













Dear Friends and Neighbors,



# **National Night Out**

Ational Night Out is back this summer and the Vernon Police Department, Rockville Community Alliance, Vernon Community Network, and other organizations have big plans.

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign intended to promote police-community partnerships and foster a sense of community and make neighborhoods safer, better places to live.

This year's **National Night Out is Tuesday, August 3rd, 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.**, in the Ladd & Hall parking lot in downtown Rockville.

"National Night Out is a great opportunity for our police officers to meet our residents in a fun, informal atmosphere," Vernon Mayor Dan Champagne said. "These partnerships make our community strong."

National Night Out also gives residents an opportunity to learn about services that are available to them from local government and social service organizations. Vendor booths are open during the event to share information and offer goods and services to event participants. "The Rockville Community Alliance is proud to be a partner in this great event, bringing residents together to build community and a strong connection to our Police Department," said Tom Didio, Alliance Member.

"The Vernon Police Department has been doing National Night Out since I arrived in Vernon and it's something I really enjoy," said Police Chief James Kenny. "I get to meet people I would not ordinarily have the opportunity to talk to. I've formed a lot of partnerships and friendships. It's an event our department looks forward to every year."

For this year's National Night Out there will be free food, and free activities for children, including The Big Bounce and Big Jim's Fabulous Famous Foam Machine. Free school supplies will also be available. Vernon firefighters and police will also bring trucks and other equipment to display for a "touch a truck" event. Miss Greater Rockville and her Court will also attend. Come join the fun! ernon's premier summer event, July in the Sky, is back Wednesday, June 30th with a massive 75th Anniversary fireworks display. (The rain date is July 7th.)

The fireworks show will feature more than 1,500 shells and will begin at approximately 9:30 p.m. The display will be fired from Fox Hill Tower in Henry Park and will be visible from the park and downtown Rockville.

Music, food vendors and family-friendly activities will take place in Henry Park and in downtown Rockville to entertain people before the fireworks show begins. COVID Vaccination will be available in both locations.

The events at Henry Park are organized by the Vernon Parks and Recreation Department and the downtown Rockville activities are organized by the Rockville Community Alliance.

"The pandemic forced us to cancel July in the Sky last year, but we're coming back strong," Vernon Mayor Dan Champagne said. "July in the Sky is a great event that people from all over look forward to. And there's no better way to kick off the celebration of our nation's 245th birthday. I encourage you to join our celebration."

Henry Park will close at 4 p.m. so that food vendors and others can move in and set up. The park reopens at 6 p.m. for people to seek out their fireworks viewing spots and to enjoy music and other events. No street parking in the area of the park is permitted.

In downtown Rockville, East Main Street from Elm to Court streets, Park Place, St. Bernard's Terrace and portions of Park and Elm streets will close at 6 p.m. so that vendors can set up, and so that people can safely view the fireworks from Central Park.

People should bring blankets and chairs to stake out their seating spots for the fireworks.

No pets, alcohol, bicycles, skateboards, fireworks or sparklers are permitted in the Henry Park. The same goes for downtown Rockville, except for prefireworks "Push, Pull and Pedal Patriotic Parade".



#### **Vernon Police Chief Retires**

#### **VERNON POLICE**

olice Chief James Kenny is retiring after 15 years of service to the Town of Vernon. Chief Kennv joined the Vernon Police Department on Mav 22, 2006 and served as Captain until then-Chief Rudolph Rossmy retired. Captain Kennv was promoted to Chief on January 5, 2007.

Chief Kenny grew up in Rocky Hill and graduated from Rocky Hill High School in 1978. He enlisted in the United States Army and entered service in August 1978. Chief Kenny was trained as a military police officer and served at bases in the United States and Germany. He



was honorably discharged in August 1981.

After the Army, Chief Kenny enrolled in Bryant University in Smithfield, Rhode Island, and graduated Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice. While attending Bryant, he worked as a part time constable for the Town of Old Lyme Police Department.

Chief Kenny was hired by the Glastonbury Police Department on July 14, 1985 and was promoted to sergeant on November 25, 1996. In September 1999 Chief Kenny was selected to be one of the original members of the Capital Region Emergency Services Team (CREST). CREST is an emergency services team that is made up of officers from numerous departments in the capitol region.

In April 2000, Chief Kenny was promoted to lieutenant and served as a supervisor in both the patrol and detective divisions in Glastonbury. Chief Kenny also rose through the ranks of CREST to eventually become the team leader. He also served as a Police Officer Standards and Training Council certified instructor, teaching officers in Glastonbury and elsewhere various law enforcement topics.

Chief Kenny retired from Glastonbury Police Department on May 19, 2006 and three days later became the captain of the Vernon Police Department. experience at the state level. In January 2008 he was selected to sit on the Governor's Sentencing and Parole Review Task Force. In May 2008 he was selected to be a member of the Criminal Justice Policy Advisory Commission (CJPAC), a position he held until his retirement.

At the local and regional level, Chief Kenny played an important role as one of the creators of the Blue Plan, a police emergency response guide to serious incidents. After several critical incidents in Connecticut, police leaders determined that a measured, predictable mutual aid plan was needed. Chief Kenny

helped research, coordinate and author the plan that details police response to mutual aid requests in north central Connecticut. He also led the Vernon Police Department through several critical incidents.

