

- . Be sure to choose 3 alternate electives **in addition** to your 8 courses




Duncanville ISD will use the Xello system this year for course requests.



Step 1: Log into Xello - students will use ClassLink to log in to Xello. Look for the Xello tile on the ClassLink Dashboard.

Reminders!

- Students will continue adding courses to their course plan for every subject until they have 8 periods.
- Some classes take up two class periods (e.g. practicum classes, advance culinary arts)
- Some classes will be double blocked (e.g. athletics, band)
- The most important thing is that there are 8 periods (4 for A Day/B Day however, the system isn't aware of A Day/B Day or 8 courses per semester). This is just to assist students with planning.

- There is a <u>Course Selection Worksheet</u> to assist with planning.
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- **REMEMBER**: It is important that students make certain not to make changes that affect their endorsement.
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- Any endorsement changes will require a signature from the parent and counselor approval.
