

Coast Unified School District Transition to Trustee Areas

Transition Process

Step	Description
Two pre-draft hearings: August 12, 2022 September 9, 2022	Held prior to the release of draft plans. Purpose was to educate on the process and to solicit input on the neighborhoods and communities of interest in the district.
Release draft plans: January 6, 2022	Draft plans posted to the district website. All draft plans must be posted at least 7 days prior to the first post-draft hearing.
Two post-draft hearings: January 13, 2022 February 10, 2022	Purpose is to present, discuss, and, if necessary, revise the draft plans, and to discuss the election sequence.
Plan adoption: February 10, 2022	Plan adopted via resolution. Final plan must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.

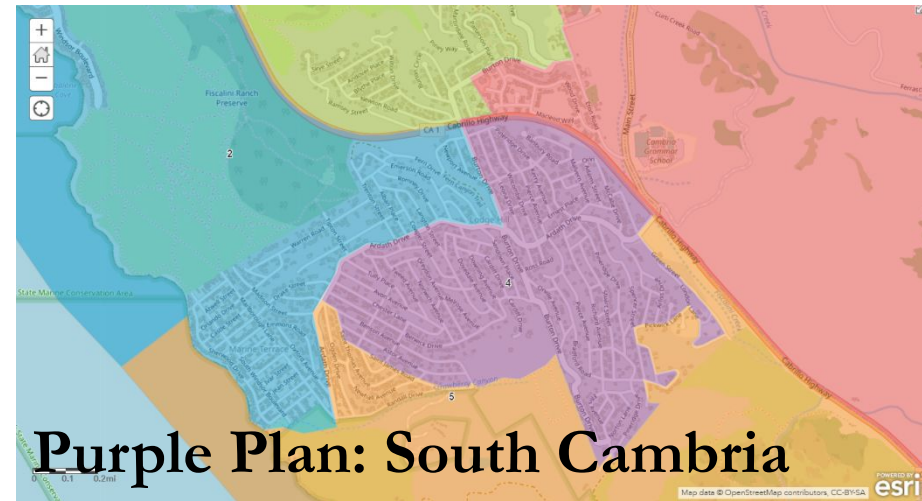
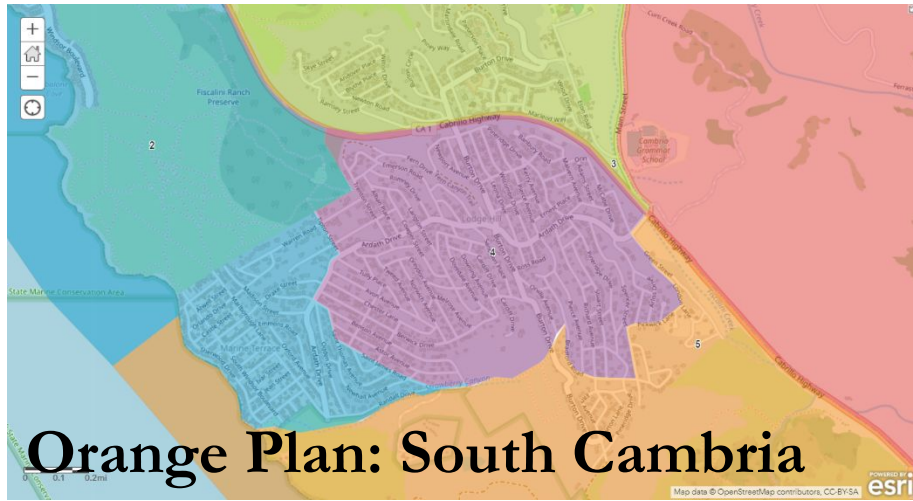
Traditional Principles

Trustee Area	Orange Plan	Purple Plan
1	2022 (Mettier)	2024 (Silva)
2	2022 (McFarland)	2022 (McFarland)
3	2024 (Shalhoub)	2022 or 2024? (Mettier & Shalhoub)
4	2024 (Stephenson)	2024 (Stephenson)
5	2024 (Silva)	2022 or 2024 (vacant)

(There must be two trustee areas up in 2022 and three in 2024)
