be no way for me to take them and no safe way for them to get themselves there. Their ability to participate in extra curricular activities will be directly impacted. I cannot travel to the center of Beaverton, making over an hour round trip commute, to pick up a child after practice. This is an onerous burden to place on families and unacceptable. This situation unfairly impacts children whose families do not want them driving to school in one of the least safe parts of the city, with 2.5 times the accident rate on Cedar Hills Boulevard as opposed to Cornell Road, and are not available to spend the long hours in the car driving their children.

At last night's committee meeting, a concern was raised about splitting elementary schools into different high school areas. This latest learning map puts some of the West TV elementary school children at Sunset and the majority at Beaverton. This is a disturbing problem. Furthermore, by moving Oak Hills areas into Sunset, you are splitting that elementary school into Westview and Sunset groups. It might make more sense to keep those neighborhoods at Westview and allow West TV families to stay at Sunset, thus preserving two school's and neighborhood's unity.

I am further troubled by the lack of an IB program at Beaverton High School. Both of my oldest children have participated in Sunset's IB program. My youngest daughter attended a PYP school and is at a MYP school—all with the aim of preparing her for an IB program that she will now be denied. This doesn't seem like a fair consequence of the boundary adjustments.

I believe that in the district we should be working to make all schools great, so that every neighborhood school is worth attending. I see many positive things about each school; however, not one of the schools in this district is worth being on a bus 1.5- 2 hours a day and missing out on extra curricular activities to attend. I respectfully ask the committee to keep the West TV community together at Sunset High School.

Good Afternoon,

I continue to be appalled as I attend the boundary adjustment meetings that student and community transportation safety and neighborhood unity hardly get lip service in the planning process while free and reduced lunch echoes as paramount with capacity. I have attached a alternative map that would allow for safer boundaries and more maintained community unity.

Proximity to School

- To be blunt the West TV area does not want to have our kids go to Beaverton High and in addition the Bethany area pushed to Sunset does not want to go to Sunset. So please switch it back!
- The West TV area is only 2 miles from Sunset High School with clear predictable travel to and from the school, travel time less than 5 minutes in most cases.
- The proposed Beaverton High is 8 miles from the West TV area through very busy unpredictable arterials, moving with the flow of traffic, that can take anywhere from 30 minutes to better than an hour to get to and from on any given day. This is not acceptable especially when you factor in 5 additional buses and as many as 300 extra cars commuting down Barnes road past St. Vincent Hospital each day.
- Areas of Bethany are more than 5 miles from Sunset along very congested roads, Kaiser is only a 2 lane road in that area, while only while only a couple miles from Westview with fairly clear roads leading to the school.

Neighborhood Unity

 As I stated in my previous email I have served on both the West TV Local School Committee and the Elementary Boundary Adjustment Committee convened a few years back and I can tell you the ties more than 50 years old to the West TV area and Sunset run very deep and Beaverton over that time has been seen as nothing but a community rival. It would be devastating for this community to have to endure that change. Not to mention increased distance to travel to Beaverton High School events would be an increased burden for families, and possible a barrier to attendance at all for some, to ever get new traditions started again at another school.

- With the most recent changes Cedar Mill has been put back into the Sunset boundary while West TV continues to be pushed to Beaverton. This breaks a bond between these 2 schools but more importantly leaves no clear boundary between Sunset and Beaverton other than a hill slope. It was started by Maureen Wheeler in a media interview that the boundaries would be spilt along arterials for the sake of safety. This is a clear miss.
- The area of Bethany pushed to Sunset has been a Westview area since its inception, this swap makes no sense.

• Transportation Safety

- The only clear way to assure community and student transportation safety and maintain the current access to St. Vincent Hospital, which at times now is not great, is to have the largest native boundary, highway 26, be the southern boundary of Sunset High School.
- Currently the commute from Sunset to the West TV area down Cornell Road crosses no major arterials and is able to be biked safely for our students if they would like, many community members run the stretch on a regular basis. Biking is an impossibility from the West Haven area to Beaverton High School and bus transportation would take at least 3 times longer and put kids at risk as the only way to make this trip would be to traverse highway 217 or the extremely busy Cedar Hills Blvd. There is no way to say that the safety of our West Haven kids would not be negatively impacted by a shift to Beaverton. A shift of the Bethany are back to Westview would have no negative impact on safety as Bethany Blvd in that area is not a major arterial, surely not a highway 26.
- The cost of busing has been at the fore front of the budget for years with buses being cut in our area to save cost just to Sunset. The increased cost of busing the West TV kids to Beaverton has to be very significant not to mention the time of morning our kids would need to get up and going to catch a bus to Beaverton High School would have a huge negative impact on our kids. This cannot be allowed to happen.
- Should a shift of West Haven to Beaverton be mandated a traffic study would have to be done for 2 reasons. 1) the increased risk to students and community with the cross town 8 miles commute of buses and commuter traffic. 2) the drastic increase in traffic it would cause in front of St. Vincent hospital affecting patient and emergency vehicle access. Based on this fact alone an injunction would need to be filed to halt any boundary changes until a study could be completed.
- Transportation of students from the Bethany area to Westview would cause no changes seeing that area currently go to Westview.
- I also heard stated from a committee member that the cost of transportation is not a factor because 70% of the cost is picked up by the state. I am sure residents outside of the Beaverton School District would not agree with that comment!

