

Post Secondary Options (PSEO)

Post Secondary Education Options (PSEO)

- The Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) program allows:
 - Sophomores in high school to take Career/technical options only with a limit of "ONE" class
 - Juniors and seniors in high school to take full or part-time course load, at a liberal arts, community, or technical public college or a university for high school credit
- The Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) benefits include:
 - PSEO provides students with an additional variety of class offerings and the opportunity to pursue additional challenging coursework.
 - Tuition, fees, and required textbooks are at no cost to students.

What does a PSEO student look like?



Mature

- Can they handle the responsibility of being on a college campus?
- Independent
 - Can they make their own decisions with regards to scheduling?
- Self starter
 - Will they take the lead to meet with their advisor on their own each semester?
 - Have they planned out their courses with their advisor for their major after high school?

PSEO Admission Criteria

- To qualify for PSEO:
 - Juniors need to be in the top 33% of their class
 - Seniors need to be in the top 50% of their class.
- Each College and University may have additional admission criteria, it is the student's responsibility to research it.

Things to consider

- Ongoing communication with high school counselor
 - PSEO is purposeful; as a student have you taken the time to learn about the process?
 - Level of support from school counselor
 - Process regarding PSEO:
 - ▶ PSEO forms are due by March 1, to the guidance office.
 - Ensure a better tracking system.
 - ▶ By May 30, (state law) student has to inform school if they are attending. Schools can deny a student request after May 30, 2022
- High school vs college experience
- Winter/Spring break
- Frequency of classes
- Part time vs Full time
- Transportation
- Adjustments to high school schedule (e.g., pep fests, coronation, Homecoming, SnoWeek, flexible learning time)-

Things to consider continued...

- Transferring credits to another college is dependent upon the transfer rules of that college - check with colleges.
- PSEO grades will be posted on your high school transcript and on your permanent college transcript.
 - Final Grades: If a student receives a "C" in a 4-credit college class they receive a "C" for the same course at Rockford High School.
- PSEO grades are not weighted unless they are equivalent to a college level course that we offer

CIS opportunities currently offered at Rockford High School:

- ► CIS Classes are now coseated with IB courses
- St. Cloud State
 - ▶ Juniors have to be in the top 33% of your class to receive college credit.
 - ▶ Seniors have to be in the top 50% of your class to receive college credit.

International Baccalaureate

- Students have several opportunities for college credit through the International Baccalaureate program by sitting for an IB exam.
- If a course is not attached to CIS, students will be required to sit for the IB exam. Tests will be purchased by Rockford High School. Sharing scores with colleges is optional.

What are the benefits?

- Concurrent Enrollment classes are university level classes offered at the high school to junior and senior students during their regular school day. (High school students reduce duplication of classes and save time and money by earning both high school and university credits at the same time.)
- Students who successfully complete these courses generate both high school and transcripted college credit from the partnering postsecondary institution.
- In the CIS courses there is not a end of the year test to earn credit.
- CIS courses are guaranteed to earn credit at our MNSCU colleges and universities.
- Opportunity to access your teacher on a daily basis.
- The ability to earn college credit and save money before entering college.

How do I find out how credits transfer?

- In the state of Minnesota:
 - Transferology https://www.transferology.com/
 - Create an account
 - Search for courses and match at each college and university
 - Download a transfer guide
 - Meet with an advisor at the college or university you plan to attend
 - Outside the state of Minnesota:
 - Student's responsibility to contact the admissions office of each college/university you are interested in attending.
 - Students will need to contact each University for transcripts after grades are posted - not RHS.
