Value for the Tuition

Sayre School appreciates the financial commitment families make when choosing an independent school education. Sayre is dedicated to providing value for the tuition through the quality of its academic programs, faculty, facilities, arts and athletics, College Counseling services, counseling and character education, and inclusive school community.

Bundled Tuition

Sayre School tuition includes many essential services and program elements. The bundled tuition structure provides two important family-friendly benefits: simplified billing and easier budgeting, especially for families who choose a monthly payment plan. Services included in tuition are listed below.

Lower School: Academic Services, daily lunch, textbooks, technology resources, and field trips

Middle School: 1:1 iPad Program, class trips (including seventh grade to Chicago and eighth grade to Washington D.C.), daily lunch, textbooks, creative and performing arts, and athletic participation and related transportation

Upper School: Textbooks, student activity fee, College Counseling, PLAN and PSAT testing, online SAT and ACT test prep, daily lunch, creative and performing arts, and athletic participation and related transportation

Tuition Payment Plans

Plan A: Pay in full with contract

Plan B: Pay deposit, and balance to be paid in two monthly installments, due July 2022 and November 2022

Plan C: Pay deposit, and balance to be paid in ten monthly installments by automatic bank draft with no service charge (The first payment will be drawn in July 2022 and the last payment in April 2023)

Plan D: Pay deposit, and balance to be paid in ten monthly installments by check to Sayre or online through Blackbaud. Service charge of 2% of tuition less deposit. (The first payment will be due July 2022; the last payment due April 2023)

Fees and Services Separate From Tuition

Business Office Information

The school offers an optional Tuition Refund Plan that is billed separately at 1.9% of tuition. Given the annual tuition investment parents make, we strongly recommend that all parents take advantage of this protection.

As specified on the Enrollment Contract, enrollment may be canceled without penalty (except forfeiture of the reservation deposit) provided that cancellation notification is sent in writing to the Director of Admission on or before May 31, 2022. If a student is withdrawn after May 31, the responsible parent or guardian will be obligated to pay the full annual tuition charges.

Blackbaud Tuition Management (formerly Smart Tuition) charges a late fee of \$40 for accounts over 30 days and a ACH failed fee of \$30. If the balance is not paid within 60 days there will be an additional late charge by Sayre of 1.25% per month.

Food Service

Lunch is included in tuition for all grades. The school's dining facility, The Thomas A. Grunwald Buttery, provides a wide variety of options that follow the school's Allergy Policy and Guidelines (available in the online Handbook). The Buttery uses fresh local meats and produce as much as possible, and the daily menu includes a featured entrée, pasta, sandwiches, vegetarian and vegan options, homemade soups, and a salad bar.

The Buttery offers breakfast items, drinks, and other snacks for purchase by Upper School students each morning. The Buttery accepts credit and debit cards including touchless pay options as well as cash.

Extended Day Program

Parents may choose from the following options for Preschool-Grade 4:

- Extended Day services are billed monthly from September 1 through May 1.
- Students may attend Extended Day on an hourly drop-in basis at \$12.00 per hour. Prior notification must be given to the Extended Day Director and the child's classroom teacher. A student information sheet, Extended Day enrollment form, and current immunizations must be submitted prior to attending Extended Day as required by state licensing regulations.
- Any changes in Extended Day enrollment must be discussed with the Extended Day Director. A \$25.00 fee will be charged after the second enrollment change.
- When the Lower School is closed due to conferences, Extended Day will be open from 7:30 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. All students who attend will be charged \$50.00 for this service.
- Charges are assessed for late pick-ups. The late charge is \$1.00 per minute after 5:45 p.m.
