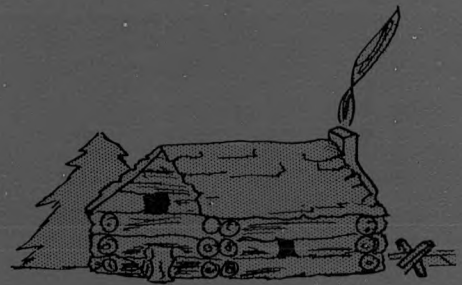

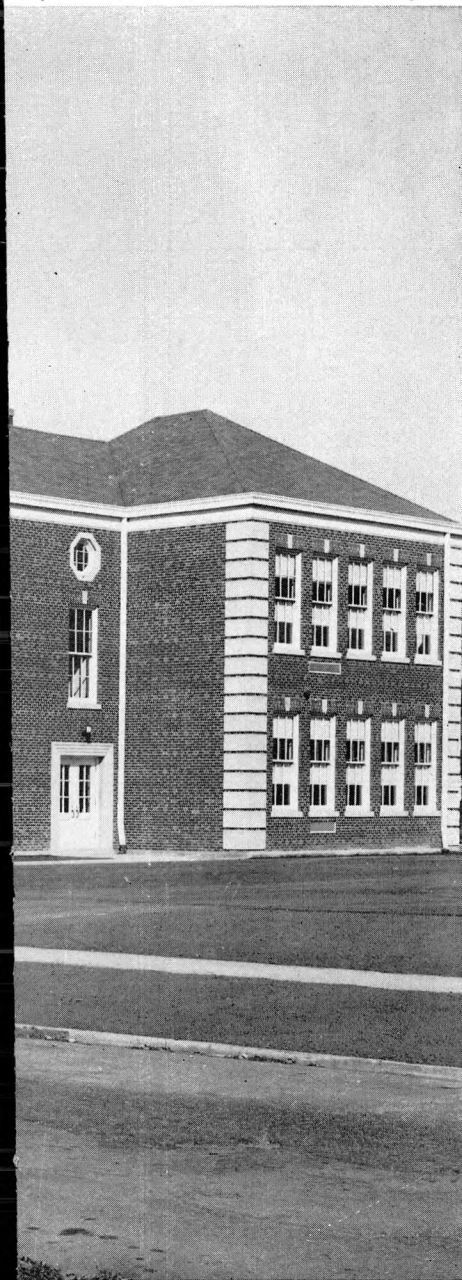

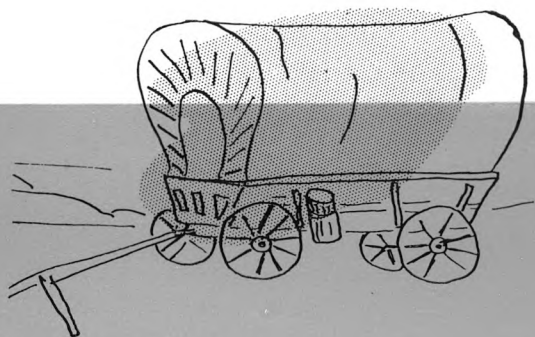

Through our first **Saga** we wish to show you some of our accomplishments during our last school year.

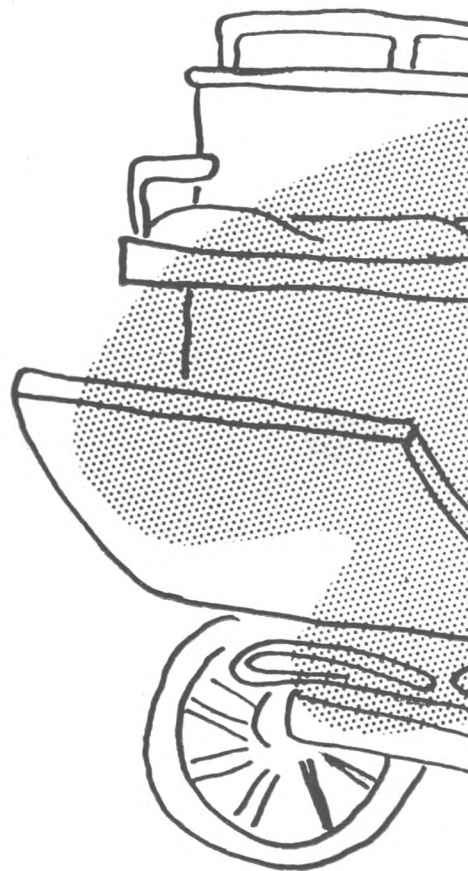


Our staff has worked hard to finish the annual. There were many things that had to be completed — cutting, pasting, drawing, picture taking — so that our SAGA could be finished on time.

