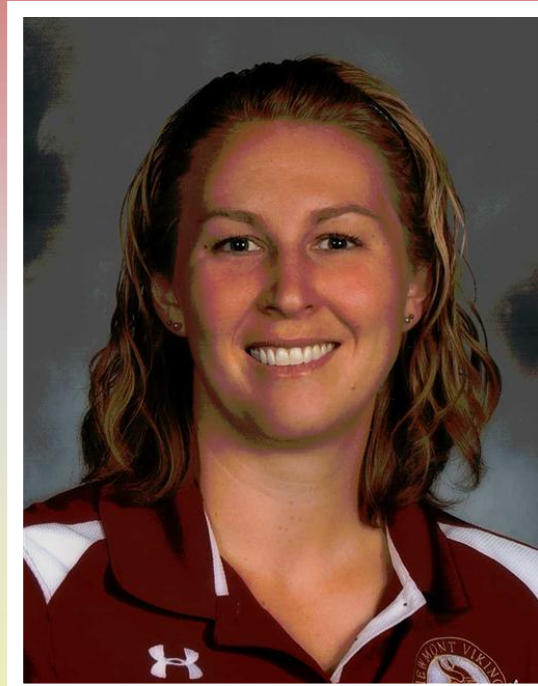

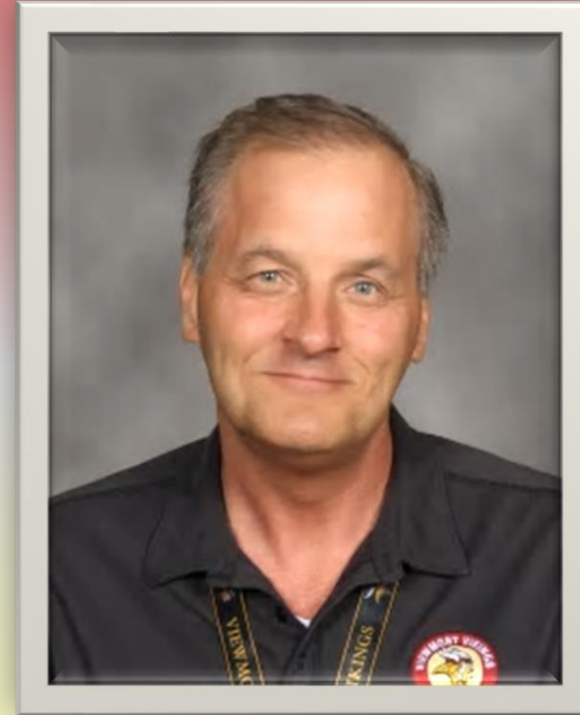

- More – Master's or Doctorate Degree

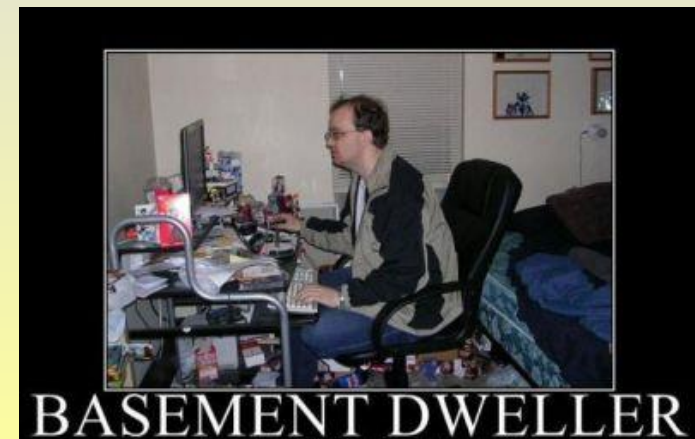


Viewmont Graduates and College

CE vs AP

AP (Advanced Placement)

- Pass the end of year test for college credit
- No affect on college GPA
- Teachers have grading flexibility (giving extra credit)
- Selective colleges give admission points and higher scholarships to students taking AP

CE (Concurrent Enrollment)

- Pass the class with a C or better
- Affects college GPA
- Teachers have **little** grading flexibility (giving extra credit)

