REMEMBER To	Sounds Like
Be respectful of others in the discussion.	<ul> <li>That is a good idea because</li> <li>Although you make an excellent point,         I think that</li> <li>I understand what you mean, but I think that</li> <li>Another way to think about that is</li> <li>I have a different idea about that because</li> <li>I want to respectfully disagree with that idea because</li> </ul>
Ask questions when you don't understand a topic.	<ul> <li>Could you clarify your statement?</li> <li>What did you mean when you said?</li> <li>What led you to that conclusion?</li> <li>Where did you see that in the chapter?</li> <li>Can you give me another example so I can understand?</li> </ul>
Give evidence to support your statements.	<ul> <li>Here in the text is says</li> <li>My evidence is on page, it says</li> <li>I can connect this to another reading because</li> </ul>
Give a reason why your idea is a good one.	<ul><li>This reminds me of because</li><li>I got this idea from an article we read.</li></ul>
Ask for evidence when something sounds incorrect.	<ul> <li>Can you show me a place in the reading that illustrates that idea?</li> <li>I'm not sure that's correct.</li> <li>Can you tell me why you think that is true?</li> </ul>
Use ideas from others to add to your own. Make a connection to others or other texts.  Make a prediction and think outside the box!	<ul> <li>I agree with because</li> <li>'s idea reminds me of</li> <li>I want to build upon</li> <li>I would like to tie into what just said.</li> <li>I can connect this to</li> <li>I think that will happen because</li> <li>I wonder if</li> </ul>