I apologize for the length of this email. I also have concerns personally about my 2 boys possibly having to shift away from the Sunset IB program and Sunset Athletics but that would be another discussion. I only ask that you continue to put the needs of the students and communities first in these discussions and West TV elementary area continues to be part of Sunset the Sunset boundary.







To Whom It May Concern:

We are writing in an effort to include our voices within this process of the current proposed boundary change for Beaverton High Schools. We realize that this is a difficult change for many of us as parents within the district. We also recognize the effort that is being given by this committee. That being said, as parents of four children with the within the Ridgewood Elementary School/Cedar Park Middle School boundary, we have some very strong concerns.

We moved from the Portland School District to the Beaverton School District, in part for better schools. We specifically purchased the home that we did because of the schools it fed into. We wanted our children to attend schools that were part of the International Baccalaureate Program, and this is why we chose the Vista Hills Neighborhood, because it provided just that. Now our children will have started with an IBP elementary school and middle school, but lose this opportunity completely for high school due to the boundary change.

We are thrilled with Ridgewood Elementary for the incredible support and enthusiasm given by not only the educators, but the parents as well. Cedar Park Middle School has also provided excellent educational opportunities, as well as investing in the students as a whole person. We have been optimistically expecting Sunset High School to provide a similar experience. Our children have all had opportunities to go to Sunset High school as part of their field trips, and to have Sunset High students rotate through their own classrooms as helpers. Changing our orientation to Beaverton High School is difficult for our family. It is made more difficult because the academic achievements of Beaverton High School are not on par with Sunset High School. There is no continuation of the International Baccalaureate Program, and their grades as a school are not nearly as high as those of Sunset High School. It doesn't feel fair to have the district as a whole benefit from the building of these additional schools, while our family gets transferred to a school with significantly lower scores in all areas of testing. It seems to us that these changes benefit other neighborhoods within the school district, but how will our children be benefiting? They are already losing the ability to continue with an IBP school, so how will the school district make up for these short comings?

Additionally, we are specifically concerned for our 8th grader. My understanding is that she may have to start Sunset High School and then be moved to Beaverton High School. That is a lot of adjusting required of a student. There must be a better process available if these boundary changes are indeed made. She is already asking for other options due to this stress.

An additional concern we have is for the future boundary changes. We have heard that Cedar Park Middle School may eventually feed into more than one high school. I just want to say I hope that is not true. While high school is primarily about educational opportunities, it is also where our kids socialize and learn about themselves as social beings. It is not easy for a 9th grader to have to start out high school without the support of the friendships they have nurtured through previous years. Now it seems as if some kids would be going to high school with their friends and some may not. It would all depend on where they live within this

arbitrary boundary.

Please consider the difficulties for the families impacted by the decisions you are making. While change is not always easy, it would be great if we came out of this process having gained something great rather than lost something exceptional. Thank you.



Beaverton School District (BSD) is in the process of negotiating high school boundary changes right now, and these new high school boundaries will be announced in March or April 2016 and put into effect in fall 2017. The new high school boundaries will determine the new elementary school boundaries which will start in the fall of 2017 as well.

I am writing to you all to let you know what may be down the pipeline for us in Arborview, and how the high school boundary changes will effect our elementary school assignment in the near future. Jacob Wismer is a wonderful school; it is an enriching and positive educational community that is unique in its student and family diversity and the degree of high parent interest and participation in volunteering and fundraising. Without this special make up of diverse families helping to educate the children, fundraise for the school, volunteer time and money to programs and

options middle schools and high schools, still have close triends that they

made from their years at JW. It would be a shame if we let our own Arborview neighborhood slip through the cracks and get removed from the Jacob Wismer Elementary attendance area in 2017 because we are not letting our voices be heard right now during the high school boundary change process.

Currently, Jacob Wismer feeds into two high schools from Stoller Middle School. These two high schools are Sunset (an international baccalaureate school) and Westview; this means that kids who have gone to school together from kindergarten through 8th grade will eventually be separated when 9th grade rolls around. This fragmentation is due to an arbitrary boundary drawn on the powerline corridor near the Bethany Terrace Estate neighborhood behind Crady Lane (that's the street that JW is on). The Beaverton School District is currently working on boundary changes that will result in elementary schools feeding into middle schools and middle school students feeding into the same high school. If the boundaries for Sunset include the neighborhood east of Kaiser/Bethany Blvd. and south of Springville (that is Arborview), then we will stay in Jacob Wismer.

If our small neighborhood doesn't speak up and we stay in the Westview attendance area, we will 99% surely be removed from the Jacob Wismer attendance area starting in 2017, meaning we would be rerouted to the new elementary school which will be off of Kaiser and Brugger, and will consist of a large student body from the new apartments and townhomes that are going in behind the Bethany Presbyterian Church.

If Arborview neighborhood gets into the Sunset boundary, then we will most likely stay at Jacob Wismer Elementary School and then on to Stoller Middle School. I encourage you to check out the BSD website under "boundary information"

My daughter is currently a freshman at Westview HS. Under the current proposal, our home will be redistricted to Sunset. This will impact my daughter beginning her junior year. My daughter is devastated at the thought of being forced to leave Westview after she has been there for two years. Please allow juniors to choose whether to stay at their current school or move to the new school. Please grandfather juniors.