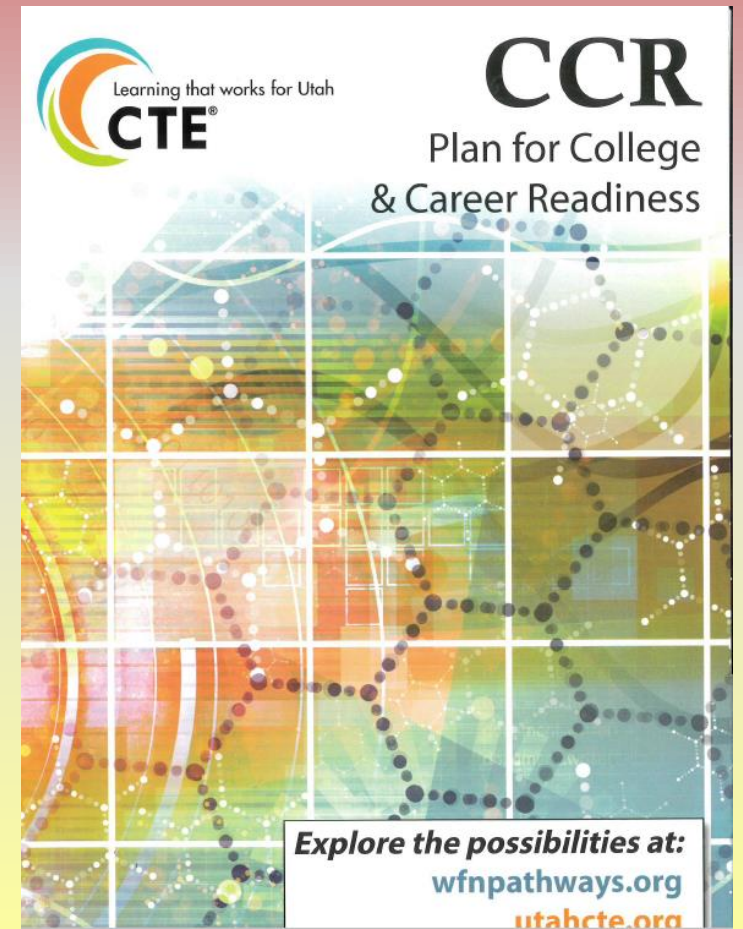

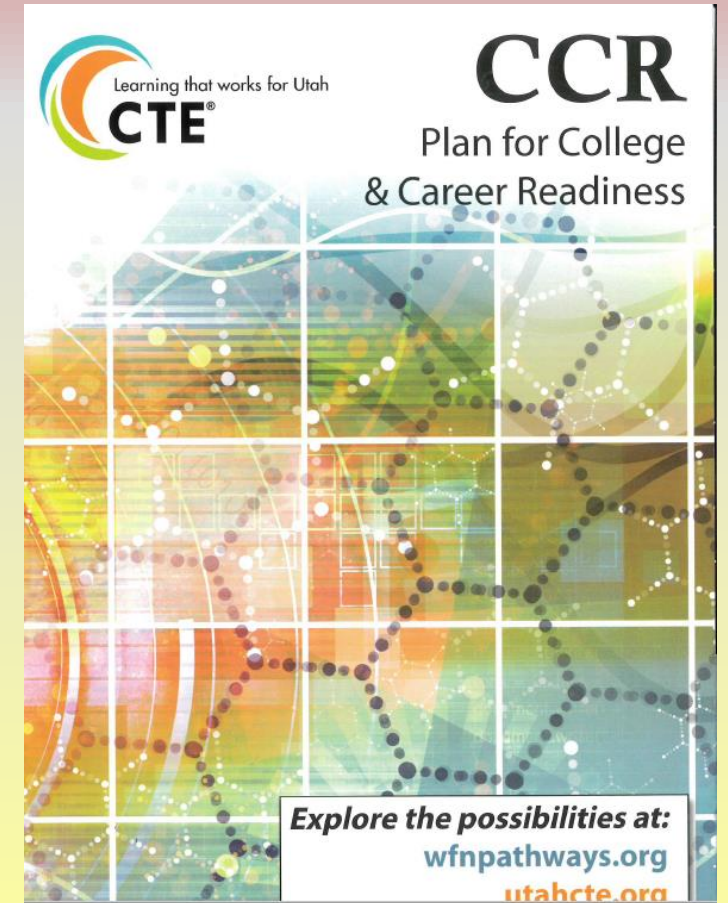
