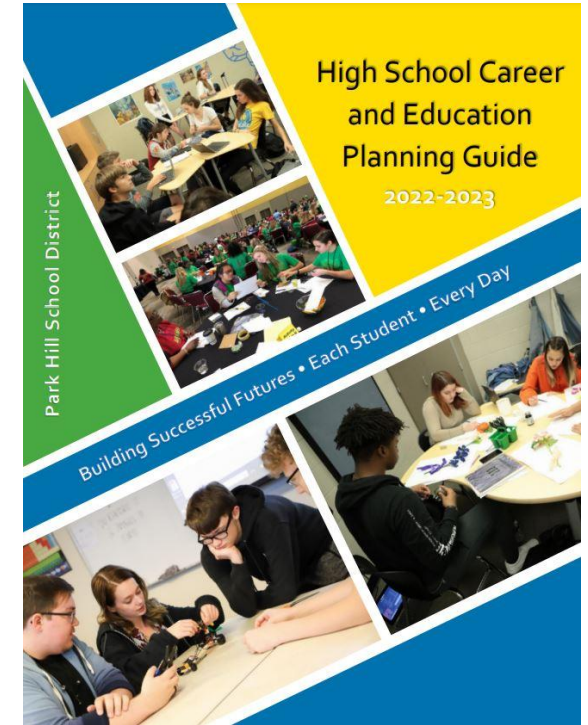

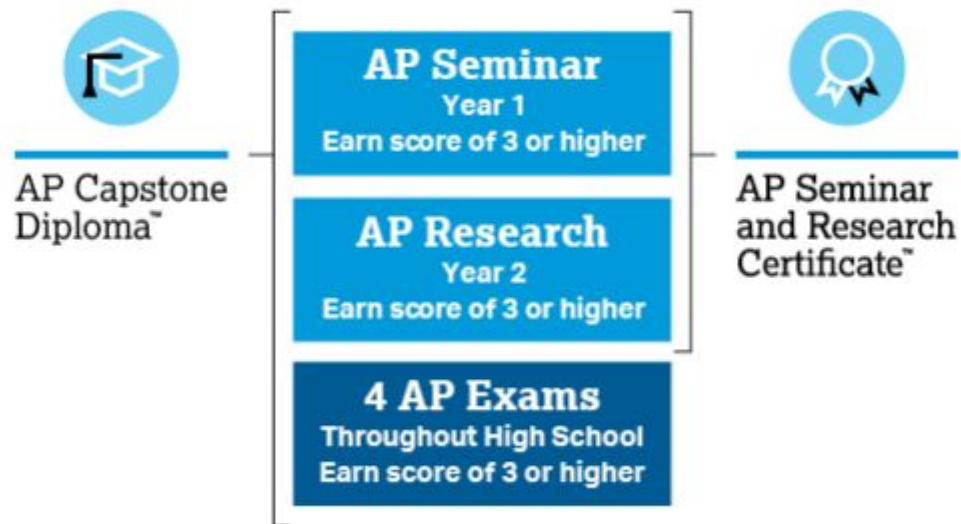
- College credit through Maple Woods Community College
- Dual Credit Requirements:
 - Meet prerequisite for any course
 - Students in the 11th and 12th grades must have an overall minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
 - Students in the 10th grade must have an overall minimum GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
 - Students in the 9th grade must have an overall minimum GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale AND score at the 90th percentile or above on the ACT or SAT.
- Earn HS credit, even if you choose to not pay for the college dual credit

(AP) Advanced Placement (page 6 in CEPG)

- Rigorous college-level curriculum
- Earn potential college credits or advanced placement at vast majority of universities and colleges in the world depending on AP Exam Score
- AP Exam and AP scores
 - Exams are given in May
 - If students score 3, 4 or 5 on their exam, there is the potential for college credit at colleges/universities all across the country.

