

### 2022-2023 CES School Budget Information

The CES operating budget proposal for the 2022-2023 school year will be voted on by Australian ballot on March 1st in the CES gymnasium. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Voting-By-Mail is again strongly encouraged for this election. Ballots will NOT automatically be sent to voters this time - you must request a ballot.

Early voting ballots can be requested by contacting the Town Clerk's Office @ (802) 644-2251, clerk@CambridgeVT.org or by visiting "My Voter Page" at www.mvp.vermont.gov. Ballots can be returned to our new drop box at the top of the stairs at the Town Office building, by mail, or at the polling place on Election Day.

This year's school budget proposal is fairly status quo from the prior year, however it does include funding to hire an additional third grade teacher to accommodate the larger student numbers in our current second grade. Presently we have three second grade classroom teachers and two third grade classroom teachers. Next year, we need three second grade teachers and three third grade teachers.