My daughter has been planning to go to Westview her entire life. She has been playing sports in the programs that feed into Westview since the 3rd grade. This year, as a freshman, she will play three different sports at Westview. Playing sports with Westview is an enormous part of her life. These Westview teams are extremely important to her. She is very concerned about being forced to play at a different high school, with coaches and teammates who don't even know who she is. She won't be as accepted as the girls who have been playing on the Sunset teams for years. She also wants to play sports in college. The junior year is extremely important in terms of getting recruited to play in college. How will a coach at Sunset help her get recruited to play in college if the coach hasn't been watching her play during her freshman and sophomore year and doesn't have any loyalty to her. A coach is more likely to promote girls the coach has been working with for years. Forcing her to change schools her junior year could impact her chances of playing in college.

None of my daughter's friends have been redistricted to Sunset. She has been friends with these kids since 1st grade. A child's friends are probably the most important thing in her life. To have to start over at a new school and make new friends, as a junior, is not fair. It is emotionally damaging to lose all your friends. My daughter has a great group of friends at Westview. Good friends keep a kid on track - the kid studies, goes to class, and doesn't get involved with drugs and alcohol. What happens when you lose all those good friends? A child is more at risk for bad things happening if she's at a new school without friends.

My daughter loves Westview. She probably has over 50 items of clothing that say Westview on them. Her passion, loyalty, allegiance, and commitment are for Westview. She attends the football games and goes to dances. Westview is her community. It is her world. It is part of her identity. Please don't take this away from her in her junior year. She is distraught at the thought of losing everything. Westview actively encourages school pride and a sense of community and belonging. She won't be able to just turn that off and switch it to Sunset after being at Westview for two years. (Adults love the same sports teams their entire lives and they don't even know any of the players. How can you expect a child to suddenly change the school they support?) Sunset is not her school. Westview is her home. You shouldn't make a child love a school and then kick her out after two years.

My daughter should be enjoying her high school experience and preparing for college, not be experiencing the emotional upheaval of losing her school, friends, and sports teams. High school is often the best time in someone's life. Being forced to leave Westview could ruin the last two years of high school for her.

No amount of "support" from the new high school will help her handle losing her friends, school, and sports teams. There is no support that can be given to make this transition work. It is too late to force juniors to switch schools.

Juniors should not be forced to change schools. The district should be helping our kids, not hurting them. Please allow juniors to be able to choose to remain at their current school. Please grandfather them.

Boundary Committee members,

I do not envy you. I have attended each of the boundary meetings to date, and after each I leave with gratitude for your work and dedication . . . and relief I am not in your shoes.

I am the proud parent of a Beaverton freshman and Highland Park 6th grader. I am the program manager for Beaverton Youth Football, on the board of Beaverton Youth Lacrosse, a past PTO president, and a Booster Club member. My husband is a football, lacrosse and soccer coach. We have owned three homes within the same elementary school boundary to ensure our children would spend all their school years in the same high school community. We are invested in Beaverton, and we see all we have worked so many years for slipping away due to circumstances beyond our control. We know there are many who share our frustration across the city.

I could speak more on the splitting up of communities by the proposed boundary changes. I could argue the points of traffic congestion, transportation safety and travel times. I could object to the disruption of the AP/IB pathways, or the athletic programs. I could point to the disparities in the economic equality. I could rehash the problems and disappointments the poor placement of this new school causes, but they have been voiced several times over, eloquently and passionately. Instead, I will offer an alternative and a few ideas for lessening the impact on our children.

BSD offers several option school programs. They are so popular, but in such small venues, there is a lottery process to get in and many students are disappointed to not gain entry. Were one or more of these programs to have a larger venue and the ability to accept a larger student body, what impact would that have on the current overcrowding in the five high schools? As the families attending option schools do so knowing transportation is more challenging, the location of the students to the school is not an issue.

As my oldest son will be a junior in 2017, the thought of trading in the orange and black uniforms he has grown up in for two years of black and gold leaves him less than thrilled. In his words, "you'll never get me to sing that fight song." The loyalty of the kids raised within a school community runs deep, and is not forgotten over a summer. Off the field, he is in the AP program and would transfer to an IB school. As neither the playbooks or honors programs from one high school transfer to another, it seems reasonable for the students who have started at one school to finish in it. Open South Cooper Mountain to the incoming freshman class. Allow them to build a community rather than force unhappy transplants into one.

Much concern has been voiced over some of the middle schools being forced to now feed two high schools. Highland Park has fed both BHS and SRHS since SRHS was built, and that seems often forgotten. Please don't think I bring it up because I enjoy having half my son's friends attend a different school and the difficulties they have in maintaining the friendships. I bring it up to illustrate the hardship imposed on kids when they have spent years with the same friends only to leave them behind and enter a new population. Not to mention how happy that population will be, being the left behind kids while many of their friends were forced to move on to another school. Our kids will have worked hard for nine or ten years to basically start over for their last two or three? An additional option would be to allow the freshman class of 2016 to enroll in the school they would then attend in 2017, South Cooper Mountain being the unfortunate exception. Students entering an AP or IB program should be able to do so without interruption. Those participating in athletics should not have to learn a new system after a year. Freshman should not have to be freshman twice.

