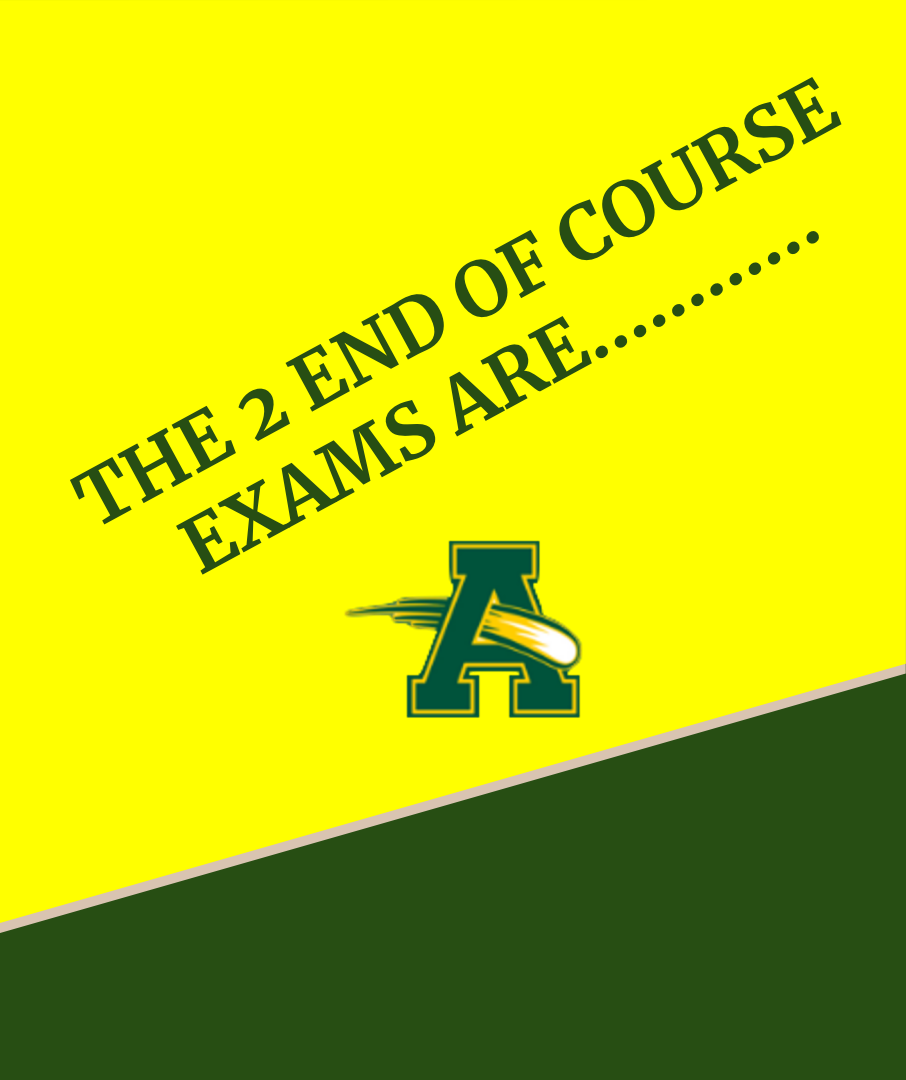

COLLEGE PREP

- STUDENTS WILL REMAIN AT THE HIGH SCHOOL FOR ALL 4 YEARS.
- STUDENTS WILL TAKE A COURSE LOAD OF CLASSES THAT WILL PREPARE THEM FOR THE COLLEGE RIGOR.



COLLEGE TECH PREP

- STUDENTS MAY BE ENROLLED IN A TECH PROGRAM AT THE HIGH SCHOOL OR JVS.
- STUDENTS WILL TAKE A COURSE LOAD OF CLASSES THAT WILL PREPARE THEM FOR THE COLLEGE RIGOR - IN THEIR TECH FIELD OF STUDY.



JVS

- STUDENTS WILL ATTEND THE JVS FULL-TIME 11TH AND 12TH GRADE YEARS.
- STUDENTS WILL DIVIDE THEIR TIME BETWEEN THEIR PROGRAM AT THE JVS AND CORE COURSES OFFERED AT THE JVS.

Special Education Services and Intervention
