African Americans have made, and continue to make, significant contributions to flight and space exploration, often despite overwhelming obstacles. **Dr. Vance Marchbanks, Jr**. is an example in both the black history and aerospace history communities for his accomplishments as one of the first in his field. He was one of two black MDs to complete the United States Army Air Corps School in Aerospace Medicine at the beginning of World War II. His fame continued through his association with the 99th and 301st Fighter Groups, who later became known as the Tuskegee Airman. He served as their flight doctor during the war.
