






Underclassmen: Course Registration Meetings



Summer Enrichment 2022



The Summer Enrichment Information and Registration Packet is now available for any student interested in taking a summer enrichment course (for advancement purposes).

The math courses offered through PHS include: Algebra 2, Geometry, College Algebra, and Precalculus, and all will run in an online format. While students will have a PHS Math Teacher as a facilitator, work is done through the online program, Edgenuity, and requires approximately 4 - 6 hours of time per day as these are full-year courses offered at an accelerated rate that are completed in approximately six weeks. The cost is \$450 per course.






Flu Season Guidelines

The Flu Season continues to be in full swing through April and this season is complicated by the pandemic. It is recommended that your student receive their flu vaccine at this time, please check with your doctor. To help stay healthy and decrease the spread of illness in the school, we are encouraging all families to adhere to the following guidelines for sending your child to school.

Please keep your child home from school (even if they have a test or sporting event) if he/she is experiencing any of the following symptoms:

- Fever of 100 degrees or more
- Vomiting/Diarrhea
- Severe head cold
- Persistent cough
- Severe sore throat

These are the same criteria the Health Room uses as a guideline when sending students home ill from school. **Students should not return to school until they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications.**

Immunization Requirement




The meningitis vaccine is required on or after your student's 16th birthday. Students in grade 11 will be required to have this immunization on the first day of their senior year. The eleventh grade physical is a good time to be sure this immunization is completed.

Sophomores

All students in grade 10 will soon receive paperwork for completing their mandated physical for the eleventh grade. This can be done at the time your student gets their physical for their driver's permit but may not be completed before July 1, 2021.

The form for the school physical you receive is the preferable paperwork to be completed. However, copies of the physical forms used for the driver's permit are accepted for the student's school physical. Please return the choice form to the Health Room as soon as possible to indicate how the physical will be completed. Forms are available on the PHS website.

Driver's Education



Talk to Your New Driver about the Basics of Winter Driving

Slow Down

It is harder to control or stop your vehicle on a slick or snow-covered surface. In 2019, there were an estimated 182,000 police-reported crashes that occurred in wintry conditions. On the road, increase your following distance enough so that you will have plenty of time to stop for vehicles ahead of you.

Do not Crowd a Snow Plow or Travel Next to the Truck

Snow plows travel slowly, make wide turns, stop often, overlap lanes, and exit the road frequently. If you find yourself behind a snow plow, stay far enough behind it and use caution if you pass the plow.

What to Do in an Emergency

If you are stopped or stalled in wintry weather, stay focused on yourself and your passengers, your car, and your surroundings.

- * Stay in your car and do not overexert yourself.
- * Let your car be seen. Put bright markers on the antennae or windows and keep the interior dome light on.
- * Be mindful of carbon monoxide poisoning. Make sure your exhaust pipe is clear of any snow and run your car only sporadically — just long enough to stay warm. Do not run your car for long periods of time with the windows up or in an enclosed space.

Stock Your Vehicle

Carry items in your vehicle to handle common winter driving-related tasks, and supplies you might need in an emergency, including:

- * A snow shovel, broom and ice scraper.
- * Abrasive material (sand or kitty litter), in case your vehicle gets stuck in the snow.
- * Jumper cables, flashlight, and warning devices (flares and emergency markers).
- * Blankets for protection from the cold.
- * A cell phone and charger, water, food, and any necessary medicine.

Gas Up or Plug It In

Keep your gas tank close to full whenever possible.






Driver Education is a Mandatory Course for Graduation from Parkland High School


This artifact in our archives prompted some research.