While on the topic, please note that Highland Park will now feed to three, possibly four high schools and my youngest son's friends and teammates will go three, possibly four different directions when they start high school. Definitely not what we had planned when we planted our roots in the Beaverton High community 17 years ago.

There will be no happy ending to this, I think we as a district realize that. Even those who will stay in their school have friends, teammates and neighbors who will not. My hope is options will be examined and entertained to prevent those who had the least to do with creating this mess from feeling the most consequence.

In the "Other" category, I noticed letters that reference schools or neighborhoods which should be properly filed under their designated high school so the proper audience can read their perspective. I was not sure if you were aware of this?

Dear Mr. Rose, Mrs. Bryan, Mr. Simpson and Boundary Adjustment Committee,

We are parents of two children who are attending Ridgewood Elementary and Cedar Park. We live in the Vista Hills Neighborhood. We want our children to go to Sunset HS and are concerned about the proposed boundary changes.

There are several issues that we would like to address and they include:

- 1. Policy JC alignment
- 2. Alternative solutions which have not been addressed
- 3. Releasing data for public view/collaboration ASAP, TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE

Policy JC Alignment:

My understanding of the development of the JC Policy (District Policy outlined on the BSD website) which guides and should control the boundary adjustment process has an overarching objective of **BALANCING CAPACITY AND MINIMIZING TRANSITIONS FOR STUDENTS.** Furthermore, I understand that <u>if the capacity can be balanced with fewer transitions for students, that option should be</u> <u>preferred.</u> I understand that there are also secondary criteria (traffic, safety, student body configuration, etc...) and that no one variable controls the entire process. However, I am interested in making sure that the changes that are made align with the policy that has been developed. This is where my comments and questions arise:

1. **Publish the transition data**: Can you please publish the data that shows how many/what percentage of students will be forced to "transition" with each respective map? You do publish the capacity

information, but there is no transition data. Since The JC Policy also "requires transparency and collaboration", we would appreciate this information being made public as soon as possible.

2. Address alternative options raised by your community: If "minimizing transitions" is the preferred option, why have some of the alternatives provided by the public (noted over and over in multiple letters) not been considered? Alternatives such as turning the new HS into an Option School? Bussing new developments in N. Bethany (where the school should have been built to begin with) to the new school? Adjusting boundaries in a counter-clockwise direction? There have been no answers provided from the district or the committee to why these options and others have been disregarded. Can you please address these questions in some format (post on your site?) so we can feel like you are listening and we can stay informed and collaborate with you? Since transparency, collaboration and public input is valued, addressing these alternatives makes sense.

3. ALLOW ACCESS TO THE DATA: Allow access to the data so communities can look at the map, analyze the data, and provide alternatives which might make the most sense. If minimizing transitions for students is the overarching goal (along with balancing capacity and the secondary criteria noted in the document) and preferred outcome, why is the committee/district preventing the community from looking at the data? We certainly have a community of educated, creative, resourceful parents who might come up with a solution that makes sense and aligns with your Policy JC. Please allow access or be transparent with why this access is not allowed. Isn't the data a matter of PUBLIC RECORD? Time is of the essence. This process is moving along too quickly; we want to remain informed and collaborate with you in an educated way. Without the data, we are not able to do so and the process is not aligning with the Policy JC which values transparency and collaboration.

4. Splitting Middle Schools and Disrupting Continuity for the PYP/MYP/IB is not in the best interest of our students. Ridgewood is a PYP and Cedar Park is an MYP; Ridgewood kids deserve the opportunity to complete this journey-BHS is not an IB program-the continuity is therefore lost. Splitting Cedar Park into a school which feeds into BHS AND Sunset HS is similarly not in the best interest of our kids. These are significant disruptions in a child's education and social-emotional development. Again, disruptions like these do not align with your Policy JC. Minimizing transitions and disruptions like this is what is in the best interest of our kids.

5. Is Sunset truly at capacity? Or are the numbers artificially inflated (given the number of kids using on-line, off campus programs, reduced schedules, etc..) as several parents have suggested in their letters? This information peeked my interest because again, if some of our communities which have longstanding histories with Sunset High School could avoid a transition, this would align better with the overarching goal of balancing capacity and minimizing transition.

Please address the above questions and publish your responses. With the goal of the boundary adjustment process to remain transparent and collaborative as outlined by your Policy JC, addressing the above issues is necessary.

First of all thank you so much for your time and energy that you have put into this challenging process! I was actively involved in the rezoning of the elementary school boundaries when Springville opened up and I am aware that no decision you come to will make everyone happy but can I humbly request and encourage more thought and consideration for the enrolled high school students at the time the new high school is completed?

I strongly urge you to consider a gradual process when enrolling students into their new boundary school. By allowing the students to finish the high school that they started at (instead of grandfathering just the seniors for the 2017-1018 school year) I believe the majority of the students will thrive staying at a school that is familiar to them and they will also be able to keep in tact their current friend groups that they have already made.

