The Launch of Kineton High School Student Voice

Kineton High School has launched an online platform contextual safeguarding package to support students both in and outside school. Students can log issues on any device at any time and are guided by the platform if they




require immediate support or are happy to wait until a member of the Safeguarding team reviews their entry. These can be logged to an area both inside or outside school and so allows the school to build up a picture of where additional support can be provided as well as working with the community to improve these areas. Students have a QR code that links directly to the website although this can be accessed through our own website from the Student Voice banner on the main page.

The Student Voice also allows us to receive feedback on Student lives such as online gaming or social media so the school can adjust the pastoral support programme to guide students in these areas of life if a need arises. We also are strongly encouraging students to use the Student Voice to log any issues regarding friendships or perceived bullying so the Heads of Year can alleviate the problem swiftly.

Finally, the Student Voice can allow us to receive feedback from key areas of the school which are fed into the School Council and Senior Leadership Team. We are starting to receive invaluable feedback from our young students which will help us to guide and inform us about what is important to them and how we can all work together to improve the student experience at Kineton High School.

Even though it was the end of January, it felt very Christmassy! Students felt the play was very well-planned and well-organised and was easy to follow because of the costumes, acting and set. 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
STEM Club Special Guest

We were absolutely delighted to welcome STEM ambassador Jack Honour, energy advisor in the Government Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy, to our lunchtime STEM club on Monday 17th January.

Our club is entering a national competition to use science and technology to design a net zero plan for our own community. To protect our planet for future generations, one of the biggest challenges the world faces is to limit rising global temperatures and so reduce some of the effects of climate change. To limit rising global temperatures, we need to be aiming to get to net zero. Jack worked with a group of our enthusiastic year 7 students to firstly pick apart exactly what net zero means and together they then explored the energy resources currently used, together with what changes need to be made in the future to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. In terms of the latter, the group discussed the pros and cons of nuclear fuels and various renewable energies. Jack was impressed that the students were quick to reason that the issues around these are complex and that we need to consider multiple resource options in the future.

The discussion then moved on to explore ways in which global warming can be reduced by addressing alternative modes of transport, such as through bike hire schemes and by limiting energy consumption in the first place. Together with Jack, the students came up with many innovative ideas such as: using more battery powered appliances that use mobile rechargeable batteries that easily get recharged at solar powered recharge stations; charging your mobile phone

by transferring the movement energy when you walk or cycle or even from the vibrational energy when the school stairwell steps vibrate at the end of the day! The next steps for the student scientists at our STEM club is for them to build upon their discussions and continue developing their ideas for local plans to achieve net zero. Jack was so impressed with their enthusiasm for the topic, he has offered to come back in a few weeks time to see how they are getting on and continue to develop their ideas with them.

Leave of Absence During Term Time 2021-22



Student Absence Procedure

If your child is unwell and cannot attend school please call the 24 hour Absence Line on 01926 645 611 before 8.50am, stating their name and form, your name and the reason. This must be done for each day they will be absent.

If your child is unable to attend school for any reason other than illness, planned or emergency (part day, full day or multiple days), please always complete a leave of absence form and send it by email to enquiries@kinetonhighschool.org.uk This form should - we all need to play our part. be used for all appointments (medical, dental, music exams or external sporting activities), holiday requests, religious observance dates and all other reasons or circumstances where your child will be absent from school.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the arrangements. parent(s).

Unauthorised Absence

There are times when children are absent for reasons, which are not permitted by law. Examples of unauthorised absence are parental illness, term time . holidays or a family day out. Where there is no explanation for an absence or where the explanation or reason for the absence is considered unsatisfactory absence will be recorded as 'unauthorised'. Unauthorised Absences have to be reported to the Local Authority. The Attendance Compliance Enforcement Team may contact you where unauthorised absence continues to be a problem. Unauthorised absence could result in a Fixed Penalty Fine or other legal action. We are always concerned about the amount of school time pupils miss as a result of term time leave. There is no entitlement to time off during term time. Leave of absence is only granted in The full Attendance policy can be found under exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the Headteacher in accordance with the school policy as agreed by the governing body.

We greatly appreciate parental support to reduce the total amount of days lost due to holidays. We are committed to working in partnership with you to enable your child to reach their academic targets and to support their social development. For this to happen we need to keep individual attendance as high as possible

It is our policy:

- Only in an exceptional circumstance will term time leave be allowed. Parents/Carers wishing to apply for leave of absence need to fill in an application form well in advance and before booking tickets or making travel
- If term time leave is taken without prior permission from the school, the absence will be unauthorised and you may be liable for a fixed-penalty fine or other legal action.
- Please remember that absence for whatever reason disadvantages a child by creating gaps in his/her learning. A good understanding of the work and good progress can only take place when the child is in the classroom regularly and on time.

If you think you have exceptional circumstances please talk to us without delay and before arrangements are entered into or money committed. If exceptional circumstances are accepted the Headteacher will determine how much absence will be authorised. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Leave of Absence **During Term Time 2020-21**



The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the Where applications for leave of absence are made in case of Platt v Isle of Wight Council which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time. The parents of children of child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as compulsory school age are required to ensure that an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal they attend school on a regular basis. Warwickshire Secondary School pupils recorded 6,651 half day sessions of absence due to holiday in the Autumn/Spring term during academic year 2018/19. This is an increase of 602 on the previous year.
