The memory of all these things will linger long in our minds.



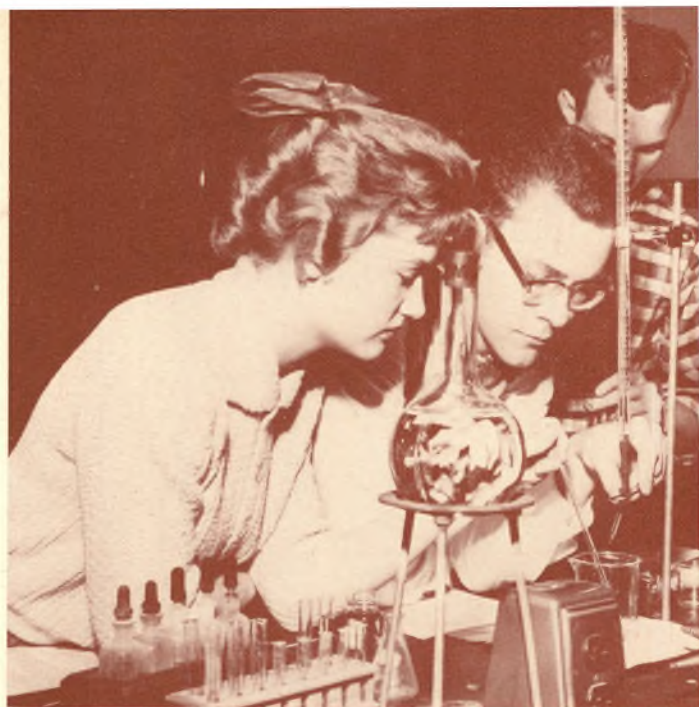