This of course would only put incoming freshman at the new South Cooper Mtn High School and overcrowding at Sunset and Westview (which my daughter is a student at) would decrease gradually. In the meantime, may I propose, that any available space/classrooms at the new high school be used to alleviate overcrowding at other schools in the District similar to the way the new middle school being built in Timberland will be used?

I am a teacher at Health and Science School and live in the community. I first want to thank all the community members and district personnel who volunteered to serve on the Boundary Adjustment Committee. It is a difficult and often thankless job that requires patience, difficult choices, and a lot of time commitment. My concern is that the Criteria for Boundary Adjustments as set by Board Policy JC were not prioritized by the Committee before the new boundaries were proposed or by the district when making the Springboard proposal. Since so many of the criteria contradict each other (ie. proximity to school vs student body configuration), it seems that it would have been necessary to rank the criteria in order of importance in order to make the decision making more transparent. Thus, if transportation is truly driving the process than go ahead and rank it as the number 1 criteria over lets say the student body configuration.

Furthermore, looking at the outcome of the proposed map, I am concerned that the district is not focusing enough on equity as the "haves" (Sunset and Westview) will actually drop in free and reduced, ethnic/ racial diversity and the "have nots" Beaverton and Aloha will grow even more in these areas. Southridge is making significant changes in becoming more diverse while the new South Cooper Mt HS is starting off, as Southridge HS did previously, as a school with very little economic or racial/ethnic diversity. I would hope that the committee and superintendent consider revising the maps further to better balance the economic and racial/ethnic compositions of our high schools and/or explain why this was possible.

As a long time resident to this area and with two children working through the Beaverton school system, the new proposed school boundaries in the Bethany area are of a concern.



To the Beaverton School District Boundary Committee:

I am the father of 3 current and 1 future Ridgewood Elementary students and my wife and I are highly involved in the Ridgewood community. I have written several letters and followed the boundary adjustment process closely. I am the chair of the Ridgewood Science Festival and my wife Jeanette is the volunteer coordinator for two of our kids' classes. The district has a unique opportunity to improve equity and enhance education at all of our schools that I feel is being missed. I appreciate the challenges the committee faces and the constraints placed including limited time and availability of hard data on important factors in decision-making including the metrics defined in the bond proposal. I am also a successful grant-funded health sciences researcher and use GIS in my work which gives me a unique perspective on the process taking place. My goal with this letter is to express frustration at the process chosen by the district to adjust the boundaries and encourage th e committee to demand the district employ a new data-driven methodology that addresses the criterion we voted for in the bond. I hope I can convey the true depth and level of concern.

I do not know any parents who are satisfied with the boundary process. Many remain silent because they feel they will not be heard. I voted for the bond at the ballots along with many other parents hoping for improved education for the students in the Beaverton District. However, the district is not using or displaying data on most of the criteria set forth in the bond I voted for. As a result, I see the results of the boundary changes worsening education for many students. The proposals thus far cause the vast majority of students to transition to a new school track in addition to creating "haves" and "have nots" among the high schools. This will worsen the unity and community in the district. In addition, many parents are confused at why the district would build a new school so far away from the center of population growth in Bethany. I recognize this cannot be changed, and the future could not be predicted when the land was obtained, but it is another reason parents currently distrust the district.

The boundary change process has made gestures of transparency while effectively blocking the public from access to the data that is critical to make informed decisions and evaluate the metrics we voted for in the bond. I realize the consultant hired is highly experienced, but experience does not equate with efficacy. The process has thus far produced very few feasible candidate maps. How can the committee make a good judgement with such limited information? The most basic scientific research project uses more rigorous methods than the district is using to adjust the boundaries. To me the process is similar to using an outdated paper map to find directions while ignoring google maps which can give you real-time information on distance, traffic, road hazards, and calculate the fastest route. Parents in the district have just created a software program on their own time that allows more detailed analysis than the process used by the district.

I firmly believe the current boundary process is placing the district's chances of successfully funding another bond in jeopardy. It is easy to see a new high school will soon be needed in Bethany due to rapid population growth. The revised maps leave very little capacity at Westview. The current frustrations will be fresh on the minds of district parents when the next bond is needed. We the parents, the voters, the active members of this district, are losing faith in the district and will not vote for another levy or bond if we feel the district will not follow through with the commitments made in the bond while ignoring available technology.

Please stop the boundary process now and adopt a process that is not alienating a large portion of district parents. People are willing

to wait for another year in overcrowded schools to get this right. It is hard to stop a moving train, but worth it if the students are on the tracks ahead.



After reviewing the 9 criteria used for implementing boundary adjustments and passing the bond measure, several criteria are underrepresented. It appears the boundary committee analyzed: Availability of Space, Student Body Configuration, and Overcrowding (in addition to unofficial criteria: free and reduced lunches). This letter provides analysis of 4 essential criteria that are lacking in the springboard proposal.

1. Neighborhood Unity/Minimizing Transition


Out of 33 ES within the BSD, 12 (36.4%)ES would move to a new HS; 9 (27.2%) ES would consolidate to a HS within their current boundary OR consolidate to a different HS; and 12 (36.4%) ES would remain their current HS. **Therefore, the majority of ES, 21 out of 33 (63.6%), would experience a disruption in neighborhood unity and would be impacted by school transitions**.



