IRISH ADD TO OAKLAND COUNTY QUALIFYING LIST

After the Notre Dame Boys Varsity Swim meet against Holly on Monday was canceled due to weather conditions, the Irish were fortunate to be invited to a meet with Brother Rice and Fr. Gabriel Richard on Tuesday to earn one last chance for several swimmers to get Oakland County qualification cut times. Senior captain Anthony Dupuis qualified for the state meet and county cut with a time of 58.97 the 100 Backstroke and sophomore Pierce Marchese also qualified for the state meet in the 200 IM with a time of 2:08.02. Freshman Edziu Lis just missed the provisional county cut with a personal best time in the 50 Free at 25.35. Classmate John Louis dropped seven seconds to clock in at a personal best in the 200 Free at 2:09.52. Adding to the list of personal bests were junior Jamal Cannon, dropping seven seconds in his 50 Free and 11 in his 100 Free, while sophomore Diego Betancourt and freshmen Aaron Hall, Oliver Kugler and Hunter Pugliese all posted personal best times in the 100 Free. Coach McGreevy noted, "It was a great meet for the boys and a great opportunity to compete against other Catholic schools. The comradery between schools was palpable. I think the relaxed, friendly atmosphere helped the performance of the team. A big shout out to Brother Rice and Fr. Gabriel Richard allowing us in the meet on short notice!"