Our senior year held even more important activities. We again held class election. Neva Sue Morris retained her position as president, Joyce Bossenga, as treasurer, and Janet Bakker became secretary.

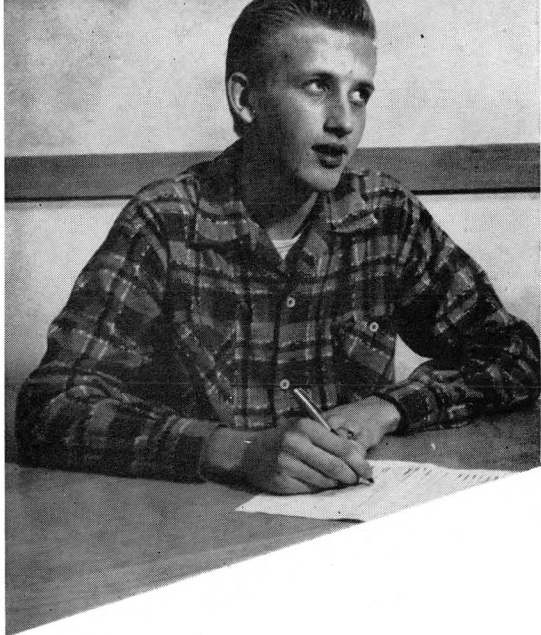
Next, we chose our annual staff, giving every senior a responsible position. We named the annual **Saga**.

I, Ralph Hoekstra, will my bashfulness toward the weaker sex to Roger Steenland.

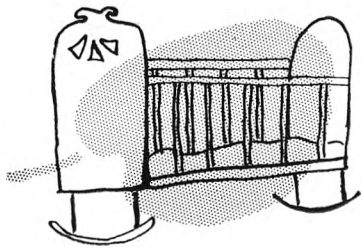
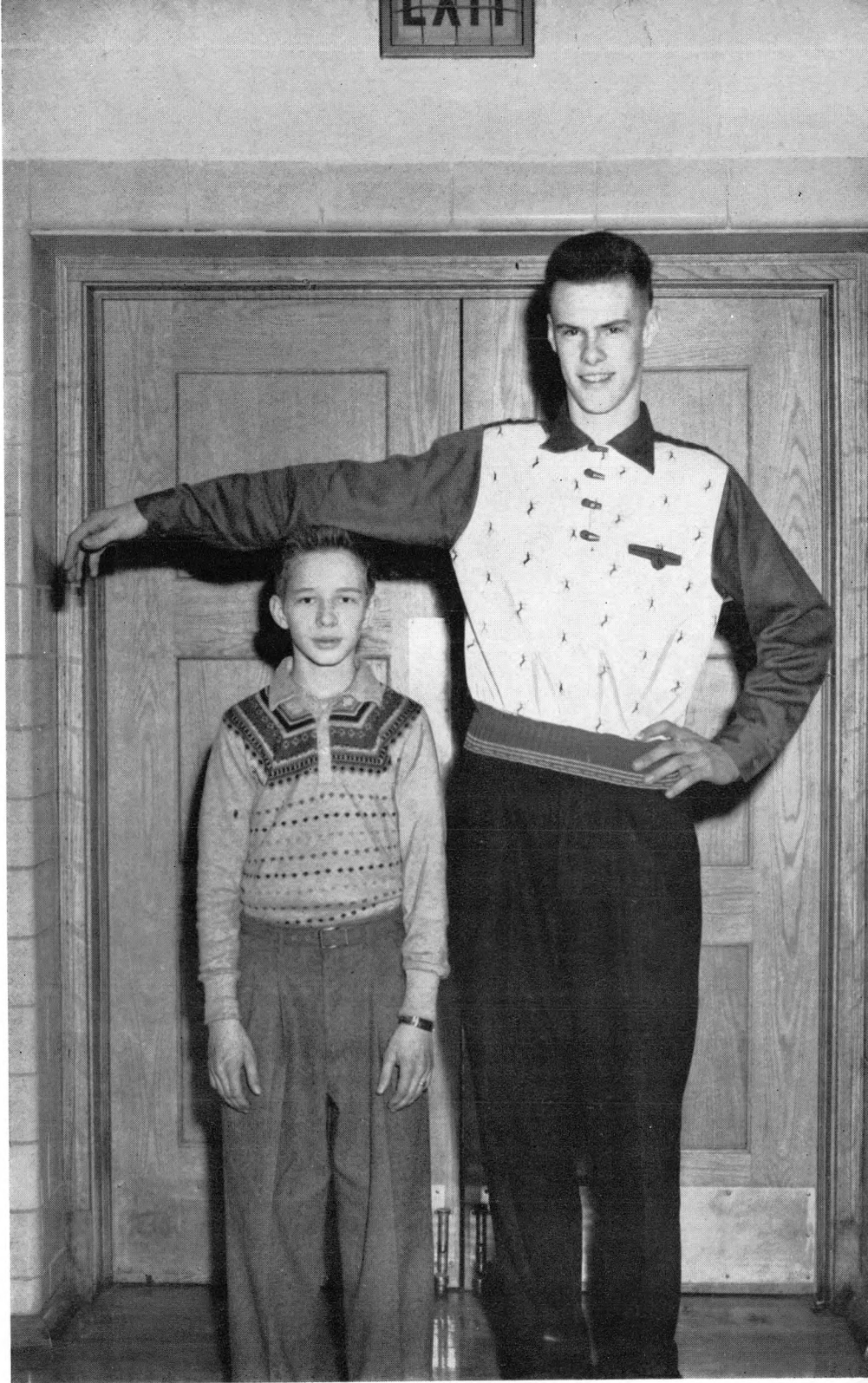

