WHOLE ELEMENTARY UNIT OF INQUIRY - WHO WE ARE

As we prepare to make the significant transition to a new campus, the ES team has been exploring the opportunity to approach our inquiries for the remainder of the year in a new and innovative way. For the first time in ABA history, we will be implementing a whole school unit of inquiry under the transdisciplinary theme 'Who We Are'.

Why? Identify the need for change...

- The campus move will generate a lot of emotions, stress and anxiety for students, teachers and the parent community.
- We need time to focus on the move, the new campus and planning new learning spaces together as a community.
- This is an innovative responsive planning approach to a significant event for the ABA community, and provides an opportunity to develop the ES culture of learning.





- Develop a whole school 'Who We Are' unit of inquiry that connects us as one elementary school community of learners.
- Provide flexibility and authentic learning opportunities for our students during the campus move.
- Demonstrate the ability to adapt to shifting and dynamic change and hook into student agency - choice, voice, ownership - the 'heart' of PYP.
- We have in place a flexible POI that shifts and moves with student inquiries and connects to significant events for the ABA learning community.





How? Leads to action...

- Whole school 'Who We Are' unit of inquiry with the same central idea from FC to Grade 5.
- Different key concepts and lines of inquiry for each grade level.
- Language and mathematics learning outcomes will continue to be woven across units of inquiry for each grade level programme of inquiry.



Our Team Coordinators brainstormed and crafted the central idea for our whole school Who We Are unit of inquiry. The central idea is:

IN MOMENTS OF TRANSITION, COMMUNITIES REEVALUATE THEIR IDENTITY, VALUES AND PURPOSE.

During this week's staff meeting, teams spent time crafting enduring understandings connected to key concepts. From here they developed lines of inquiry for their grade level context. Teachers selected subject focus, related concepts and identified learner profiles. This is called BIG picture mapping and is the process that teaching teams work through before starting a unit of inquiry.

This is an incredibly exciting time for the Elementary team and ABA! By taking an innovative responsive planning approach to a significant event in the history of ABA, the hope is that we develop an even more aligned and connected community of learners.

MIDDLE EAST SOUTH ASIA CONFERENCE



At the VBC we often talk about MESAC, but do you know what it stands for?

MESAC stands for Middle East South Asia Conference (MESAC). It's an athletic and academic conference consisting of six top international schools in the Middle East and India.

The schools competing are ABA International School - Oman - American Community School of Abu Dhabi - UAE American Embassy School - India - American School of Doha - Qatar - American School of Dubai - UAE. Dubai American Academy - UAE.

It was formed in 2010 for the purpose of creating a smaller, more intimate medium for athletic and academic competitions. Events are hosted at one of the conference's six schools in India, Oman, Qatar, and the UAE.

Under normal circumstances MESAC events take place as follows:

Season 1 (Aug - Nov) Academic Games - Golf - Swimming - Volleyball

Season 2 (Nov-Feb) Basketball - Cross Country - Fine Arts

- Soccer/Football - Tennis

Season 3 (Feb -April) Badminton - Speech and Debate -Track and Field



The teams are divided into Junior Varsity (Grades 8-10) and Varsity (Grades 11-12) age categories although some teams are combined (Golf, Cross Country, Fine Arts, Speech and Debate, Tennis)



All events except Speech and Debate, Academic Games and Fine arts have separate male and female competitions, though both teams in the Junior Varsity or Varsity category will travel together.

Most of the MESAC coaches are ABA faculty who readily coach, mentor and travel with the student athletes or performers




Even though Covid 19 has canceled many MESAC sports competitions in the past 2 years, others have successfully been switched to virtual events - Events such as Speech and Debate, Fine Arts, Cross Country, Swimming, Track and Field and Academic Games have all been amazing events in this unique way with very few other International Schools Sports Leagues having these opportunities. During these ABA hosted events, many of our own community were involved in official capacities as judges, marshalls and timekeepers.

ABA in this season three ahead will be hosting their own Track and Field meet along with hosting the entire MESAC Speech and Debate event online.

Next year we hope to see a return to normality in travel and sports opportunities with ABA already penciled in to host MESAC Golf, Varsity Football and Track and Field.



Over the next weeks we will share a bit more about the individual events, so stay tuned!
