

1952, 53 & 54 Baseball Teams

The 1952 league champions (12-1) were the first team in Mynderse history to win a sectional title. Led by captain Rich Addona, the team had a tight defense and outstanding pitching anchored by John Pannucci. Cy Garnsey received the MVP and best hitter awards. Coach Masterson was assisted by managers Palendro and Peone.

The 1953 team also won the league and sectional titles. They are the only baseball team in Mynderse history to go undefeated (16-0) capturing the sectional crown. The team was lead by ace right-hander and captain, John Pannucci. The captain earned MVP and highest batting average awards. Coach Scutt was assisted by manager Joe Peone and Bill Cologgi.

The 1954 team also won sectionals and enabled the Mynderse squad to become the first team in school history to earn a "Three-Peat". Coached by Mauro Spennachio and Ray Bullis with Bill Cologgi as manager, they completed the third and final season of three



sectional wins in a row. Captain Bruno Lombardo earned the MVP and highest batting average awards. Coach Ray Winthrop contributed by coaching all three JV baseball squads during the record setting run.

"Tales From The Past" Saint Patrick's Panthers By John Capacci

Beginning in 1950 under the coaching leadership of men like Geno Giovannini and Chipper Vergamini, with the full support of Pastor John P. O'Beirne and Asst. Pastor Thomas Kane, St. Patrick's Parochial School in Seneca Falls began offering organized team sports in football and baseball to St. Patrick's students. Basketball was offered several years later. The basketball team played in the school room hall until the current gymnasium was built in approximately 1953.

During the approximate ten year period from 1950-1960, the St. Patrick's Panthers played football, basketball and baseball against other catholic schools in the area and anyone else who had a team. Geno Giovannini is also credited with establishing a Mynderse Academy Junior High football program during this same period. Some of the former players remember traveling to Aquinas Stadium in Rochester to play a football game against Rochester area catholic schools prior to a an Aquinas High School game.

The Panthers competed in the Rochester Diocesan tournaments in baseball and basketball – winning league and diocesan titles. St. Patrick's football and baseball ended around 1954 with the advent of Pop Warner and Vince Lombardi football, as well as with the establishment of Little League Baseball in Seneca Falls.

The success of the St. Patrick's athletic program provided the first organized football, basketball and baseball experience for many St. Patrick's students. These programs coupled with the Kiwanis Grasshopper baseball program, established a "feeder" system for many athletes entering Mynderse

Academy athletics.

Rumors still abound to this day that the St. Patrick's football team ran the same offense and defense used by the Mynderse Academy varsity squad. It was also noted that Mynderse Academy Athletic Hall of Fame coach George Davis would attend St. Patrick's games on Sunday at the K of C field and would "suggest" plays and position changes to the St. Patrick's coaches.

The photo shows the 1954 St. Patrick's Panther Football team. Many of the players on this team, Bobby Spano, Bill Crough, George Bunce, Vince Piscitelli, Len Colavito, Billy Burns, John Capacci, Jim Delia and George Valesente went on to lead Mynderse Academy through its incredible unbeaten league championship run from 1952 through 1960. Several members of that young Panther team also became captains of the Mynderse Varsity Football teams earning All League honors.
