

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- enroll in and attend school, no matter where you live or how long you have lived there;
- enroll in school even if you are missing the normal documentation required for enrollment;
- continue attending the same school if in the best interest of the student, or transfer to a new school after experiencing loss of housing;
- receive transportation assistance;
- receive school meal programs;
- receive Title I services even if the school is not a Title I school;
- have your parents participate and attend school events and activities;
- participate in all programs and activities offered to other students, including athletics, music, clubs, and other extracurricular activities.

IF YOU LIVE IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

- with friends or relatives due to loss of housing, economic hardship or similar reason (aka doubled up or couch surfing);
- in a motel, hotel or campground;
- in a shelter or on the street;
- in a car, public space, abandoned building, a bus or train station or other similar setting;
- in a public or private place not designed or ordinarily used for regular sleeping accommodations;
- in an inadequate living accommodation (i.e. lack of plumbing, heating or electricity);
- in temporary housing and not with your parents or legal guardians (unaccompanied youth).




YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR SERVICES, INCLUDING:

- school breakfast and lunch at no charge;
- free school supplies;
- academic support and tutoring;
- help with records required for enrollment, including birth certificate and immunization records;
- referrals to housing, health care and food;
- referrals for other services;
- and much more




HOMELESSNESS IN WYOMING BY THE NUMBERS
