What you need to know

Virtual Parent Teacher Conferences



Centaurus parent teacher conferences will be held on Thursday, February 10 and Wednesday, February 16. Teachers will email details, including the sign up link, to guardians Monday, February 7. You may <u>use these instructions to sign up for a conference slot</u> most convenient to you.

If you are satisfied with your students' progress in class, do not feel compelled to sign up for a conference. We have a limited amount of conference appointments available, and these conferences really are for parents and teachers to discuss students who need additional support in the class or if you have specific issues or questions that you want to address. If your student is doing great in the class and you have no issues to discuss, do not schedule a conference. Also, if you just have a quick question for a teacher, please feel free to send them an email directly.

Attendance Reminders



Earlier in January, our admin team met with all Social Studies classes to renorm attendance, tardy, and cell phone policies. For reference, here is a link to our<u>Attendance Policies and Procedures</u>, which is provided online under Student Handbook in both English and Spanish.

Attendance FAQ:

Why is my student saying they were in class, but marked absent?

• Our attendance policy states that students who arrive within the first five minutes are tardy, but after five minutes will be marked absent. If the

student does arrive after the first five minutes, the time of arrival is logged by the teacher.

- This allows for parents to be notified of excessive tardy behavior or as an early intervention for possible detrimental truant behaviors.
- When a student misses a chunk of instructional time, educational gaps are created. For instance 5 minutes a day = 20 minutes a week or 80 minutes a month of missed instructional time
- It is important that students understand that getting to class is the first order of importance, regardless of how late.
- Our attendance goal is to steer students away from excessive tardiness and truancy, so they can develop better habits for their post-secondary pathways, like full-time employment.
- Students will receive Mandatory Academic time for absences in order to remediate the missed academic time.
- A teacher will be present to help steer them to the appropriate content and CU tutors will be available to provide one-to-one if needed.

Will COVID impact the five days each semester that I can excuse my student?

- No, your five days will not be impacted by COVID. This will be automatically excused by the school.
- Per our Policy, Pre-arranged are also not counted toward the five
- Per our Policy, Documentation absences will also not count
- Activities are automatically excused by the school.