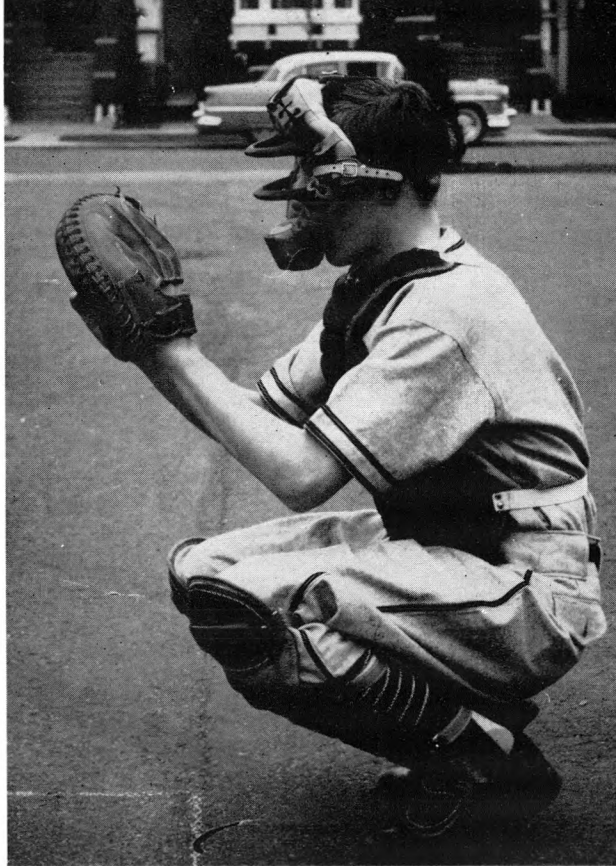


BASEBALL

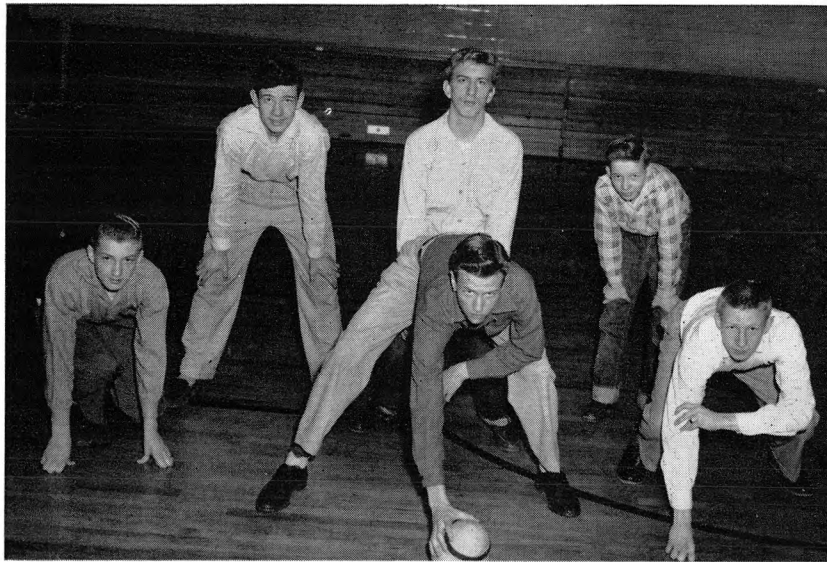

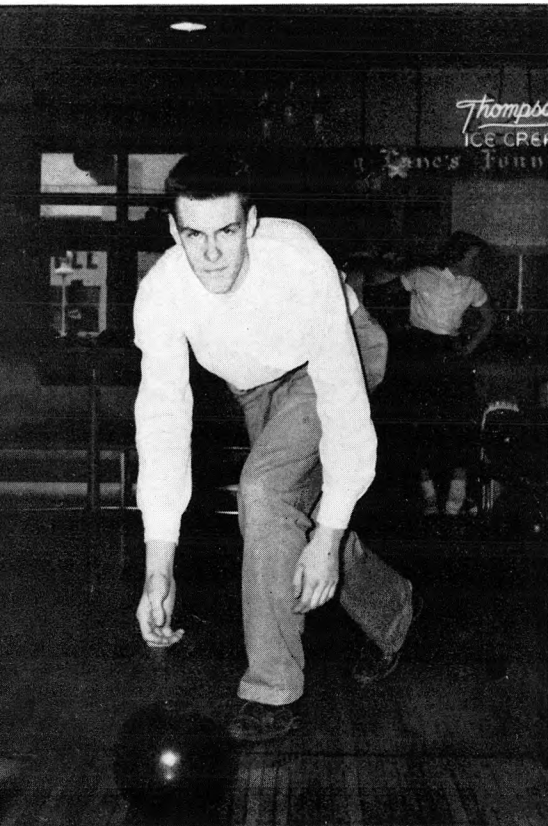