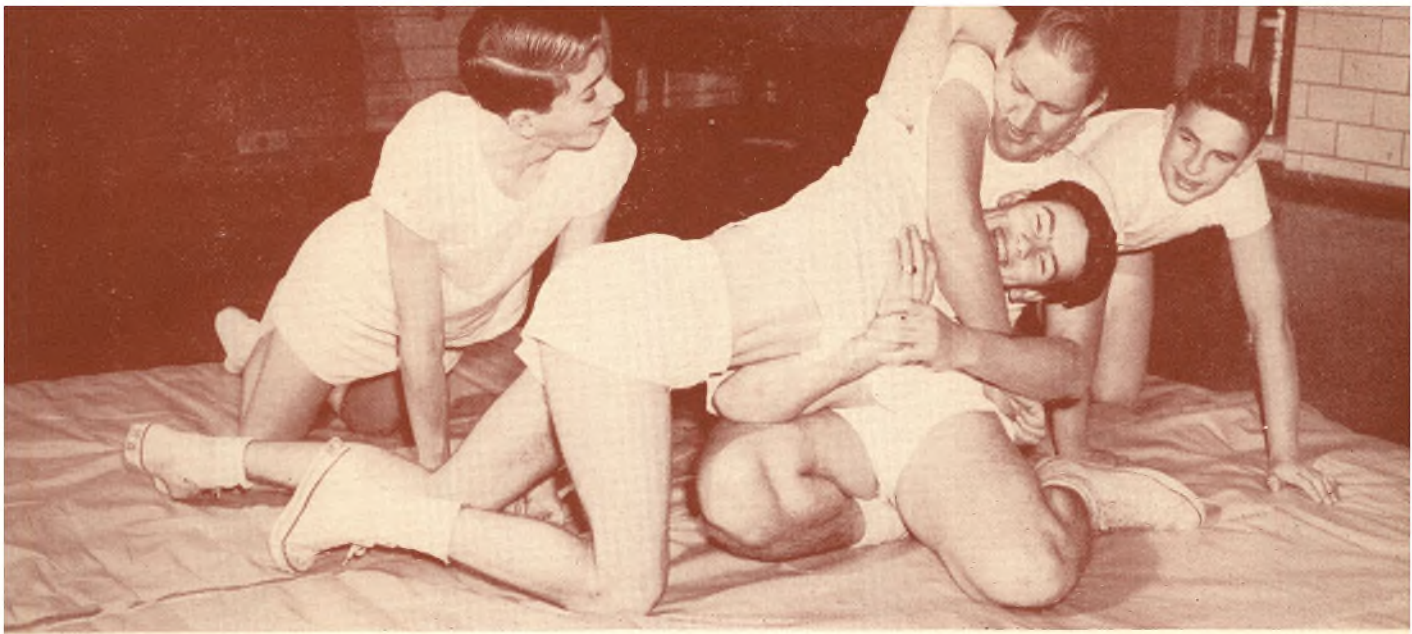

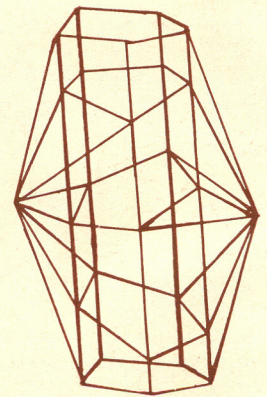

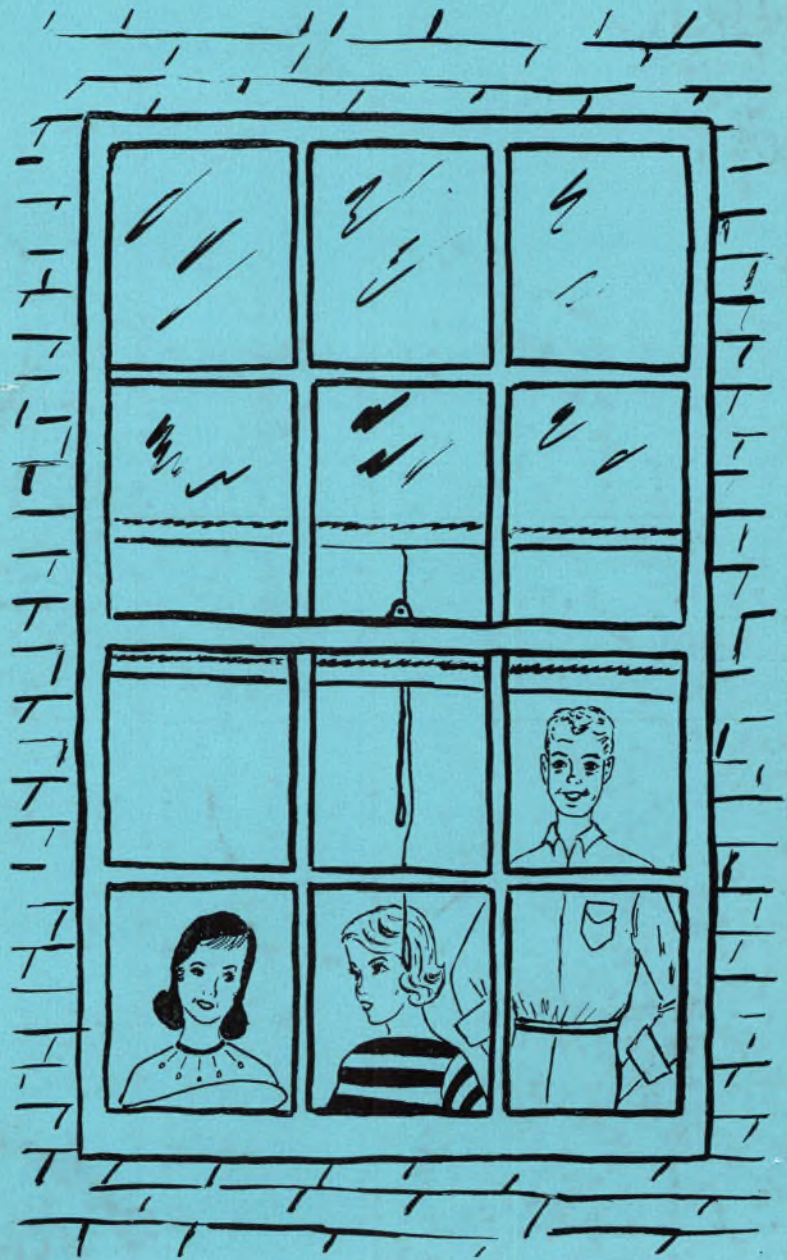

