

## SECOND HALF SURGE LIFTS IRISH PAST CAPTAINS

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Basketball team got back in the win column with a road win over Waterford Kettering, 70-39. Despite the convincing win, much of the first half was a closely contested game. Each team traded baskets for most of the first and second quarters. The Irish led 12-10 after the first only to see their two point first quarter lead turn into a 25-23 halftime deficit. Notre Dame used the half time break to re-energize and swarmed Kettering on the defensive end in the third quarter. The defense led to easy baskets on the offensive end as the Irish won the third quarter 23-3. The fourth quarter was more of the same with the Irish playing stellar defense, which led to more easy baskets. The Captains were held to 14 second half points, while the Irish scored 47. Sophomore Wade Robinson led the Irish in scoring with 21 points. The duo of Jack Olis and Jon Risi finished with 14 points a piece. Evan Noga had nine for the Irish and Brian Lopez finished with seven.

The Notre Dame Varsity Wrestling team had a strong showing at the Memphis Invitational, going 4-1 with wins over Brown City, Sandusky, Lutheran Northwest, and Memphis. The tournament saw a three-way tie for first place with the Irish placing second on a tiebreak. Nick Meli, Jeronimo Ballesty and Joey Aiello went undefeated with 5-0 records while Evan McGhee and Joey Benenati went 4-1.

#### IRISH KEEP HOME WIN STREAK ALIVE

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Basketball team kept its four-game home win streak alive with a 71-60 victory over Lapeer. The Irish controlled the game from start to finish largely due to the play of senior captain Jack Olis, who had a season-high 32 points on the night. Olis connected on four three-pointers in the win and was a perfect six of six from the foul line. Notre Dame never trailed in the game. The home court advantage for the Irish was on full display as the team made 10 three-pointers in the game (Olis with four, Wade Robinson with three, Jacob Tuttle with two and Brian Lopez adding one). The Irish started off the game strong but Lapeer never let the led game get out of control. Notre Dame was up 16-12 after the first quarter and 34-31 at half time. The Irish played their best basketball in the third quarter. Olis scored 11 points in that quarter alone that helped the Irish secure a comfortable 11 point lead, which ended up being the final margin of victory. Robinson scored 14 of his 16 points in the second half and Tuttle finished with eight points in the victory.

#### IRISH DROP CLOSE MATCH TO BLACKHAWKS

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Bowling team dropped a match to Brandon, 18-12. The Irish fell behind 10-0 heading into individual games. #### GIRLS BOWLING GETS WIN OVER RAVENS
