Notre Dame Preparatory School and

Marist Academy is a co-educational, Pre-K through 12th grade Catholic school in Southeast Michigan. Cardinal Adam Maida, archbishop of Detroit, invited the Marist Fathers and Brothers to sponsor a school in Oakland County in 1994. Nestled on a 100-acre campus in Pontiac, Mich., the school currently is in its 28th year.

NOTE: In March 2020, with the onset of the pandemic, NDPMA transitioned to online learning. During virtual learning, students continued with their college prep curriculum. Teachers hosted Zoom classroom meetings and lessons, and students accessed their assignments online through PowerSchool Learning. Classes continued on an eight-day rotating schedule and students were responsible for course work in five classes each day.

FACULTY

One-hundred eight (108) faculty members educate 1,024 students across three distinct but coordinated academic divisions: Notre Dame Lower School (Pre-K through 5), Notre Dame Middle School (6-8), and Notre Dame Preparatory School (9-12). Three out of four hold a postgraduate degree.

SCHEDULE

For the 2021-2022 school year, Notre Dame Prep students will be following an A/B rotating schedule. Four of eight classes meet each day for eighty minutes.

CURRICULUM

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

Notre Dame was the first Catholic high school in Michigan authorized as an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School and the first Catholic school in the United States to offer the IB curriculum at all grade levels. Students may pursue the two-year IB Diploma Programme or continue with other collegepreparatory courses. Twenty-eight (28) out of 31 student candidates earned an IB diploma in 2021.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Beginning in 10th grade, students may choose from 13 Advanced Placement (AP) courses in an array of disciplines. In 2021, 344 students took 657 exams; 321 earned a 3 or higher; 73 were named an AP Scholar or better.