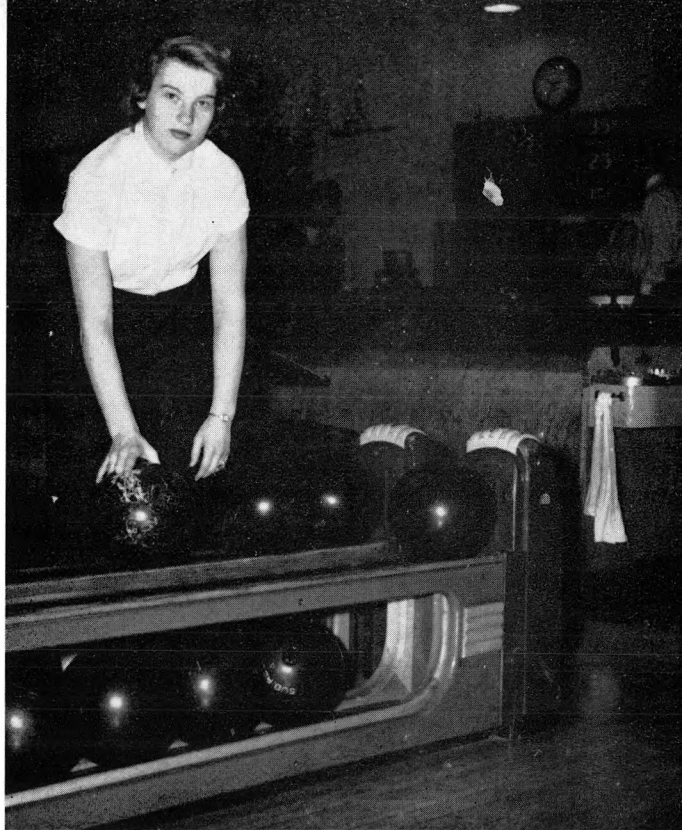
When the practice period was over, many games were played with other schools. As usual, our team made a favorable showing.