Neighborhood Unity classification: 1 = no change; 2 = consolidating to a current boundary HS or consolidating to a different school; and 3 = changing to a new HS.

2. Proximity to New Proposed High Schools

Out of the 12 (36%) ES that would go to a new proposed HS, **7 ES would have longer commutes: Elmonica, Vose, Montclair, West TV, Raleigh Hills, Fir Grove, and Hazeldale.** The additional commute time for these schools will impact transportation costs, traffic congestion on major and secondary roads, student academic and life balance, and more.



Google Maps were used to calculate the shortest route between the ES to the current and proposed HS. Negative numbers represent a better commute (decrease in miles). Positive numbers illustrate a worse commute (increase in miles).


3. Transportation Changes to New Proposed High Schools

7 out of 12 ES would move to a new HS and have longer commutes. **2 of these 7 ES stand out to have worse transportation routes: Hazeldale and West TV**. (All other ES have no change, no use of major roadways, or a better commute.) Hazeldale would go from a walkable commute to Aloha HS (1.7 miles) to a drivable newly proposed S. Cooper Mtn HS (4 miles) commute. West TV would go from using walkable and drivable secondary roads to Sunset HS (3.4 miles) to drivable, congested major roadways and routes (Rt 217 or Cedar Hills Blvd) to Beaverton HS (4.2 miles).

It is well established that Rt 217 is a highly trafficked and dangerous freeway in Oregon. The Oregon Department of Transportation evaluated this freeway in the OR217 Active Traffic Management Project to improve state operations.

"Oregon Route 217 is a limited access freeway that serves the southwestern suburbs of Portland, Oregon. Over 2 million people live in the Portland metropolitan area and of these, over 115,000 vehicles per day on average travel highway route 217. Traffic on this highway has more than doubled over the last three decades, which has significantly degraded its mobility and safety, as it is operating at or above capacity."

Changes in ES to HS transportation were assessed using Google Maps to determine major roadways/highways and walkability. Negative numbers represent worse transportation in the proposed plan. Hazeldale and West TV transportation scores go from a better route to a worse route to school. (example: class2-class3=-1)

Transportation classification: 0 = no change; 1 = walk/bike; 2 = drive secondary roads; and 3 = drive highways.

Recommendation: It is requested that the superintendent, board members, and boundary adjustment committee members make the necessary changes to alleviate the extreme negative impacts to elementary school communities, especially the proposed West TV boundary change to Beaverton HS which pose increased traffic and safety issues. It is requested that the Beaverton School District conduct a formal traffic analysis for all communities where boundary changes result in commuting through any highways or major routes.

Questions for Follow-up:

- 1. What traffic studies (internal/external) will be performed prior to implementation of any boundary change?
- 2. What feedback have you gotten from O-DOT and Washington County with respect to changes in transportation and routes to schools?
- 3. What changes will be made to accommodate students transferring from an IB program to AP and vice versa?
- 4. Are alternative plans for the new HS being considered to alleviate overcrowding in other schools (Westview and Sunset) such as utilizing it as an option school, magnet/governor's school/trade school?


After thinking about some of the concerns that continue to be addressed at the planning meetings please find the attached map that addresses.

- 1. The community unity issues with the West TV area, a better than 50 year affiliate with Sunset, wishing to stay in the Sunset boundaries and the Bethany/Kaiser area, affiliated with Westview since its inception, staying with Westview.
- 2. Allows for the Meadow Park area to stay in the Sunset boundary to balance Student Composition, free and reduced lunch.
- 3. Increases the utilization of the new South Cooper Mountain school.
- 4. Dr. Rose -- Good evening! I was working on placing upcoming events on my calendar and found the Boundary Hearing is the same night as all 5 high school curriculum nights. They are all scheduled on Thursday, 2/18/16. Given the incoming freshmen invited to attend curriculum night are also a class most impacted by the boundary proposal, I expect this was an oversight in planning. I'd like to ask that something be rescheduled so that parents have the opportunity to attend both of these very important meetings.

I would also like for high schools that will see movement from one to the other (i.e., Beaverton/ Sunset or Aloha/Westview) not hold their curriculum night on the same evening. There is still so much to be decided by the Boundary Committee recommendation and your decision, we aren't able to plan accordingly. I've heard John Huelskamp say that students should be able to finish where they start. I absolutely agree. Whether this means my daughter starts & finishes at Sunset or begins at Beaverton her freshman year, ahead of the boundary change, so she can be there all 4 years. Even if your decision is that students move during high school, we will need to be able to plan courses for freshman year at one school that fit the planned course outline for another. I want to attend both curriculum nights since they are being held prior to the decision on boundaries. No family can be 3 places at once.

Dear Beaverton School District Boundary Adjustments Committee,

I have recently learned about some of the suggested adjustments of the BSD school boundaries affecting my community and I was told this would be a great place for community feedback.

First, I'd like to thank everyone involved with these difficult decisions. I have faith that investing this time and energy into our next generation will yield positive results. I'm proud that the district and the community have been so involved in planning for the high school boundaries.

Our family currently has a 3 year old, so we are not immediately affected by these decisions in the near future. We live in the West TV elementary school area (near Cedar Hills and Barnes) so my son would eventually feed into West TV when he gets to school age (assuming boundaries will not change). There are quite a few high school and middle school kids in our neighborhood who will be affected by the recent proposals however, and I feel compelled to speak on their behalf, and also as a community member.