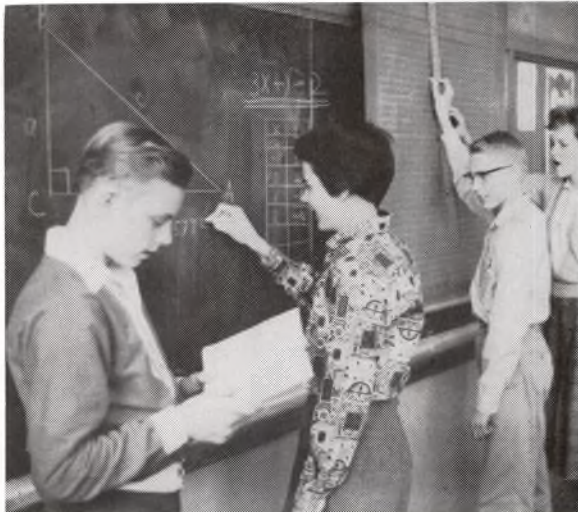

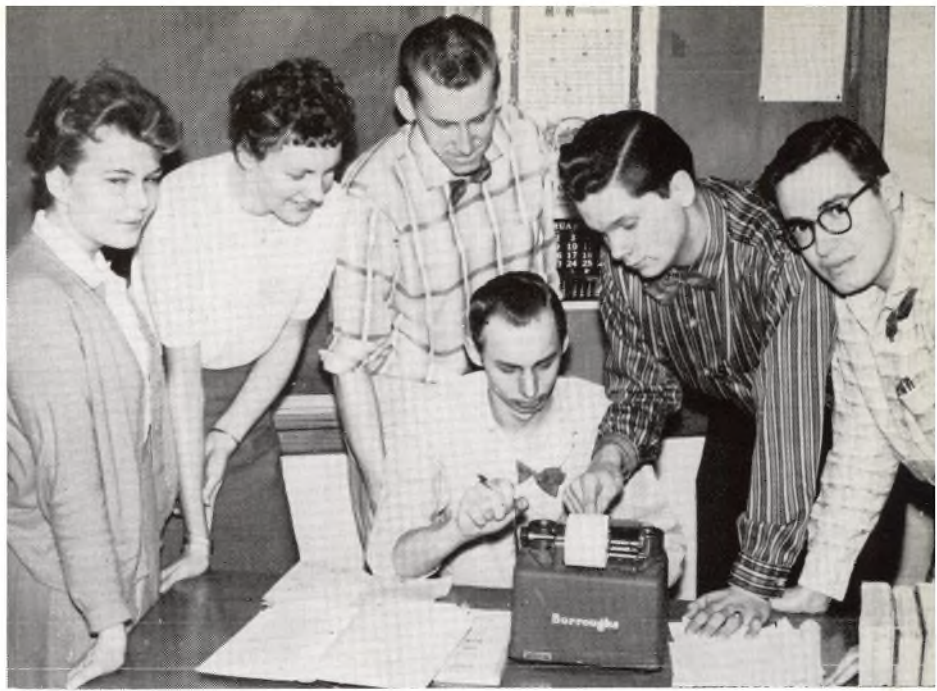

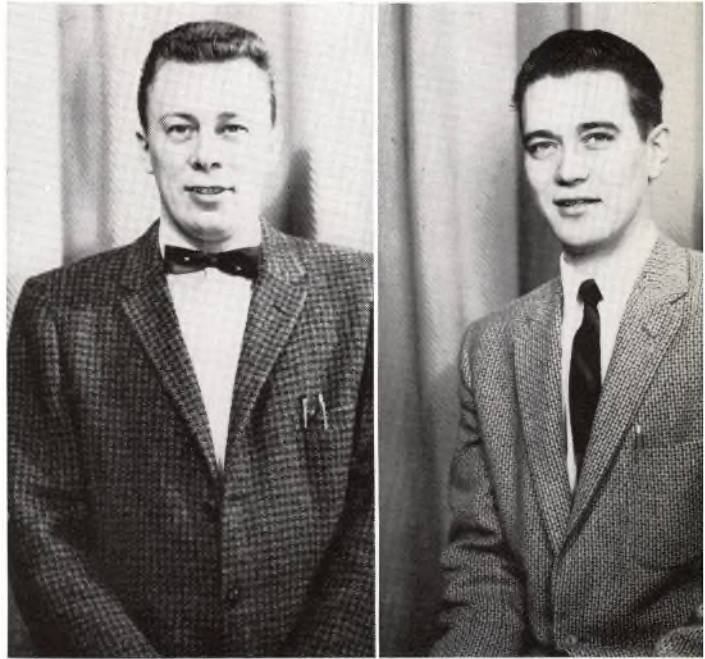
Juniors