In addition, Chief Kenny has played a key role in the Town's response to severe storms from hurricanes to blizzards. He guided the police department through the COVID-19 pandemic. His leadership through many dark days early in the pandemic prepared the department for the many changing protocols and personnel shortages due to infections

During 2020, the nation saw a push for police accountability. Connecticut announced its own police accountability bill in July 2020 and again Chief Kenny rose to the challenge and placed the department in a position to succeed. Chief Kenny has always been an innovator. Vernon had already adopted some provisions of the accountability bill long before they were required. For example, Vernon was one of the first police agencies in Connecticut to issue body cameras to its officers. Our use of force policy and language already incorporated some of the language passed in 2020.

Chief Kenny has always believed in leading from the front and has been a leader and mentor to many people in the Vernon Police Department and beyond.





# FIRE DEPARTMENT Annual Awards Ceremony

n May 17 the Town of Vernon Fire Department held its annual awards ceremony at Rockville High School. The evenings event recognizes and honors the members of the department with various awards and citations for both individual and team efforts of life saving, heroism and valor displayed at various calls for

emergency services throughout the year. Along with these awards, there is an annual recipient for the *Junior Firefighter, Firefighter* and *Officer of the Year* awards. Chosen by his or her peers, these awards recognize members who consistently go above and beyond, who stand out and make a difference in their company and the department.

Junior Firefighter of the Year was presented to Adam Bowman, the fourth generation of his family to serve in the Fire Department, recognized for his hard work both in school and in the fire department and for his eagerness to learn and volunteer.

*Firefighter of the Year* was presented to *Matthew Kenzior*. Although he has only been a member of the department since 2019, in that time has distinguished himself and shown a deep commitment to professionalism, positivity and integrity. He has consistently attended training and responded to calls to gain experience, including responding to 279 calls and spending more than 350 hours volunteering.

*Officer of the Year* was presented to *Captain Jon-Paul Lucas* for his dedication to serving the Fire Department and community. He responded to 190 incidents and volunteered more than 500 hours in 2020. Captain Lucas consistently leads by example both on scene and in the fire station. He mentors and trains the members under him to ensure they are prepared and ready to face the challenges they come across on the emergency scene.

The Town of Vernon Fire Department operates exclusively still with volunteers in each of its 5 fire houses throughout town. Our membership comes from everyday people who want to help others and give back to their community. Our Junior Program is for those 14 to 17 years old with an interest in the fire service and specifically geared towards training and activities that fall within the limits of state safety guidelines. 

## YOUTH SERVICE BUREAU SUMMER Events

The Youth Service Bureau is a Town of Vernon department that provides prevention and intervention programs, coordinates services to youth and refers youth and families to needed services. The YSB has been providing these services for more than 40 years.

The Youth Services office at Rockville High School has led programs this spring, and the YSB will offer summer work, fun and nutrition programs.

#### **Youth Services at RHS**

Rockville High School Peer Advocates, led by YSB Youth Counselor and Prevention Program Coordinator Kim McTighe, were busy this spring organizing awareness activities and planning events.

Peer advocates determined that mental health among their peers had suffered significantly due to social isolation and other issues related to the pandemic. They developed Health Mental awareness а campaign called "Mental Health Healthy Mind, Healthy Matters: Body, Healthy Life" and coordinated a variety of activities, including: A school wide Spirit Week where students and staff were encouraged to dress according to a daily theme, such as Mellow Monday (Wear PI's to be comfy), Twin day (We all need someone to count on) and Fight It Friday (Fight the stigma- dress as a superhero!)

- Daily announcements with mental health statistics and words of positive encouragement
- Setting up a coloring station in the library to provide a calming space for students and staff to "de-stress"
- A Mental Health Matters bulletin board in a prominent area of the school with mindfulness coping skill cards and QR codes for students to use when they were overwhelmed or having a hard

time regulating emotions.

- Coordinating with the Agricultural Science and Technology Education program to provide therapy animals so students could pet them and interact with them
- A "Chalk Walk" leading up to the student parking lot with positive sayings and encouragement.

Feedback to the campaign was overwhelmingly positive. Mental health awareness will be a continued focus for this group during the next school year.

Several Peer Advocates assisted the REAL Talk committee, which is the youth leadership team of the Vernon ROCKS Coalition. The group works to reduce underage drinking and prevent prescription drug misuse. The group is working with the Vernon ROCKS event subcommittee to plan a virtual webinar series about health and wellness focusing on issues such as good decision making and the dangers of substance abuse.

#### **YSB 2021 Summer programs**

• Summer Youth Employment: the YSB partners with Capital Workforce Partners to offer jobs for income eligible youth ages 16 to 21. Youth hired for the summer employment program work for 20 hours/week for six weeks between July and August. - The Summer Fun Program offers fun programs for 15 youths in grades 1-5 and runs for six-weeks from July-August. Our focus this summer is nutrition, exercise, reading and plenty of time for play. There are two 3-week sessions, \$90/session/youth. For more information contact: Michelle Hill at: *jhalpin@vernonct.gov*
- The YSB supports the summer food service program sponsored by Vernon Public Schools, which provides free lunches to any vouth 18 years and younger. This is a federally funded program and lead partners are: State Department of Education, Vernon Parks and Recreation, and Vernon Public Schools.
