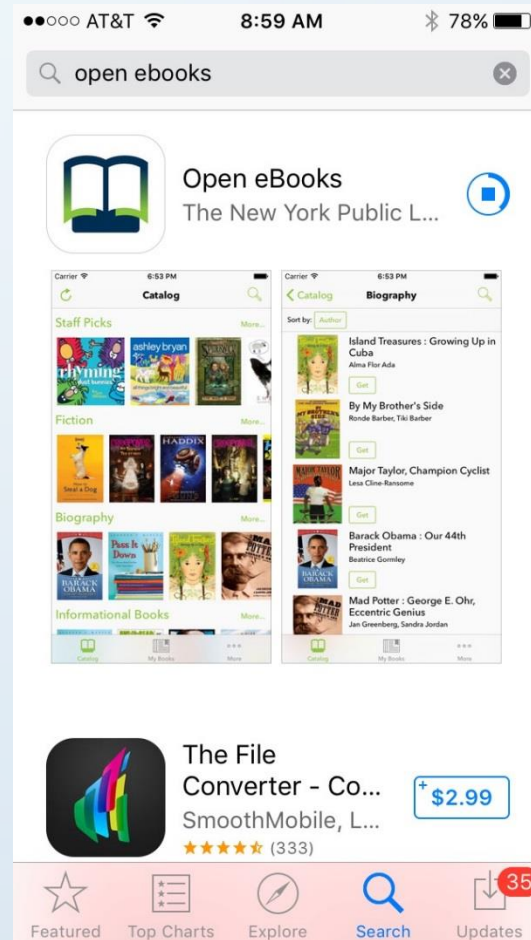
Thousands of eBooks thanks to the federal government and the New York Public Library...

You might be prompted to “Use Existing Code”...choose that. Also choose “Log In With First Book”.

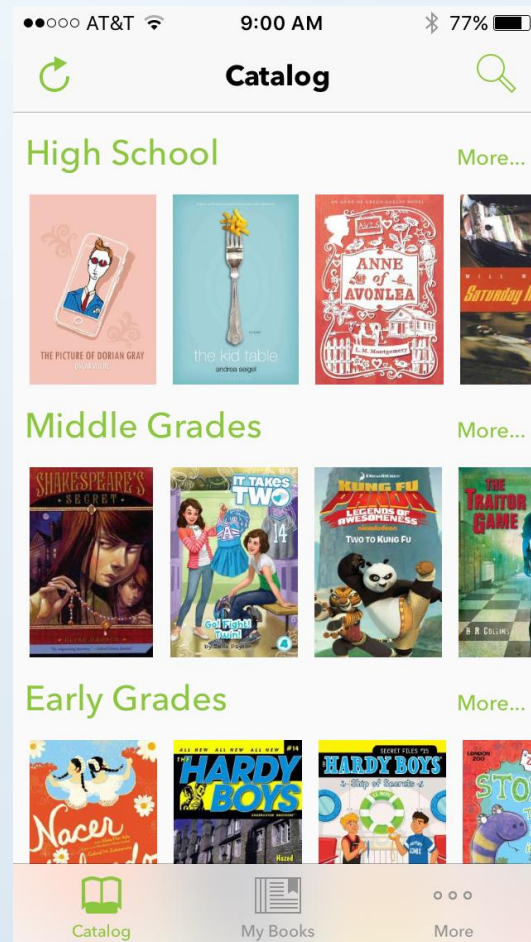
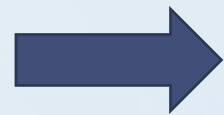
