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MISSION

'Iolani School is a coeducational, college-preparatory school for grades K-12 founded upon Christian principles. Its mission is to develop liberally educated, well-rounded individuals who are well prepared for higher education and for responsible, moral citizenship.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Founded in 1863 at the request of King Kamehameha IV and Queen Emma, 'Iolani School has grown to become an independent, college-preparatory day and boarding school in Honolulu, Hawai'i related historically to the Episcopal Church.

- » 2,170 students, with 1,495 in grades 7-12, including 99 boarding students
- » Average class size: 16
- » 250 Faculty and Administrators
- » 81% of Upper School faculty hold advanced degrees (14% doctorate)
- » 25 acre campus in Honolulu (O'ahu population: 975,000)
- » \$7.0 million awarded in financial aid
- » \$75.1 million annual operating budget, \$244.1 million endowment
- » Highly selective admission process
- » Vibrant performing arts program with 66% of Upper School students participating each year
- » 72% of Upper School students participate on at least one of 110 athletic teams
- » 100% of graduates accepted at four-year colleges
- » Accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges

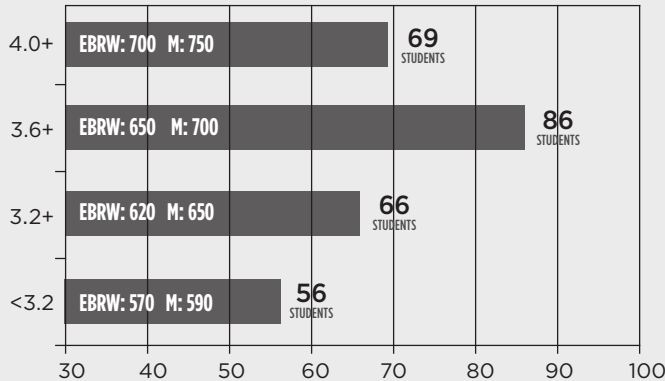

In 2021, 1,097 AP Examinations were written, with

- 48% earning scores of 5,
- 78% earning scores of 4 or 5, and
- 95% earning passing scores of 3, 4, or 5.
- 236 students were recognized as AP Scholars
- 123 students were named AP Scholars with Distinction

‘Iolani School’s Response to COVID-19

Thanks to a robust PPE policy (face masks and face shields), regular testing, and distanced and outdoor gathering spaces, ‘Iolani was able to conduct the 2020-21 school year in person after beginning the year in distance learning. Traditional athletics competitions were extremely limited however, as were traditional performances.

The school has a COVID-19 vaccination mandate (with religious exceptions) for faculty and staff and students in the Upper School. Continued challenges posed by the pandemic include:

- Financial hardship across the islands – in response the school increased the financial aid budget and awarded aid to more families (28% of all families now receive financial assistance)
- Streamlining of course offerings to maximize space utilization
- Limited travel opportunities

COLLEGE ATTENDANCE — FOUR YEAR HISTORY

Members of the Class of 2021 have enrolled at 114 colleges around the world. 99% are attending four-year colleges. 79% attend college in the continental U.S., 6% in other countries, and 15% in Hawai'i.