- Weighted Grades
 - Students earn one additional point toward their GPA in an AP course (an “A” counts as 5 points instead of 4 toward their GPA, for example)
- AP Potential
 - Students that took the PSAT have access in their College Board account to their AP Potential (courses that might be good for them to consider based on how they did on the PSAT test).

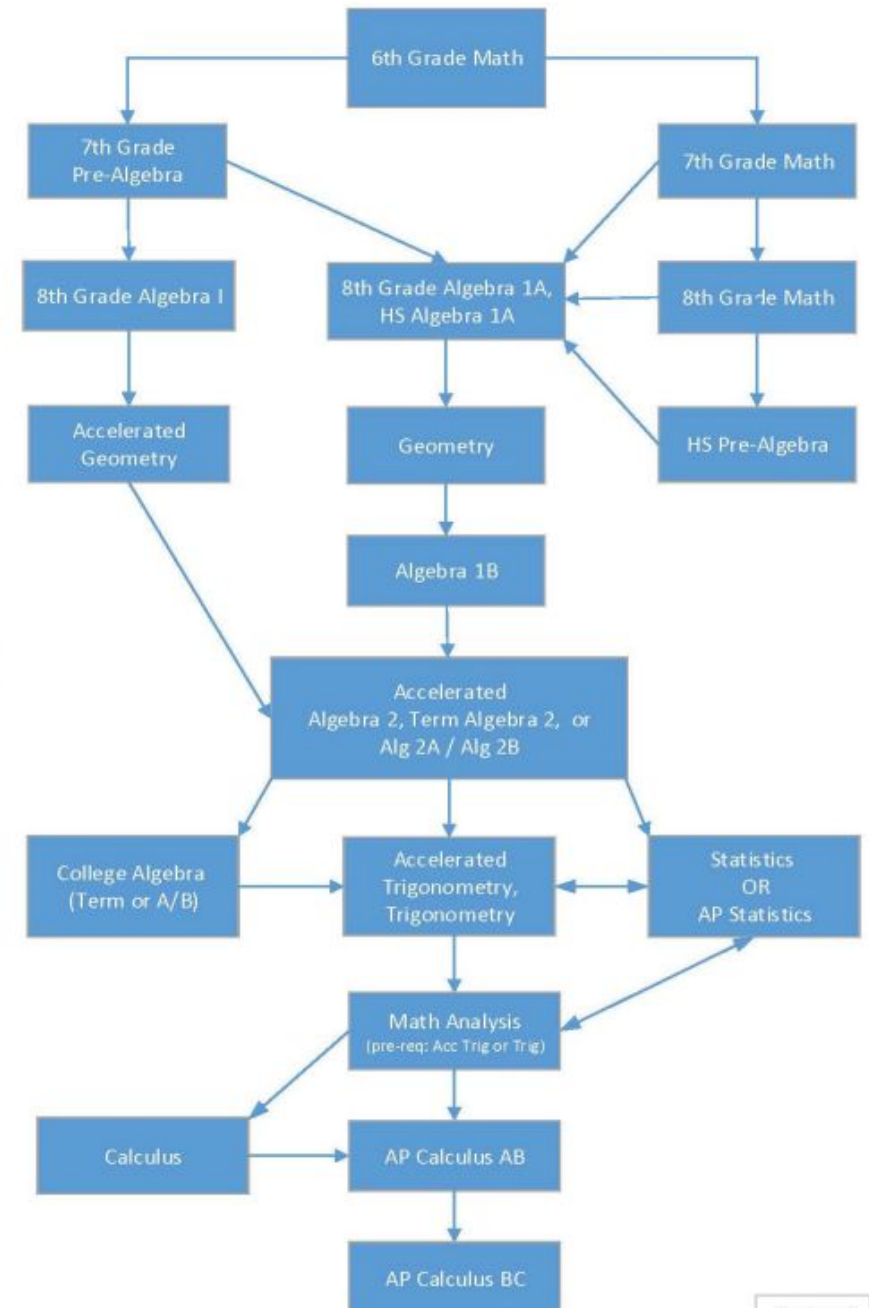
