ENGLISH

This term in English, the pupils will be exploring the exciting text Mama Miti - A story which follows the life of a lady who is in love with stories of her past and helping the people of her town.

The pupils will be developing their English skills through a number

of ways including letter writing as well as exploring instructional texts by creating pages for a class recipe book.



MATHS

This term, the pupils will continue to consolidate their knowledge of multiplication and division.

We will start with looking at the 8 times table and how we can use this knowledge to solve multiplication division problems.

We will then move on to look at multiplying and dividing a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number and explore the concept of scaling.

WIDER CURRICULUM FOCUS

This term's learning journey is focussed around the country of Kenya and climate change. Using key texts to support their learning, the pupils will explore the human and physical geography of Kenya, learn about the climate and discover some of Kenya's economic activity.

The pupils will also explore the positive and negative impact humans have on the environment.

In art this term we will be exploring the artist George Shaw and the theme of trees.

We will continue our computing and music curriculum which the pupils are really enjoying. Our song is Three Little Birds.

SCIENCE

This term in science the pupils will be learning about plants. They will learn about the different parts of plants and their functions, understand what plants need to survive and the life cycles of different plants. They will also carry out a series of exciting practical investigations.

EVOLUTION OF ME

Our PSHEe topic for this term is 'Money and Work'. Within this unit, pupils will explore different jobs and skills. They will discuss and challenge some of the common myths and gender stereotypes related to work through exploring examples of role models in different fields of work e.g. women in STEM.

Pupils will also learn to set personal goals and explore how to recognise their interests, skills and achievements and consider how these might link to future jobs
