Notification to Parents of Teacher Qualifications

As a parent/guardian of a student at Westwood, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child, and Federal law requires the school district to provide you this information in a timely manner if you request it. Specifically, you have the right to request the following information about each of your child's classroom teacher:

- Whether the teacher meets the state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grades and subjects s/he teaches.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or provisional status because of special circumstances.
- The teacher's college major, whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if so, their qualifications.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

Our Leader in Me monthly focus for November is Habit 3 *Put First Things First*. This means to decide what is most important and to take care of that first. Thinking about what needs to be done tomorrow or by the end of the week can be overwhelming, especially for children. Learning to think of which things are the most important and taking care of them first allows children (and adults) to be less stressed. If your child uses a planner or weekly log, then he or she has a great organizational tool to *Put First Things First* in writing. By writing down his or her responsibilities and planning ahead last-minute trips to the store, missed events, or missed homework are avoided. Remember, as always modeling this behavior is a great way to teach children.

LEADING THROUGH MUSIC

Ms. Shudra is bringing back our morning music program. If you are a $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ grader and would like to learn how to play an instrument he is providing a voluntary program. His program will be Tuesdays – Thursdays starting at 7:20 am.

NURSE NEWS

Vision and Hearing screenings are well underway in the clinic. Texas law mandates that all kindergarten, first, third and fifth grade students be to be screened each year along with any students new to the district and those suspected of possible deficits.

If during the screening a possible impairment is detected, the student will either be rescreened after two weeks or referred to an eye doctor, ear/nose/throat doctor, and/or pediatrician. For example, a child with excess wax or an ear infection may fail the hearing test but later pass it after medical treatment.

These screening are very important. It is very hard for a child to learn without full use of their eyes and ears. If you receive a referral to have your child evaluated by a specialist, please have them evaluated as soon as possible. If you have any difficulty doing this, please let the nurse or social worker know as soon as possible as we may be able to assist you.

A child may not know they cannot see or hear the world as we do, because they never have. This always reminds me of the book by Dr. Seuss, *I Can Read With My Eyes Shut!*
