The managers, as usual, have had a busy season. Their efforts in handling the equipment and uniforms has been greatly appreciated by all those connected with the teams.






## INTRAMURALS




## A CAPPELLA CHOIR







The club usually meets during eighth hour in the chemistry lab. Black out curtains were put there to make an effective dark room.


The club is learning how to print and develop pictures. They have also learned how to enlarge pictures. Next year they hope to have a bigger and better club.






