ACADEMICS

Full-time 10th-12th grade students are enrolled in eight classes for two semesters each school year. Students attend four classes every other day on a block schedule.

Graduation candidates must earn 27 credits in specific academic categories. .25 credit is earned each quarter for each class. Students must also have 35 Citizenship credits for graduation. Unweighted GPA's are calculated using a 4-point scale: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0.