My first concern with the suggested boundary changes largely has to do with safety and traffic flow. My husband and I both drove to school or took public transportation when we could (we both attended PPS high schools) due largely to after-school sports involvement. Since public transport is not nearly as accessible here, I assume that many high school students will plan to drive to school. This concerns me. I work near downtown Beaverton and know that there are no good ways to get from North to South Beaverton without using Highway 217 or Cedar Hills Blvd, where these young drivers would likely encounter more dangerous traffic conditions than taking Cornell road to Sunset High School. As a community member who routinely commutes via HWY 217, it makes me uneasy thinking about the extra traffic volume this would add to a very congested morning southbound commute. I understand that school buses are also available for transportation – but this also makes me wonder about additional cost incurred to the school district.

My second concern has to do with curriculum alignment. I've learned that West TV and Cedar Park Middle School are both schools that prepare kids to feed into the IB program at Sunset. Will the same opportunities be made available for kids who choose to continue this path, who will feed into Beaverton High School instead? This leads me to another concern – I understand that some current students who are attending Sunset High School in my neighborhood would need to transfer to Beaverton High School to finish out their high school career. Is there any wiggle room in this? This seems disruptive, especially since their final year in school is crucial for the college admission process.

I find myself thinking about the long term sustainability of the proposed changes as well. I understand that with a fast growing northern region and a new school in the south, it makes sense to shift boundaries farther south, but this feels like a temporary solution to a larger problem. Are there plans to build a high school in the north? In the

absence of concrete plans, I worry that moving a school like West TV (which is relatively small) out of the Sunset boundaries and in the meantime shifting a school like Oak Hills (relatively large) into the boundaries would contribute to even more overcrowding, both short and long term for Sunset High.

We've lived in the West TV neighborhood for six years now, and have recently made the decision to stay here for the remainder of our son's childhood. We're proud to be part of this community and love supporting the neighborhood kids. I understand that not everyone is going to be completely satisfied or unaffected by these changes, and know that ultimately the district will make the best decision with the possible resources. I would still urge the committee to reconsider moving West TV kids away from the Sunset High boundaries. Thanks for keeping them in mind!



I have concerns about the legality of the current Beaverton School District boundary adjustment process.

Beaverton School District Policy JC begins:

"School attendance areas shall be defined to support the established goals of the School District and the welfare of its students.

If the student enrollment at one or more schools is outside the guideline range established by the District, the Superintendent shall determine whether the attendance boundaries of such school(s) should be adjusted."

By definitively phrasing that the Superintendent shall determine to adjust attendance boundaries only of schools that are outside the guideline range, the prior School Boards have clearly intended that any schools that are not outside the student enrollment guideline range must be excluded from any boundary adjustment process.

It is obvious that the School Board intended to provide for the welfare of its students by minimizing transition for students, and prohibiting the transfer of any students out of their current schools if those schools are not over enrollment guidelines.

Pursuant to ORS 332.105, and Beaverton School District Policy BBA, Policy BF, and Policy BFE, the School Board has effectively prohibited the Superintendent from determining if attendance boundaries should be adjusted for any schools that are within the guideline student enrollment range.

Given the most recently published attendance numbers, Southridge and Sunset are clearly within enrollment guidelines, and no students at those schools should be required to change schools. Aloha is above permanent capacity, but within portable capacity; there could be an argument either way for Aloha. Westview is over capacity; students should be moved out of Westview. Beaverton is under capacity; students should be moved into Beaverton. The only legitimate alternatives permitted by Policy JC, would be to transition students from Westview, and possibly Aloha, to Beaverton and South Cooper Mountain.

The new high school is already \$55 million over its initial \$109 budget. It would be a tragedy if even more of the funds that are intended to educate our children were wasted because the district had to defend against a lawsuit because of policy violations.

I await your response as to how you plan to adjust the current boundary adjustment process to ensure compliance with Policy JC.

My biggest concern regarding the current map is travel time/safety and future growth in the district. A lot of growth seems to be happening on the north end of the district, and the extreme southwest, but the new high school currently doesn't have many students in its vicinity. To limit attendance at Westview/Sunset and keep students from travelling to long and on major highways (26 and 217), I would put the Southern boundary for both those schools at 26.

As someone who lives north of 26 in the area slated to go to Beaverton HS, I can attest to the unpredictability of drive times during the morning and afternoon commutes to downtown Beaverton, as well as the relative ease of going back and forth to the Sunset area. (I would also add that I NEVER drive into downtown Beaverton by choice--my library, grocery stores, pharmacies, physicians, pet store, and community are all in the Cedar Mill area.) I would not wish to have to take myself to central Beaverton esveral times a day to pick up or drop off my child for activities, nor would I see myself volunteering at Beaverton HS as much as I do at Sunset--too much of a hassle!

As the new school probably has the nicest facilities, I would like to see it become a magnet school and house one or several option schools until its local student body matches its capacity. I am writing to you to express my concerns regarding the Boundary Adjustment map. I appreciate you taking the time to hear our input.

