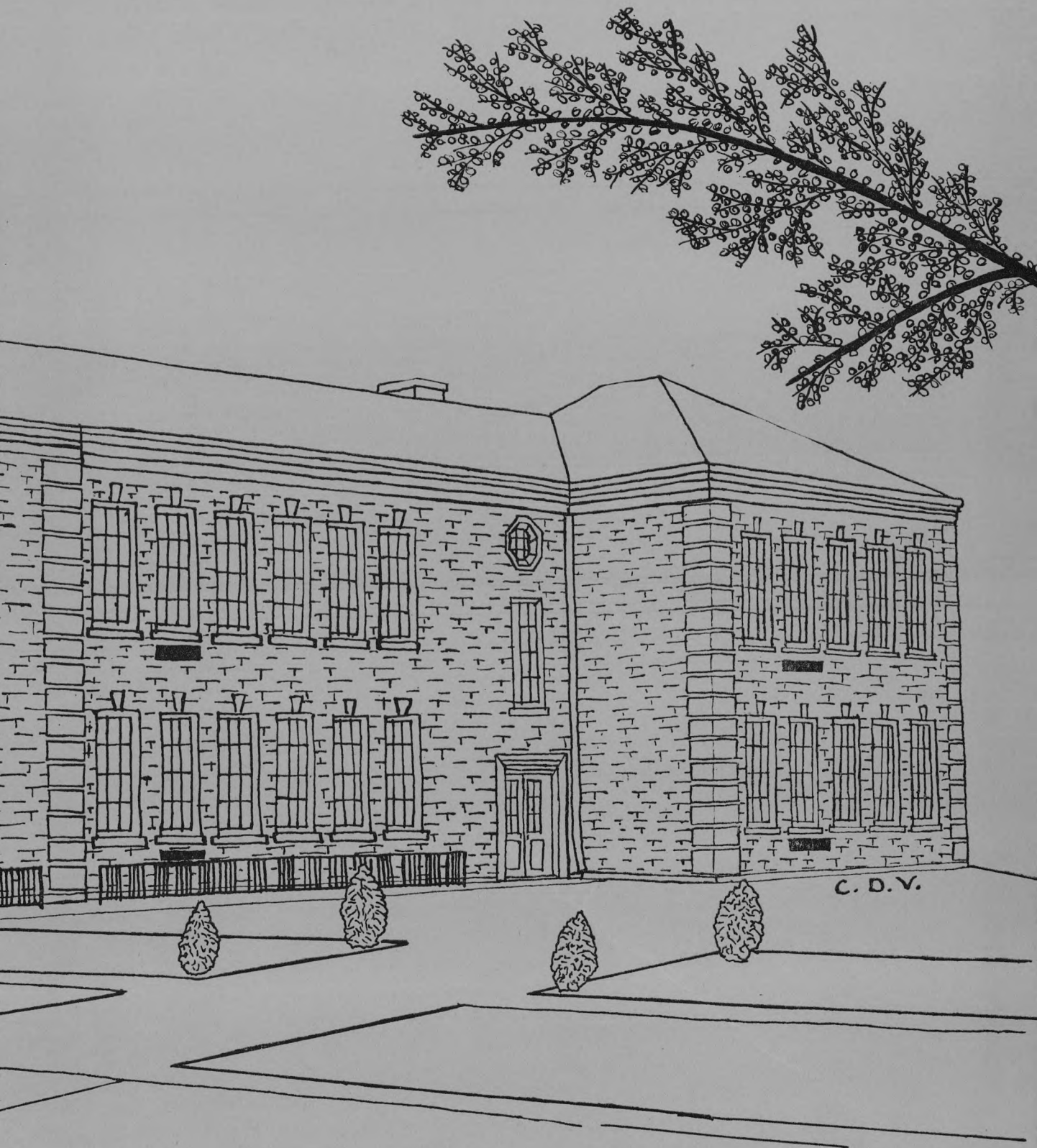

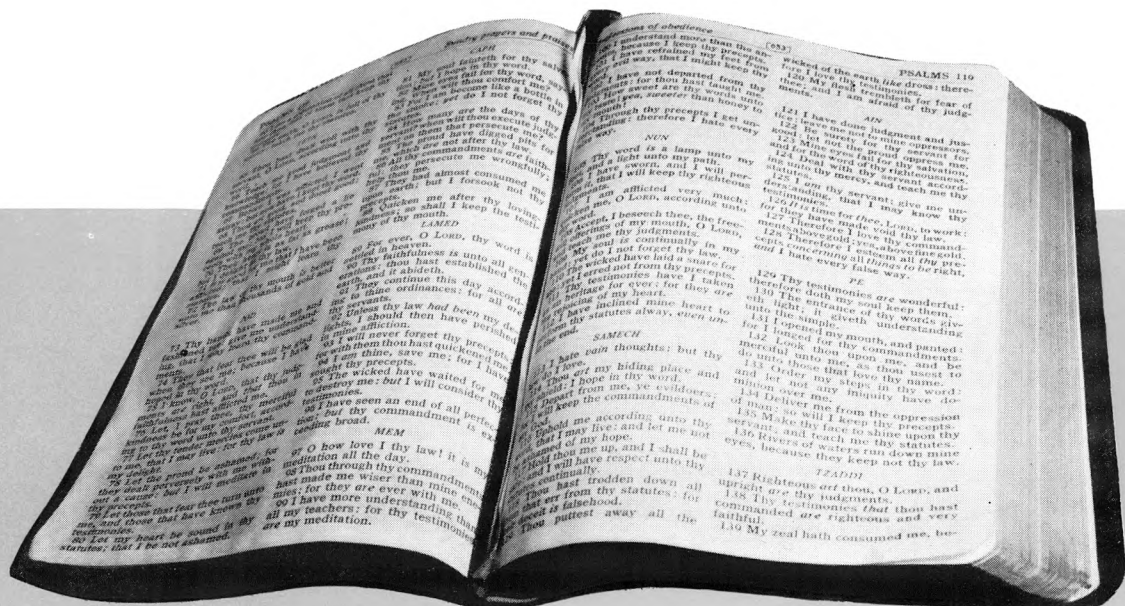

To Him be the praise and glory!*







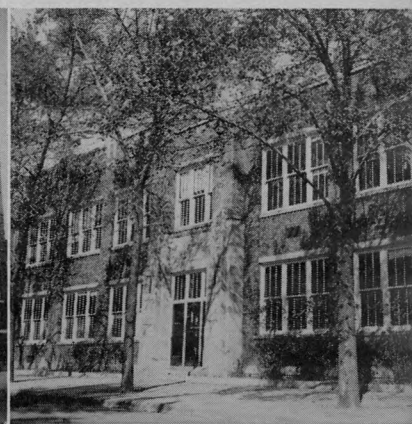
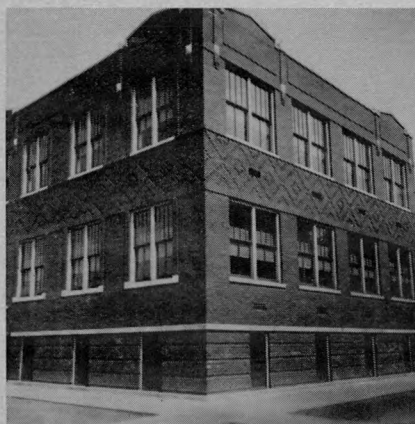

What a week of beauty it was to behold those cherry blossoms, and see God's wonders in nature all about us! To express our joy could never be written in mere words. Then came the rush of banquets: