Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, the Beaverton School District (BSD) will have new high school boundaries as Mountainside High School opens as our District's sixth comprehensive high school. In addition to our comprehensive high schools, many students attend District options programs and schools. We have five options schools: Arts and Communication Magnet Academy (ACMA), International School of Beaverton (ISB), School of Science and Technology (SST), Health and Sciences School (HS2) and Community School, or Merlo Station High School. BSD offers one program at Portland Community College (Early College High School). Students who attend any of the options listed above are allowed to participate with their "home" boundary school for clubs and Oregon Schools Activities Association (OSAA) sponsored activities and athletic teams per the OSAA's School Representation rule. In addition, we also have home school, charter school, on-line school, and private school students who participate in these clubs, activities and/or athletic teams based on their "home" school in our District, again based on the OSAA's School Representation rule.

The Beaverton School District will maintain its 2016-2017 District Boundary Map for current 9-12 grade students in all of these categories beginning with the 2017-2018 school year and continuing until the student's graduation or until the student's OSAA eligibility is exhausted. The bullet points listed below are intended to clarify what this means for Beaverton School District students in these situations going forward:

- 1) Students who currently attend any of the schools/programs listed above will be grandfathered to participate in all activities/athletics with their "home" high school as defined by the 2016-2017 District boundary map. Students will be grandfathered until graduation or until their Association OSAA eligibility is exhausted. This will be the only choice available as OSAA rules regarding School Representation require students to participate at their resident public school as defined by the school district.
- 2) The 2016-2017 District Boundary Map only applies to students currently attending any of the schools/ programs identified in the opening paragraph. Students who choose to attend an options program/school for the first time in 2017-2018 must participate for their "home" high school as defined by the 2017-2018 District Boundary Map. Additionally, there is no sibling clause to this policy.
- 3) If a student in an aforementioned school/program moves to an address that is located outside of his/her "home" high school boundary as defined by the 2016-2017 District Boundary Map, then the student must participate for his/her new home high school as defined by the 2017-2018 District Boundary Map.
