Maths

Wider Curriculum

This week in our Design and Technology lessons, we will be learning about 3D structures and how they stay up. We will then design and make our own 3D post box for the Jolly Postman.

Sounds Write

This week we will continue looking at the extended code.

We will continue to explore the /u/ sound and the different ways to spell the sound; o, u, and ou.