Junior-Senior, Awards, and the Senior Banquet. Much could be written on each one, but we must hasten on to the last mile on our journey which is graduation. On the evening of Friday, June 13th, 1958, thirty-three seniors walked down the aisle of Oak Park Christian Reformed Church to receive their diplomas. 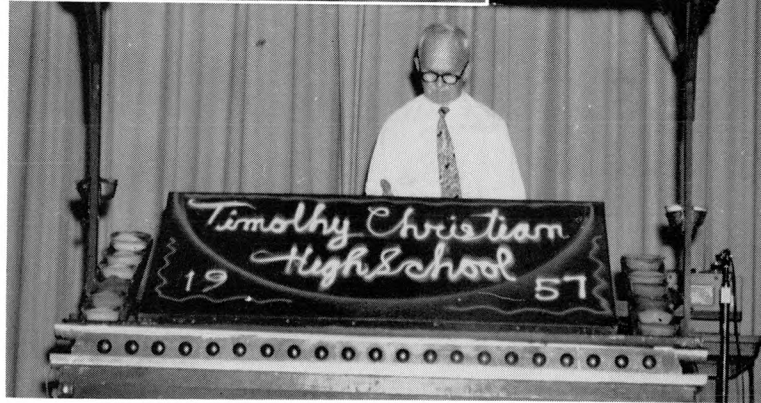
## SPECIAL ASSEMBLIES

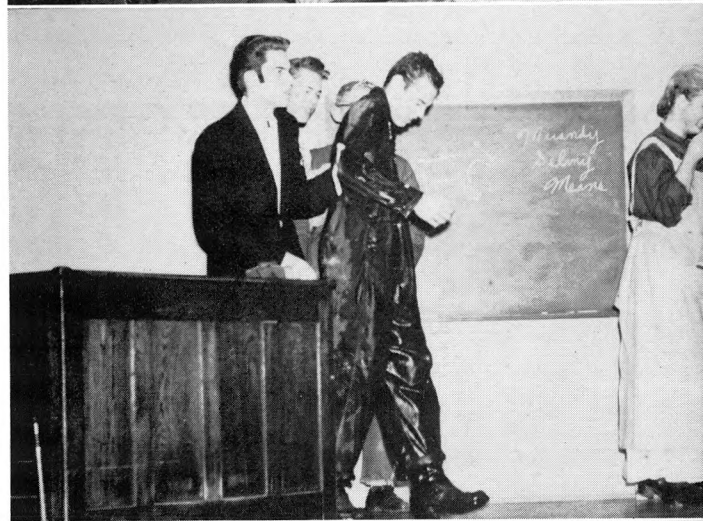
# SENIOR PLAY
