

CyberPatriot's National Youth Cyber Defense Competition is the world's largest cybersecurity competition and is open to all schools and approved youth organizations. IF YOU TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

January 2022

WHERE TO START




- The date you take a COVID-19 test and it comes back positive but you have no symptoms.
- The date your COVID-19 symptoms start.

IF YOU HAVE <u>NO</u> SYMPTOMS

If you are <u>symptom-free</u> on the <u>fifth day after</u> taking the test that came back positive or you have <u>no COVID-19 symptoms on the</u> <u>morning of your fifth day</u> after the onset of symptoms, you can return to work or school that day.





IF YOU HAVE SYMPTOMS

If your symptoms are still present on Day 5, you must stay out of school or your work building for an additional five days.
