



**\*Math** - Minimum FUHSD Graduation Requirement for Math: Algebra & <u>Geometry</u> (2 **YEARS** of math).

\*\* Selective Electives - Students need to take one class in 2 of these 3 areas for Cupertino High School graduation.

\*\* General Electives Earned when student goes beyond the requirement; i.e., 3 years of math.

# General CHS Graduation Information

- 220 credits needed to graduate
- Each course taken is year-long (2 semesters)
- 10 credits per class (5 per semester)
- Minimum of a "D" grade needed to earn CHS credit
- Any "F" grades for graduation required courses: students
  must work with their Alpha Guidance Counselor for a credit
  recovery plan (FUHSD summer academy, 8th block, etc.)

### **Course limitations**

- Students are limited to 6 classes per year
- Students may earn a total of 70 credits per year (including summer academy, athletic credits, etc.)
- Students may only enroll in one course per core subject/department
- No credits taken prior to the first day of 9th grade will be added to a student's high school transcript

# NO academic/promotion classes in SUMMER



# CHS does <u>NOT</u> recommend taking an outside of FUHSD academic class during the summer:

- Brain break & re-charge mental health Avoid academic BURNOUT
- Volunteer, Employment, Internship, Pre-Collegiate programs
- Family time & have FUN

### Math Selection Recommendation



- Sign up for the next course in the math sequence based on the information provided by the middle school.
- CHS does not advise/recommend summer math advancement for 8th graders.
- Any courses completed <u>prior to the first day of 9th grade</u> in August **will not** be included in the student's CHS transcript.
  - **Geometry** is the <u>only</u> math class (with hardcopy official transcript proof) that a student may request the CHS Registrar to provide a CHS Transcript Notation that the Geometry requirement was completed prior to enrolling at CHS.

### Math Selection Recommendation



### If an outside of FUHSD Math class <u>is</u> taken during the summer:

- Verify on their website that they are **ACCREDITED** CHS does **NOT** recommend any specific place.
- CHS does not advise/recommend summer math advancement for 8th graders.
- MUST report the CONFIRMED institute's name on Informed K12 form Course Request Verification.
- CHS will NOT place a student into an Accelerated/Honors/AP math class with summer math.
  - For example, if Geometry is completed in summer, the student will be moved into Algebra 2, not Algebra 2/Trigonometry, regardless if Algebra 2/Trigonometry is listed on K12 form.
- NO math credit will be given on the CHS transcript summer course is for Enrichment only.
  - CHS requires an official transcript sent directly to the CHS Registrar, Cheryl Hassett, by August 1st to confirm that the summer course has been completed, not to award credits.

### Math Selection Recommendation



We will move the student onto the next math class, based on what is reported, but please the following in mind:

- If the student fails to complete the summer math class or does not feel prepared,
   we cannot guarantee a space in a lower level math class
- The schedule is built based on what is reported on course verification
- Take this into consideration, as we highly recommend remaining in sequence in the year-long course

### AVID - Advancement Via Individual Determination

AVID is a <u>four-year college prep program</u> for students who possess the motivation and the raw ability to succeed in high school and college, but appear to <u>lack the consistent study habits and academic skills</u> they need to make the most of their abilities.

The <u>goal</u> of the program is to provide a targeted group of these already-capable students with the guidance and support they need to succeed at Cupertino High School.

AVID is a "class community" composed of peers, teachers and tutors geared towards encouraging academic and personal success.