We currently have a son, Reece Arenz, who attends Cedar Park Middle School. He is in 8th grade which means he will be entering his sophomore year of high school, when Cooper Mountain opens. Rather than settling into high school, after adjusting as a freshman, you are asking that our child to uproot from friends, community, and a school that has been ingrained in him since he was in kindergarten. I am concerned with the impact the boundry change will have on the students that will be sophomores and juniors when the new school opens. Asking students to change schools midway through high school is a very inequitable request.

I am asking the committee, in addition to working on the new boundaries, to please consider policies that minimize the disruption to students who already attend the high school when the transition begins. They should have the option to continue and graduate from their high school, in this case - Sunset. If you start the transition process for incoming Freshman, it would be less disruptive. I don't believe that only seniors should have the option to stay at their high school. I believe the committee should to find a way to let the kids that have started at a high school, stay there.

We have another son who currently attends Sunset High School, Brooks Arenz, he will be a senior at Sunset when Cooper Mountain opens. I would hope that the committee would consider that if a sibling is attending Sunset, then they should both attend the same school. This would be disruptive to both the students and their family. Navigating between two schools.

Staffing Patterns - Currently there is no IB offered at Beaverton High School, only AP, whereas Sunset offers the IB program. After being immersed in this program since kindergarten, asking students to switch high schools, as they are already participating in the high school IB program is wrong. I ask the committee to allow these students to get the full benefit of the IB program.

The honors diploma at Sunset is a very different program than the one outlined in the 2015-16 Beaverton High School Academic Planning Guide. Students transferring from Sunset to Beaverton in their sophomore and junior years will have already completed one or two years of honors credits through extra projects (each semester) in their core subjects, and/or will have taken advanced classes during those years. Beaverton High's honor diploma is based solely on GPA (3.5) and their scholar's program requires compliance with several criteria including GPA, extra-curricular participation, advanced coursework, and others. What is the District's proposal to reconcile and recognize the work those Sunset sophomores and juniors have already completed toward the Sunset Honors Diploma that isn't required by the Beaverton program?

Proximity - Our neighborhood is centrally located between Sunset High School and Beaverton High School. The dividing line at Canyon Road makes much more sense with regard to traffic patterns and safety. I would like the committee to consider keeping the line at Canyon Road.

Neighborhood Unity - The children in the Ridgewood area, have grown up together, they have worn the Sunset colors in all the youth sports, they have formed lasting friendships with their friends and families have spent years cultivating friendships. All these relationships are critical to the success of a high school student.

I appreciate you taking the time to read my opinion and I hope this letter gives you a better understanding of why I believe the students who are already attending Sunset, should stay at Sunset.

To Whom It May Concern:

We are writing in an effort to include our voices within this process of the current proposed boundary change for Beaverton High Schools. We realize that this is a difficult change for many of us as parents within the district. We also recognize the effort that is being given by this committee. That being said, as parents of four children with the within the Ridgewood Elementary School/Cedar Park Middle School boundary, we have some very strong concerns.

We moved from the Portland School District to the Beaverton School District, in part for better schools. We specifically purchased the home that we did because of the schools it fed into. We wanted our children to attend schools that were part of the International Baccalaureate Program, and this is why we chose the Vista Hills Neighborhood, because it provided just that. Now our children will have started with an IBP elementary school and middle school, but lose this opportunity completely for high school due to the boundary change.

We are thrilled with Ridgewood Elementary for the incredible support and enthusiasm given by not only the educators, but the parents as well. Cedar Park Middle School has also provided excellent educational opportunities, as well as investing in the students as a whole person. We have been optimistically expecting Sunset High School to provide a similar experience. Our children have all had opportunities to go to Sunset High school as part of their field trips, and to have Sunset High students rotate through their own classrooms as helpers. Changing our orientation to Beaverton High School is difficult for our family. It is made more difficult because the academic achievements of Beaverton High School are not on par with Sunset High School. There is no continuation of the International Baccalaureate Program, and their grades as a school are not nearly as high as those of Sunset High School. It doesn't feel fair to have the district as a whole benefit from the building of these additional schools, while our family gets transferred to a school with significantly lower scores in all areas of testing. It seems to us that these changes benefit other neighborhoods within the school district, but how will our children be benefiting? They are already losing the ability to continue with an IBP school, so how will the school district make up for these short comings?

Additionally, we are specifically concerned for our 8th grader. My understanding is that she may have to start Sunset High School and then be moved to Beaverton High School. That is a lot of adjusting required of a student. There must be a better process available if these boundary changes are indeed made. She is already asking for other options due to this stress.

An additional concern we have is for the future boundary changes. We have heard that

Cedar Park Middle School may eventually feed into more than one high school. I just want to say I hope that is not true. While high school is primarily about educational opportunities, it is also where our kids socialize and learn about themselves as social beings. It is not easy for a 9th grader to have to start out high school without the support of the friendships they have nurtured through previous years. Now it seems as if some kids would be going to high school with their friends and some may not. It would all depend on where they live within this arbitrary boundary.

Please consider the difficulties for the families impacted by the decisions you are making. While change is not always easy, it would be great if we came out of this process having gained something great rather than lost something exceptional. Thank you.

If you move out of the Beaverton School District and into Portland Public Schools (PPS), you would need to work with PPS on a transfer request. There is state law regarding transfers.
