

Adams 12 Five Star Schools developed a level system to help identify and provide appropriate interventions to address student misconduct. While every attempt will be made to maximize the time that students are engaged in the learning process, schools should select interventions that support students and maintain an orderly and safe learning environment.

Discipline of students with disabilities: Schools should review and be familiar with the district's <u>Students with Disabilities Reference</u> before undertaking discipline of students with disabilities (IEP or 504 plans). Note: The information below is intended to be a guide for staff members to teach and correct behavior. Lesser consequences are always permitted. Repeated acts of misconduct, more serious misconduct and/or extenuating circumstances may warrant a higher-level response.

LEVEL 1

Level 1 violations will generally be addressed by the staff member supervising the student when the violation occurs. The staff member's response should teach the correct, alternative behavior so that the student can learn from his or her mistake and demonstrate safe and respectful behaviors in the future. Staff members are expected to use a variety of teaching and management strategies some of which may include:

parent/guardian accompanying student to school

LEVEL 2

Level 2 violations will generally result in interventions or disciplinary responses that involve the school administration. These actions aim to correct behavior by stressing the seriousness of the behavior while keeping the student in school.

LEVEL 3

Level 3 violations will generally result in interventions or disciplinary responses that involve the school administration. These actions aim to correct behavior by stressing the seriousness of the behavior and may result in removal (half-day up to five days) from the school environment as well as education opportunities around the behavior.

Alternative to Suspension (ATS) classes may be appropriate for Level 3 infractions, please see the <u>Alternative to Suspension</u> site for a list of classes offered. Generally, one or two days of suspension are taken off when students take advantage of ATS classes.

Learning modules are also an effective alternative for suspension. If you are interested in using a learning module, contact Intervention Services at ext. 4146. Generally, suspension time can be reduced when students are assigned a learning module.

Level 3 infractions can potentially be placed on a Remedial Discipline Plan (RTP) if their behavior rises to a level of being dismissed from school more than three days.

LEVEL 4

Level 4 violations will generally result in interventions or disciplinary responses that involve the school administration and/or Intervention Services. These actions aim to correct behavior by stressing the seriousness of the behavior and may result in removal (half-day up to 365 days) from the school environment, education opportunities around the behavior and/or district level behavior interventions.

Alternative to Expulsion (ATE) consultation with Intervention Services will occur prior to referring a student for expulsion or placing them on an ATE.

Expulsions can range from one day to 365 days.

LEVEL 5

Level 5 discipline infractions require a referral for expulsion. The school will consult with Intervention Services and seek a 10-day suspension and refer the student for expulsion. Intervention Services will seek to provide wrap-around services for the student and his or her family. A case-manager will connect the student with services at Vista View.
