If you have access to technology, please make sure to complete your child's Skyward Information related to **School Café**. Please make sure to read through it and sign the receipt page and return it to your child's classroom teacher. Most of our policies stayed the same, except for birthday celebrations. # Library News

## September Sora

Students can checkout digital books through Sora! They read and listen to digital and audio books in any devices online or by downloading the Sora by Overdrive app on Google Play or App Store. They can highlight, look for word definitions, and add notes as they read. It will even track the number of books and number of minutes they spent reading. Students can even access public library digital books for even more titles. This will be a great way to hook your child to read!

#### **Reading Challenge**

Fourth and fifth graders will participate in the Beanstack Reading Challenge. For the first semester, 4th graders' challenge is to read 3,000 minutes while 5th graders challenge is 5,500 minutes. The names of the top ten readers from each grade level will be posted outside the library.

An article from Scholastic written by Benjamin Bergen listed five benefits of reading: 1. They help kids "see". Kids can visualize the story in their heads. 2. Books sharpen the senses. Reading may give kids a richer, deeper experience of the story and possibly even the world. 3. They get kids moving. Running through actions in your mind improves your ability to do the same thing. 4. Books grow brain cells. A study found that after six months of daily reading, the weak spots beefed up so much that the struggling readers' brains looked the same as those of kids with stronger reading skills. 5. They make the heart bigger. Preschoolers who hear more stories get a head start on becoming more empathetic. Make sure to encourage your child to read at home by being a role model to them!
