

The Affordable Connectivity Program

Yadtel|Zirrus is partnering with Davie County Schools and the Federal Communications Commission to offer the Affordable Connectivity Program, established to help lower the cost of high-speed internet for eligible households during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Affordable Connectivity Program was created by Congress in the Investment and Jobs Act of 2021.

Who Is Eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program?

A household is eligible if one member of the household meets any of the following criteria:

- Federal Lifeline Program
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as Food Stamps
- Medicaid
- Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program
- Received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year

What Is the Benefit?

- Up to \$30/month discount for high-speed internet services.
- The Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount per eligible household.

What is Yadtel|Zirrus's Offer?

100Mbps x 100Mbps Fiber Internet - \$39.99 per month

Copper Internet - \$35.99 per month

This program is available until government funding runs out; customers will be notified by Yadtel|Zirrus in advance of the program ending.

How Can Eligible Households Sign Up?
