Day Camp Counselor Job Description

Reports to: Head Counselor

Qualifications:

- 1. Has received Jesus Christ as Savior.
- 2. Is committed to being a servant of God and demonstrates Christian leadership and responsibility.
- 3. Is a minimum of 16 years old.
- 4. Has experience working with children in a ministry setting.

All Camp Staff are responsible for:

- 1. Providing campers with a safe, enriching and rewarding Christian camp experience.
- 2. Developing the spiritual life of campers through conducting themselves in a Christ like manner.
- 3. Striving to maintain unity in Christ with all staff members.

Pre-camp:

- 1. Attending all assigned orientation sessions.
- 2. Being spiritually prepared for camp.
- 3. Being physically prepared for the heavy demands of camp.
- 4. Meeting with the Head Counselor for a pre-camp check in.

In Camp:

- 1. Must arrive at camp no later than 8:00am and leave no earlier than 4:30pm.
- 2. Maintaining a high level of excitement and energy every day.
- 3. Being actively involved and engaged with your campers in all camp activities.
- 4. Being familiar with and obeying all camp rules.
- 5. Providing superior supervision for campers during their daily routines.
- 6. Being a helpful aid to all program staff as need arises or opportunity presents itself.
- 7. Making opportunities to get to know each of your campers on an individual basis.
- 8. Being prepared to share your testimony.
- 9. Meeting with the Head Counselor for a mid-summer evaluation.

Post-camp:

- 1. Returning any issued supplies to the camp office.
- 2. Meeting with the Head Counselor for an end of summer evaluation and thank you.
