#### Hello from the Rockwell Equity team!

February is Black History Month. It celebrates the rich cultural heritage, contributions, triumphs and sacrifices of African Americans in our country's history.

Carter G. Woodson, a historian and president of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History started these efforts in 1926 to educate people about Black history and culture. He also had a goal to make this a serious field of study in colleges, universities and schools. February was chosen since it coincided with the birthdays of both Abraham Lincoln who was influential in the emancipation of slaves of Frederick Douglass who was a prominent leader in the abolitionist movement which fought to end slavery.

Each year there is a new theme. The theme for 2022 is **Black Health & Wellness.**



Annual Dr. Seuss Multilingual Virtual Read Aloud Event in the Library!

Every year we celebrate Read Across America week and Dr. Seuss' birthday with a Multilingual read aloud with his books printed in languages other than English. Due to safety concerns, this year's event will be a virtual one, utilizing FlipGrid to create read aloud videos at home. Then these videos will be shared with the entire school to view online.

#### This virtual event will be held the week of March 1st, 2022

Here is how it will work:

- Parents/students express interest in participating and sign up for a book in their home language. Contact me for a list of titles and languages.
- Once you are signed up, we will check out the book in English AND the chosen language (to the student), then deliver to the child in their classroom
- Parents/Students will record themselves on FlipGrid reading the books (tutorial on how to do this will be shared later this month-once we have sign ups and books are distributed)
- FlipGrid videos will be shared with all classes the first week of March, 2022.

Please have a look at the resource list in our Destiny catalog, find a book in your home language, discuss with your family on whether you want to participate. Then email me if you want to sign up. I will add your students name/your name to the list with the book you want to read.

# Lake Washington Tuition Preschool Program now accepting Interest Statements for 2022-23 school year

The tuition-based Lake Washington Preschool Program is now accepting enrollment Interest Statements for the 2022-23 school year. New families interested in securing a seat for their child to enroll at one of the Lake Washington School District (LWSD) Preschool Sites in the 2022-2023 school year, need to complete the Preschool Interest Statement found at https://www.lwsd.org/programs-and-services/preschool.

Currently enrolled/returning preschool students, preschool students on an IEP or students enrolled in our Head Start program do not need to fill out the interest statement.

Interest Statements received before March 2, 2022 will be entered into a lottery for a seat in the LWSD Preschool program. Lottery will be held the week of March 7, 2022 and families will be notified by March 18, 2022. Any students who do not receive a seat via the lottery will be placed on a waitlist for that preschool location/session.

Families on the waitlist at specific preschool locations will be called and offered seats as they become available.

After April 11, 2022 registration/enrollments will be handled at the LWSD Early Learning Center at the Old Redmond Schoolhouse to fill any seats remaining after the lottery.

## Kindergarten Registration

It will soon be time to begin Kindergarten registration for the 2022-23 school year. The initial registration period for children who will be five years old on or before **August 31, 2022** will begin on February 24, 2022. Registration for all K-12 LWSD students is online. All necessary documents can be accessed on the

LWSD website and completed documents can be uploaded securely. Parents who are unable to upload documents may send them by U.S. mail or drop them off at their neighborhood school. Important: While K-12 student registration will continue throughout the school year and summer, parents are highly encouraged to register students as soon as possible. Registering early helps LWSD to ensure that class sizes are balanced and adequate staff are hired in time for the new school year.
